Consitution Day



June 5th is the anniversary of the introduction of the first Danish constitution of 1849 (also called the Junigrundloven) and the subsequent constitution.

This day does not receive a lot of tribute. It is usually marked by political meetings around the country. It is the anniversary of the day when we went from a monarchy to a representative people's government.

Something I had not heard of before was constitution desert. It is apparently a traditional Danish desert consisting of rhubarb, which is cooked, with sugar, until tender in the oven. Then, a cake cream with added gelatine and flavoured with vanilla, is poured over the cold rhubarb mix. This dessert was previously a common desert to serve on constitution. It makes sense with its red and white colour that matches Dannebrog's colours.



The 1849 Constitution introduced rights of freedom such as religious-, press-, unification- and assembly freedom. Also constitutional law and the inviolability of housing and property.

... and Father's day

On June 5th, Father's Day, as well as Constitution day takes place. NybroTidende focuses on how this day really started.

Father's Day originally started in the United States in 1910. At that time, a woman called Sonora Smart Dodd lived. Her father had lost his wife and was therefore alone with six children. He worked a lot to care for all the children and tried to do as well as he could. That is why Mrs Dodd believed that fathers should also be celebrated on a special day, as it was for the mothers on Mother's Day. Mother's Day had originated a few years earlier, also in the United States where an active mothers group tried to fight diseases that broke out among the soldiers during the American Civil War.

But let's get back to Father's Day. On the initiative of Mrs Dodd, the first Father's Day was held on June 19th 1910 in Spokane, Washington State. However, this date is not the one on which Father's Day is celebrated in the United States, as it was set as the third Sunday in June. That is, this year is the

17th of June, where the day is celebrated in the United States and many other countries around the world.

However, some years passed before Father's Day came to Denmark. In 1931 Father's Day came to Sweden as the first Nordic country to adopt the day, while it was adopted by Denmark in 1935. The Swedes used the American tradition and set Father's Day as the third Sunday in June, while Denmark, from the beginning, had it take place on the fixed date of June 5th, which is also Denmark's Constitution Day and really the closest thing to a Danish national day. However, our Nordic neighbours Sweden, Norway, Finland, Iceland as well as Estonia elected to host Father's Day in the fall. So in these countries it's a tradition to celebrate Father's Day the second Sunday in November. But Denmark decided to continue with June 5th, alone.

In some select countries Father's Day falls on the same dates as holidays. This is the case, for example, in Germany, where

Christ's Ascension Day is also Father's Day. This date is 40 days after Easter and therefore varies from year to year. In Switzerland and Austria, Father's Day is on the 1st and 2nd Sunday in June, while France is one of the countries that adopted the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Thus, the date varies greatly depending on which country you reside in.

However, there is agreement that Father's Day, in Denmark, is a little in the shadow of Mother's Day. On Mother's Day, one celebrated the role of the mother, while the role of the father did not need the same kind of attention as he might be doing too well to be celebrated.

All in all, it's up to the individual to celebrate Father's Day. But otherwise it's important to celebrate both of your parents on a regular basis - although it may not have to be on a particular day.

Enjoy Father's- (and Constitution) Day! :)


Using the gardens:

It is the first summer month and it is extremely good weather here in Denmark at the moment. The perfect weather for eating ice cream!

And there are plenty of ice cream joints nearby. There is, of course, ice cream to buy in both Nybro kiosk and Netto, but if you are looking for something more lavish, you do not need to look for long. No more than 500 meters away is Nybro Båd- & Kanoudelejlning. There you can buy old-fashioned ice cream in cones with whipped cream and jam. It is located in beautiful nature where you can sit in the sun on a bench and have a race with the sun about who can consume the ice cream faster. It goes with-

out saying that you can go for a canoe or kayak trip on the lake afterwards. It is open from 10am to 7pm every day of the week, but it should be noted that it may change when it is public holidays.



If you go a little further up Nybrovej, past Sophienholm, you will find another

canoe and kayak rental at the bridge across Mølleå. It is a beautiful bike ride surrounded by nature. Here you can also buy ice cream in different colours, or take a canoe trip up or down the idyllic stream. They are open weekdays from 10am to 7pm, and from 9:30am to 7pm on weekends. Here too the opening hours may deviate on holidays. If you are close to Lyngby Mall, you can also find ice cream joints selling ice cream in waffle cones. You can find a Paradis joint inside the centre as well as on Lyngby Hovedgade. Here you can also get a waffle with all the good toppings. Paradis does not always serve the conventional flavours of ice, but often has other exciting versions such as Oreo, salty caramel or passion fruit sorbet.

A) Presentation of the dormitory's operating budget for the next financial year- v. The board

The dormitory's operating budget for the following financial year (from 1 August 2018 to 31 July 2019) will be presented at the meeting.

