Potato holiday

The autumn break is in week 42, and this year it is from October Monday 15th to Sunday 21st. There are many who look forward to the autumn break because they associate the holiday with relaxation. But it has not always been that way. Potato holiday is what the Danish autumn break was called before our grandparents' time.

Compulsory education was introduced by the Education Act in Denmark in 1814. But at the time, it was taken into account that children in rural areas usually had far more to help with than the children who lived in the cities.

Children in the country only went to school every other day, and sometimes they had to stay home for several days, and even weeks at a time to help with the field work.

Potatoes are hard to keep an eye on when they are stored down in the ground and they can quickly become mouldy if they stay there for too long. Therefore, the children usually left school to help out when the need arose. Therefore, there were no specific school hours and educating the children was problematic with so many irregularities. In 1899, a specific week (week 42) was therefore introduced to help children harvest potatoes. Children up to the age of sixteen helped harvest potatoes.



As many potatoes as possible had to be harvested and they had to be as large as possible. They therefore remained in the ground until October, while today, new potatoes are harvested much earlier.

For 25 kr. you can mix your own salad as takeaway.



Nybrogård needs volunteers!

Nybrogård dormitory is currently in need of many volunteers to handle different posts. We will briefly summarize and try to describe the tasks that are involved in the various posts as well as possible.

Club presidents

Two of the large clubs at the dormitory, the Canoe and Kayak Club and the Exercise Club, are currently without presidents. Common to both presidential posts is that it takes place on a voluntary basis and is thus unpaid.

Tasks as president of the Canoe and Kayak club (description by the former president Ask Nansen M47):

It is an unpaid task like most other presidencies at the dormitory. It is up to the future president to decide how the club is going to function and operate.

Future considerations are:

1. Digging down at the slipway. Possibly removing the slipway and implementing a solution at the end of the dock.
2. Removing the ownerless raft, or installing poles for mooring the raft, such

that it causes minimal annoyance, as well as renewing the deck with new plywood.

3. Having an digital sign in system for new members so that the paperwork ceases. Such a system could also be used by other clubs

4. Produce a dormitory logo for the sides of the vessels, which is required for them to be allowed in Farum lake, as well as minimizing the risk of theft.

Work tasks as president of the Exercise Club (description by the former president Niels Matthiesen):

Primary tasks will be cleaning, i.e. vacuuming, emptying trash cans, filling up with paper towels etc. In addition, your tasks consist of buying new equipment when either old equipment is broken or new equipment is needed. It's important that you want to get into what equipment is of high quality and what is not, as both user experience and safety depends on it.

Niels can also be contacted if there are any questions (see more in the minutes of the last meeting).

Furthermore, there is still no president of the **Cake Festival Club, FC Nybro** and

FC Nybro Chicks. These are, by the editors, known to have been on stand-by for a long time.

Oktoberfest!

Most are familiar with Oktoberfest. There are many places in the country where it is advertised. From bars like the Guldhornene and KælderCaféen to restaurants and hotels.

Someone may believe that it was a Danish tradition, but it was originally a town celebration in Munich. It lasts 16 days, and this year it will take place on September 22nd to October 7th. It has become known as one of Europe's largest national festivals. About 7 million visit and participate in the celebrations every year!

Huge beer tents are setup in the old part of the city. Some of these tents can sometimes accommodate up to 5,000 guests!

This tradition is reasonably old. It dates back to 1810, where it was founded by Louis, King of Bavaria. It has since grown and spread to many other countries.

But what exactly do you do at an Oktoberfest? Other than drinking tons of beer and eating pretzels, also known as saltkringler in Denmark. (Apropos pretzels, see page 11 for a simple recipe). There are usually also other good foods (often in the form of meat), parties, colours and parades. In Munich, since the 1920s, there have been a lot of rides, stalls and various stands. There is traditional folk dancing that

you can try and many Oktoberfest games, many of which have something to do with drinking alcohol.

Beer is on the menu when it comes to Oktoberfest, no matter where you celebrate it. Märzen is German for March, and it is a term used for a special beer brewed in the month of March. It is then placed in basements to mature. They are then stored in large barrels throughout the summer. It is not an especially fermented beer and it is made with weiner malt which is why the beer has such a special amber colour. This beer is quite popular when it comes to Oktoberfest in Munich. It is called Spaten Ur-Märzen Oktoberfest (6% vol. Alcohol).