Economy

There is about 134,000 on our union account and the availability amount for this year was estimated to be 72.235 kr. when all clubs have received their disposable income.

Other

Review of last board meeting or agenda before the next.

A new data protection law has been introduced, which will enter into force on May 25th 2018, however, this will mostly affect KAB, the Net-Group and the Secretariat.

In addition, the dormitory has purchased a new heart defibrillator for approx. 10-12,000 kr. Which will soon be set up.

The municipality is still behind with the payment of the kindergarten, however, the amount and the purchase have been agreed. And the 800,000 kr. will hopefully be transferred as quickly as possible (our lawyers are doing everything they can and are trying to hasten the municipality ;)The new administrative system in KAB is finally up and running and the rental loss incurred in this connection is covered by KAB.

Internal correspondence

A: Restricting the resident list on Nybro.dk to residents (V) - v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen

The resident list on the website has so far been publicly available on nybro.dk (however, email addresses can only be seen

if you connect to nybro.dk from the dormitory). It is proposed that the resident list be preserved but restricted to resident login, so that it is only available internally for the residents of the community. One can basically argue that it does not concern others who is living in which room at the dormitory, but at the same time it is very useful for the kitchens to keep in touch with relocated residents etc. Since KAB changed their system at the beginning of the year, the resident list has not been updated - but the Net-Group is cooperating with KAB to automate this. In addition, it may be mentioned that from May 25 2018, a new EU Personal Data Regulation will enter into effect, which affects addresses, email addresses, etc. How this affects the dormitory is not yet known (we have one of KAB's lawyers on the case) but it may be that we, due to this new regulation, will be forced to remove the resident list from the public website, regardless of the outcome of the vote on this proposal.

Discussion took place on moving the resident list, so that it is only visible to internal

residents. If you do not want to be listed, you will be set as anonymous. 9 voted for this proposal, while 1 abstained. The suggestion is approved and the Net-Group will be given the task.

B: Change in the rules for disposable income for clubs under NYK (V) - v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen

All of the dormitory clubs under the dormitory association NYK (such as Kanolaugst, the Exercise Club, Garden Association, etc.) have so far had an annual disposable amount for the purchase of equipment, etc. The disposable income of most of the clubs was granted a number of years ago and has since been automatically renewed every year. This procedure has some disadvantages; On the one hand, the residents' council allocates money every year to cover the disposable incomes of clubs with no activity, and in this way the residents' council has a very vague sense of how the different clubs are doing, and the size of the various clubs' disposable income does not change despite any changes in activity and membership of each club. It is therefore proposed to change the rules for the disposable income of clubs so that they are not automatically renewed in the future. Instead, the president of the clubs must, annually, request a disposable income granted by the residents' council - this disposable income should cover the financial year of NYK (and the rest of the dormitory) which is from August 1 to July 31, and the disposable income does not fall outside the three-month limitation period for individual projects adopted at the last meeting. In this way, the residents' council sees the presidents of the various clubs at least once a year (if they want disposable income) and may on this occasion get a status on activity, etc. in the individual clubs. At the same time, it is ensured that the residents' council does not allocate money to clubs that have no

activity and that the residents' council can adjust the amount of disposable income in proportion to the club needs, activity and membership of individual clubs.

The purpose of this proposal is, therefore, not to take money away from the clubs or to annoy the presidents, but rather to give the residents' council a better opportunity to direct funds to where they can benefit the most (not granting disposable income annually that never gets used). It is proposed that the rules come into force at the beginning of the new financial year, August 1 2018.

On this date, all clubs' previous disposables incomes are cancelled (purchases made before this date can of course be refunded). In order to have access to disposable income after this date, it is required that the respective club president request and is granted a disposable income according to the new rules (e.g. at the next meeting in early June or at the first meeting in the autumn of start-September). The club presidents will of course be informed about this now so that they are aware of the change and have the opportunity to apply for according to the new rules.

Moving the year-period to follow the calendar year instead of August to July was discussed. As well as the need for a receipt for any new purchases, maintenance, etc for the clubs, as proof that the money is actually used as intended.

There will be a meeting again in February with all the club presidents where they can apply for the new year's disposable income for the clubs.

Votes for the above changes: 10. The point is hereby approved and will come into effect February 2019.

C: Organization of bike clean-up in the fall 2018 (V) - v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen

It is desired that, like previous years, a bicycle clean-up is organized and carried out at the dormitory- such that abandoned and ownerless bicycles in the bicycle racks and shed is removed, giving more space for the remaining bicycles. It will be appropriate to carry out this clean-up at the end of September or at the beginning of October, and as it has to be notified three months prior it would have to be begun now before the summer vacation.