It is a tradition to serve the beer in large glass cups- also called Mass. They are known to contain at least 1 litre.

Dirndl and Lederhosen are two famous traditional garments. You have probably seen slutty versions of both the dress and the pants if you have been in a Fest & Farver.

A dirndl is a dress with an apron, usually with a white sweater. It was traditionally a South German farmer's suit, which was used as workwear, but nowadays you can see many different versions of dirndls. There are many who only use them for celebrations and are beautifully embroidered and available in all colours and sizes. Lederhosen is a pair of leather trousers where you also wear a shirt. These were, in the past, regarded as workwear, but now they are best known as a costume.

Oktoberfest is also a DTU tradition (see which date on the last page). It takes place in S-Huset and this party is celebrated for several days. The premises are transformed into a beer hall with long tables, Tyrolean music and beer in Mass (1 litre glass). See the S-House Facebook page for more information.

The dormitory bar, KælderCaféen, also held Oktoberfest last year. It was celebrated with cheap beer and great moments until late into the night. Oktoberfest has also been used as a theme for some TDCs at the dormitory.

A) A New president of the canoe and kayak club is needed v. Ask Nansen M47

Hello canoe and kayak people, I have chosen to resign as president this September, so we will need someone to replace me.

About the tasks involved:

The job is unpaid, as with most of the precedencies at the dormitory.

It is up to the new president how the club will function and operate.

When I first started, the equipment was very worn down, and there was no online booking system, which took a while to get up and running. The introduction of the online booking system has greatly increased the use of the club's equipment, as you are fairly certain that the canoe you book will be available.

The introductory course is something that I introduced to minimize damage to the canoes and kayaks.

I've written guides on what would need to be checked, purchased and what most often breaks etc.

However, no serious damages have incurred after a former resident Michael (LM-even) and I constructed the dock in the summer of 20013.

This dock is approx. 1 meter lower than the previous one and, without changing the total width of the dock, has an added meter in width of walkable surface.

Future projects could include:

1. Digging down at the slipway. Possibly removing the slipway and implementing a solution at the end of the dock.
2. Removing the ownerless raft, or installing poles for mooring the raft, such that it causes minimal annoyance, as well as renewing the deck with new plywood.
3. Having an digital sign in system for new members so that the paperwork ceases. Such a system could also be used by other clubs
4. Produce a dormitory logo for the sides of the vessels, which is required for them to be allowed in Farum lake, as well as minimizing the risk of theft.

I am suggesting a vote on installing cameras in the parking areas—and perhaps also the open areas, without affecting the residents' privacy (two rounds of voting), as several residents have experienced theft of their belongings (bicycles, car tires, etc.) from the dormitory premises, and since the dormitory's Facebook page showed positive response to the idea. The purpose of this is to prevent theft, vandalism and burglary. I do not want to be a supervisor on the project, as I do not have time for it, but instead I would suggest that a member of the residents' council run with the idea, if such a like-minded member exists :-)

It is understandable that it is not fun to lose your possessions and be robbed in our own parking space and it is understandable that a greater security is required, which we can achieve. Firstly by being a little more aware of what is happening at the dorm and investigating an extra time when we hear something suspicious. Unfortunately, it is not possible for the residents' council to install surveillance as there are a lot of legal require-

ments and rules attached to this, which the Board of Nybrogård is responsible for fulfilling. So firstly, the point has to go through the board, but also KAB, the Municipality and the police for it to be considered as an option at all.

Superstition and mysticism



The month of October, in addition to autumn, rain and wind, as well as shorter days, is also a lot of fun and has plenty of mysterious traditions. Why do you carve pumpkins? What does Halloween mean? And All Saints' Day? Find out now!

Most people know that on October 31st, every year, you can find pumpkins with more or less scary faces and children who beg for sweets. But why do we actually do that?

It does not actually originate from the United States, as you might think, but from Ireland. The ancient peoples, the Celts, held a festival called Samhain more than 2,000 years ago, as at this time of the year there were signs of a transition, where the curtain between this world and the "next" world was lifted. Here, all the spirits of the deceased could move on to their new life into the next world. But if the transition collapsed, then the spirits would not move on, and the dead would wake up again and create havoc among the living.

And where does the US enter the picture? Well, the Irish immigrants brought this tradition to the United States in the early 1800s. However, the name "Halloween" is not American, but originally from England. Once upon a time, the Catholic Church made its first day of November All Saints' day and October 31 for its All Hallows' Eve" - which later became "Halloween". At this time, the dead were remembered, including martyrs and legends. However, there is no apparent correlation between Christianity and Halloween - which the Celts originally meant.

And now for the big item:

Pumpkin!

The tradition with creepy faces on pumpkins also originates from the Celts. Originally the Celts used turnips to make lamps, which also had scary faces on them for the purpose of chasing off the spirits of the dead so that they could not hurt



the living. The turnips, however, became pumpkins later, as English pilgrims took the tradition with them to America. While America did not have turnips, pumpkins were aplenty, resulting in the tradition of carving pumpkins.

But what about "trick or treat"? that has to be American. No, neither is it originally from the United States. This is also an old European custom, derived from the so-called All Souls' Day, originally on November 2nd, which is the day after All Saints' Day. On this day, poor beggars visited the wealthier people to pray for the dead in the households. As "payment" they were given a soul cake, which was a kind of biscuit. This practice was later developed to asking for food and money, and the tradition of the current form of trick and treating actually started when Irish and Scottish communities in the United States revived the tradition in the early 20th century. However, during World War II's shortage of sugar, the tradition had to be put on hold.

Halloween in Denmark, is a relatively "young" tradition and is not really something you associate with Denmark, other than that we have taken the American tradition to us. The Danish word for Halloween is Allehelgensaften, which was also set as October 31st. After that is the holiday All Saints Sunday, which was set as the first Sunday after All Saints' Eve (November 1st), where the faith is celebrated and the dead remembered. In some churches the names of the children of the parish who died dur-

ing the year were read out loud. However, with the 1770 holiday reform, All Saints' Eve was abolished as a holiday.

Superstition in Denmark

In Denmark, however, there have been other forms of superstition during October. In the old days, when the harvest was over, the farmer and the family used to wonder if there was enough food for the family and the animals for the winter. they would therefor take note of signs for the coming time:

- *If the trees do will not let go of its leaves, then winter will be hard, be cautious.*
 - *If the hare is wearing its summer coat in October, then winter will start gently.*
 - *Fog in October warns of a lot of winter snow*
 - *A mild October warns of a Strong but late winter in March (Source: <http://kalendarium.tripod.com/kalsokt.htm>)*
- Thus, the signs of nature were used to determine the outcome of winter and how to manage the supplies.

October was also called "sædemåned" (month of winter crops). This is due to the fact that the winter crops, which primarily consisted of rye, should be sown in October. The name "October" also means "the eighth month", as March was originally considered the first month of the year.


Turnip lamps in Denmark

If you want to be a bit "retro" in October, you can try to make a turnip lamp, just like the Celts initially did, as we used to have lamps made of turnips, and not pumpkins, that brightened up the autumn darkness. However, turnips are not as popular anymore, as the pumpkins have gained this role due to commercial marketing. We therefore find that the old traditions in this country have slowly been erased when it comes to Halloween as we know it.

NybroTidende October Food Column:
Easy dishes for any taste!

It is October, one of the best months of the year and that should be celebrated with some tasty autumn dishes with root vegetables, and one of the best ingredients the season has to offer: apples.

Cheese-filled pretzels: 8 servings

Ingredients:

- 390 g. Pizza dough (best to buy it from store)
- 200 g. Mozzarella cheese in strips
- 3 tablespoons of melted butter
- 3 cloves of garlic, finely chopped
- 2 tbsp. fresh parsley, finely chopped (can be omitted or use dried parsley)
- 100 g. Parmesan cheese, grated

Procedure:

Preheat the oven to 200 °C. Roll and stretch the pizza dough into a rectangle. Cut this rectangle into 8 equal strips. Stretch the dough strips a bit so that it becomes wider and longer. Place mozzarella cheese all the way down the middle of each. Fold and pinch the dough along the entire strip, such that the cheese is covered, and make sure to close the ends.