It is therefore proposed to offer the job of arranging and executing the bicycle clean-up as a paid project for one or two residents, with a payroll of 20 hours for planning, warning and executing the bicycle clean-up (this includes mailbox distribution of strips and warning letters, production, suspension and removal of posters, communication with residents and the police and the completion of the clean-up itself). In 2017 the total time spend was 16.75 hours. Due to the long time horizon the working hours are spread over, it is desired that the granted salary for this project be exempt from the usual three-month time limit as decided at the previous council meeting.

The vote is unanimously in favour.

D: Recruitment of one or two residents for the bicycle clean-up 2018 (V) - v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen

One or two residents are needed to arrange and execute the bicycle clean-up at the end of September or the beginning of October 2018. The task consists of, among other, the notification of residents by mail and by the distribution of notice letters and zip-ties, production, posting and removal of posters, communication with the police and residents, as well as the actual execution of the bicycle clean-up.

The project is offered as a job and paid according to the actual hours spent, however, with a maximum total payroll of 20 hours in

total. (This request is waived if item C is not adopted).

Adrian C24, Kasper P16, Josephine B56 has signed up and 8 vote in their favour.

E: Catering at the bicycle clean-up 2018 (V) – v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen

The bicycle clean-up at the end of September or the beginning of October is executed with the help of volunteer residents who meet up and help on the day. As a thank you for the help, the residents' council has previously covered the cost of catering after the work, in the form of pizza and soft drinks to the attendees.

The amount sought is thus dependent on the number of attendees - at the bicycle clean-up in 2017 the cost was 1,115kr. Due to the long time horizon until the event takes place, it is requested that this grant is exempted from the time limit of three months, as decided at the last occupier council meeting. (This item is waived if item C is not adopted).

Votes in favour: 10

F: Signing up as the new president of the cinema club V. Steffen Sean Klausen L-06

Since it appears that the Cinema Club is currently without a president, I wish to sign up as the new chairman of the club.

Steffen wants to become the president of the club; there are also problems with entry to the club; 9 votes in favour, Steffen has become the new president of the Cinema Club and will address the problems associated with access to the room.

G: Canoe and Kayak club is requesting 23,000 kr. v. Ask Hansen

For the purchase of kayaks and repairs. New purchases constitute about 14000 kr. And repairs are 9,000 kr. Repairs include fiberglass reinforcements, as well as seats etc. It has been necessary to replace some of our older kayaks "The Yel-

low and Green"; as they are still in working condition, but lack nets for the seats etc.

We are lucky to have received a good offer on some kayaks at 3200 kr. each.

In addition, some of the canoes lack new locks and wire.

The locks cost 320 kr. each and we lack 6 of each. In addition, we also need a few new paddles.

Student exchange in Germany, part 2

After the orientation week and semester start in Karlsruhe, I think it's time to report the status: How did the semester start go? What is the teaching and student life like in Germany? And how do you get used to the new surroundings?

All of this I try to answer in this part.

Most of the impressions of the city and my surroundings I experienced in March, during week 11 and week 12 when I was here to receive my dorm room and attend the orientation week. Therefore, it was not a completely unknown city when I returned on April 13 to start the semester on April 16th. However, the studies have started now, and I am going to start the actual day to day life.

The teaching and learning at KIT

The semester at Karlsruher Institut für Technologie began on April 16th. In advance, I had studied the structure of the university's schedules and tried to get an overview of the different buildings and meeting rooms in which my education would take place. You may be a bit confused in the beginning, as KIT is as big as DTU, and I remember how my first days at DTU were: You had learn to the layout. Fortunately, almost all my courses are in the same building of the Institut für Straßen- und Eisenbahnwesen, so that was a clear advantage.

However, the lectures at KIT are longer than at DTU. Here they spend an hour and a half followed by 15 minute breaks, and then it is on to another lecture. However, I quickly realized that the teaching here is different from DTU, since it is almost exclusively lectures and not subsequent group exercises + discussing various assignments to be handed over. As for assignments, there are hardly any, at least not within my courses. In other words, there is a higher degree of self-studying required,

and you have a greater responsibility for your own learning.

A counterpart to InsideDTU with lecture material is also available here, but it is not necessarily in all courses that it is used, and not all lecturers upload their slides. The most remarkable experience, however, was that two of my courses did not have lecture slides available online, but they could be purchased from a secretary! On the other hand, I have not had to buy books for my courses, as all is basically described in the lecturers' slides.

Otherwise, study life-purely social- is a lot like the study life at DTU. There are Friday bars, and it is also very possible to get a beer on a day other than Friday. It should also be said that beer prices are generally slightly lower than in Denmark.