Twist the dough as in the above guide and transfer the pretzels to a baking sheet with baking paper. Mix the melted butter with the garlic and parsley and pour it on the pastries. Sprinkle the pretzels with parmesan cheese evenly and bake in the oven for 20 minutes. Or until they are golden.



Ground beef patties with baked, crispy, potato wedges (4 servings):

Ingredients:

- 1 kg. peel potatoes (boilable)
- 1 tbsp. olive oil
- 1 tsp. Rosemary
- 1/2 tsp. coarse salt
- 500 g. Minced beef
- 1/2 tsp. coarse salt
- Pepper from grinder
- 15 g. Butter (1 tbsp) or 1 tbsp. Oil

Procedure:

Scrub the potatoes clean. Cut them into wedges and turn them in oil and rosemary. Bake the potatoes at 225 °C until they are tender, approx. 40 min. Stab them with a fork or knife's edge and judge the consistency. Sprinkle with salt.

Knead the meat until it can hold itself together. Divide it into 4 parts. Form them into patties, approx. 2-3 cm. thick. Mark the entire surface with a knife. Heat butter or oil in a pan until golden with high heat. Brown the patties for approx. 1 min. on each side. Season with salt and pepper. Finished the patties at medium heat for approx. 4 min on each side until they are cooked through.

Delicious crumble (4-6 servings):

Ingredients:

- 1 kg. apples (about 7 apples)
- 85 g. Sugar (1 dl.)
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 30 g. Raisins (1/2 dl.)
- 125 g. Butter
- 150 g. Wheat flour (2 1/2 dl)
- 85 g. Sugar (1 dl.)

Procedure:

Peel the apples. Cut them in quarters and remove the flower, stem and core. Cut the apples into thin slices and put them in a greased ovenproof dish. Mix sugar, cinnamon and raisins and sprinkle it on the apples. Crumble cold butter into flour and mix in sugar. Sprinkle the dough over the apples. Bake the cake in the middle of the oven at 200 °C for 30-40 minutes. Serve warm. Possibly with whipped cream, creme fraiche or vanilla ice cream.



Tip! Alternatively you can forgo the raisins and cinnamon and use 1/2 vanilla bean instead. It can also be made with 1 kg. of Rhu-barb, then you only have to add 2 dl. sugar to the dough and replace the cinnamon (and raisins) with 1/2 vanilla bean.




They usually arrange food clubs, and at the end of September in one of JK-odd's kitchens, efforts were made to bring it back after a long summer break.





Tomb Raider – The Hype continues

On 14/9-18, the 18th and most recent Tomb Raider game was released, and NybroTidende had to try it out, of course!



Shadow of the Tomb Raider is the third and last game in the trilogy, which began in 2013, about the protagonist Lara Croft's early life and challenges before she evolves into the *Tomb Raider* we know from the older games and movies.


People may have different opinions on the **storyline**; Without revealing too much, the game starts off really promising with an exciting place in Mexico. But after the first sequences, Lara encounters many tasks that have already been encountered through the two previous games. So you never encounter anything completely unpredictable, and it makes the game a bit boring after a while. A slightly different game experience, however, takes place in a few sequences, where you take the role of Lara as a child going on adventures in the *Croft Manor* - Lara's Childhood Home.



You can not complain about the **quality** of the game itself. The effects work and, at least for the PS4, the graphics are pretty nice. However, the *realistic* setting is in direct contrast to the unrealistic means; such as Lara's ability to hold her breath under the water for an almost supernatural period of time as well as her ability to survive an air crash, extreme hurricanes and supernatural forces trying to get rid of her. You may miss some naivety and innocence in terms of the graphical effects found in the older games so that you do not have to take the unrealistic events too seriously.

All in all

Despite the fact that the game could easily be improved, **Shadow of the Tomb Raider** is a game you almost have to own, whether you want the end of the trilogy or can not stop exploring in a *third-person shooter* action- adventure with a female protagonist, who is practically immortal.