Everything is a bit tough at the beginning

Everything not necessarily being a bed of roses when starting on something new in new surroundings in a completely different country, is probably quite well known to most. This was the same for me in the first lecture week as I was annoyed that there were no assignments for the curriculum, so that I could more experience with it. On the other hand, much is being done for new students-also for exchange students who are only here for a semester.

In order to start my new day to day life, I also tried to get an overview of the various activities; partly those organized by ESN Karlsruhe (Erasmus Student Network) and partly the activities and benefits that the

university itself gets together. The possibilities are therefore plenty when it comes to meeting young German people and the other exchange students. In addition, I took the initiative to travel to other cities in the area with other Erasmus students e.g. to the beautiful city of Heidelberg, 50 km from Karlsruhe, and to Strasbourg which is almost on the other side of the German / French border (which is only 20 km from Karlsruhe).

In addition, I started as a bartutor at the dormitory, which is another word for bartender. Therefore, I was able to keep my bartender's job in KælderCaféen at Nybrogård alive here.

You can also try the local cuisine here. Karlsruhe is located in the state of Baden-Württemberg, where local dishes include Flammkuchen (almost like a kind of pizza, just thinner and with creme fraiche filling with onions, bacon and sometimes cheese), Maultaschen (somewhat like dumplings filled with e.g. meat and vegetables such as spinach) and Spätzle (a kind of small gnocchi served with e.g. lentils, other vegetables and meat) - there is also a special variant of cheese sauce called Käsespätzle (this is, however, very heavy!).

All in all, I will only give everyone the advice to get participate in as many activities and events as possible while you are away. Then the part of everyday life goes a little easier. Otherwise, it is also a good idea to talk to other exchange students about their experiences—you quickly find out that you are not alone with your challenges. And you also finds that the activities and studying at (technical) universities can be very different, but then you've learned from that experience.

Bruchetta (2 servings)


- 2 slices of bread
- 1 tomato
- 1 red onion
- 1/4 bell pepper
- 1 tbsp of fresh basil
- 1 clove of garlic
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- Salt, pepper

Procedure:

Finely chop tomato, basil, bell pepper and red onion and mix it in a bowl. Press the garlic clove into the bowl and add salt and pepper.

A thin layer of olive oil is coated onto both sides of the loaves, after which they are cooked on a pan over full heat for approx. 30 seconds on each side.

Finally, the bread is served with the vegetable salsa on top.



Nettle soup(2 servings):

- 400 g nettles
- 150 g goutweed
- 5 potatoes
- 1 white onion
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1 stk. bouillon cube
- 4-5 dL cream
- Salt, pepper, basil

Procedure:

Start boiling potatoes, then rinse the nettles and gout weed. Onions are cut into coarse pieces. Nettles, gout weed, onion and garlic are added to the pot with the potatoes. A bouillon cube is mixed with boiling water in a glass and then poured into the mixture which should boil for 15 minutes, after which the excess water is removed. Then blend the whole mixture with a handheld blender directly in the pot. Salt, pepper and basil are added to taste. Finally, cream is mixed in.



Rhubarb cake:

- 500 g rhubarb
- 100 g butter
- 1 egg
- 200 g sugar
- 1 tbsp vanilla sugar
- 75 g coconut flour
- 50 g almonds
- 175 g wheat flour
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 1.5 dL Whole milk

Procedure:

The rhubarb is washed and finely cut. Butter, sugar and egg are whipped in a bowl. Milk, baking soda, vanilla sugar, coconut flour, chopped almonds and whole milk are added after which the rhubarb is stirred into the mix.

The dough is poured into a greased ovenproof dish or baking pan (about 23x33 cm.) And baked at 175 degrees for approx. 50 min.

Can be served with vanilla ice cream.





App of the month: Summer special



Summer is at the door and bathing is on the calendar! Whether you are bathing in the sea or sunbathing on the beach or elsewhere, it may be a good idea to know the water temperature and UV index in advance. See how this can be done!

1. Badevand

The App Badevand, developed by the website Badevand.dk, provides information on a wide variety of bathing locations in the Copenhagen area and not least in East Jylland. The app can provide information about the temperature of the water, the air temperature and, not least, the quality of the water. The latter is indicated by flags where a green flag indicates good quality, while a red indicates poor water quality. A yellow flag indicates "no alert" and a grey flag means "no data". The app can be downloaded for free to iOS (App Store) and to Android (Google Play).

2. UV-indeks

If you are sunbathing, the App UV-Index, developed by the Kræftens bekæmpelse, TrygFonden, the Danish Health Authority and The Danish Environmental Protection Agency, may be a good idea for you. This gives you information about expected UV indices at home and abroad, and a forecast for the coming days can also be seen. Additionally, the app also provides good sun protection tips, and it is possible to add favourite places and get warnings for that location if the UV index gets high.

The app is also completely free through both the App Store and Google Play.
