

NaNoWriMo

National Novel Writing Month AKA NaNoWriMo. This is an event that takes place throughout November where several hundred thousand people across the globe try to write 50,000 words in 30 days.

This event has grown rapidly since it started in July 1999, almost 20 years ago! At that time they started out with 21 participants, while last year they had about 400,000 participants.


There are some simple rules. You may start writing from 00.00 November 1st and end at 00.00 November 30th. You may not start writing before the specified time and date, but you may want to outline and have lots of notes to make the writing easier. You may write in any genre you want and in any language you want.

It's traditionally the intend that you try to write a novel (since the minimum

length of a novel is 50,000 words), but you can easily adapt the rules. The idea of this whole concept is to make people write, so if you would rather write a lot of short stories, poetry, manuscripts, fanfiction or personal diary, then you can easily do that.

You can see more on their own website: nanowrimo.org and their twitter where they hold motivational talks, ideas for content as well as contests. There are also plenty of opportunities to find someone to talk to online, since writing can often be a lonely activity.

Some of the more famous books that have been written as a NaNoWriMo project are: *Water for Elephants* by Sara Gruen, *Anna and the French Kiss* by Stephanie Perkins, *Cinder* by Marissa Meyer, *The Night Circus* by Erin Morgenstern and *Fangirl* by Rainbow Rowel.



In April and July there is also Camp NaNoWriMo, which takes place in the same way, but the difference is that you may write as many words as you want. Whether your goal is to write 100 or 100,000 words is up to yourself.

November traditions

What does J-Day mean? A day that is celebrated on the first Friday in November every year? Why do you grow a moustache during this month? And who was this Morten, who had an evening named after him? This article gives the answers to all of these questions (or at least mostly) that you might wonder about here in November.

We are now in the middle of autumn, and that may in some cases be depressing enough in and of itself. But November is fortunately also a month with a lot of fun and crazy traditions.

J-day: The story of a beer

You probably won't be able to relate November with J-day, which always falls on the first Friday of November. This year, it is November 2nd, and forms the framework for the advent of Christmas. But why do you really celebrate J-day, and for the 28th time?

The story of J-day started in 1990. This day was marketed by Tuborg as the first day of the year where Tuborg Julebryg was to be sold in cafes, pubs, etc. The Christmas brew was originally brewed for the first time nine years before, in 1981. The beer soon became a slogan for Tuborg to mark that Christmas was nearby and their well-known advertisement was revealed in 1984 and has been running every year since.

However, the very first snow did not fall on a Friday in 1990, but on the first Wednesday of November, and so on November 7, 1990, J-day saw the light of day for the first time. The day was called J-day, and J simply stands for Jul (Christmas).

However, the day became so popular that in 1999, the decision to move J-day to the first Friday of November was made, mostly because many young people did not attend classes the following day. The time was also moved three hours back, from 23.59 to 20.59. 23.59 was the original time, as the

beer was to be published 1 minute before it became Thursday. The new time, however, would not change - it would be 20.59, that's exactly 3 hours earlier!

Month of the moustache


You have probably noticed that some men choose to grow a moustache here in November. That is because it is not simply November, but Movember which is a contraction of Moustache and November. It all started back in 1999 when a group of 80 Australian men chose to do something to raise awareness of animal welfare. That's why they grew "whiskers". Some years later, in 2003-2004, another group of Australian men also chose to grow moustaches to raise awareness. However, not on animal welfare this time, but on men's psychological problems and not least prostate cancer. These topics were at this point taboo subjects, so they wanted to solve this problem to allow people to talk more about it, similar to the awareness of women's breast cancer. Now it was the men's turn to get attention. Movember then slowly became a trend, and the Australian group founded the Movember Foundation, which is today among the 100 largest non-governmental organizations in the world.

But what's does moustaches have to do with men's psyche and prostate cancer? The moustache is just a fun gimmick and as such does not have anything to do with prostate cancer. However, it has become more and more widespread to support Movember, and women have subsequently begun to put (fake) moustaches on to show their support for the good cause.

Mortensaften

Some Danes eat roast duck or goose on the evening of November 10th. This date is

known as Mortensaften, which is the day before Mortensdag, which is November 11th. The 10th of November will be a Saturday. But who was this Morten guy? Morten was not originally named Morten, but Martin. He was a bishop of the French city of Tours and lived back in the fourth century, when France was then part of the Roman Empire. However, he was born in Hungary, which was also part of the Roman Empire at that time.



Martin was a very respected man, having a warm heart for the poor and even able to heal the sick and raise the dead. At the age of fifteen, he joined the Roman army, but when he reached the age of 20 he became a monk. However, his good reputation continued, and

therefore the people of Tours wanted him as bishop. But Martin did not want to be bishop and when the people came to appoint him as bishop, he hid in a flock of geese. However, the geese did not like his visit so they made a lot of noise and revealed him, and he was forced to become bishop. As revenge for the reveal by the geese, Martin ordered that all households must, once a year, slaughter and eat a goose on the date Martin was revealed. At our own latitudes, the story first came into print in 1616. This day, however, got the new name Morten Bisp. November was a real feast back then, as the time for slaughter was one of the times when you ate fresh meat, as most of it was conserved in salt. At that time, geese were not so common here in Denmark, and they were very expensive, so we started eating ducks instead of geese. And maybe that's why most people eat duck on Mortensaften today?

Warmer dishes for colder times!

It's November! It's getting colder and darker, and therefor a perfect time to try some dishes that can warm you all the way to your soul. Here is, for example, a base cake with many variations, and a creamy soup.



Hokkaido soup (4 servings):

Ingredients:

- 1 leek (150 g.)
- 25 g. butter (2 tbsp.)
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 2 tsp. curry
- 1 kg. hokkaido pumpkin
- 1 l. fond or broth (e.g. Vegetable) or water
- 1 tbsp. coarse salt
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 tbsp. black pepper
- 100 g. cream cheese
- Possible to add 1 bundle of Basil
- possible to add 1 tsp. lemon juice

Procedure:

Clean the pumpkin and cut it into cubes. Clean the leek and cut it into rings. Sauté the rings in butter in a pan with the crushed garlic. Add curry and the pumpkin chunks. Add the broth or water and bring the soup to a boil, you may want to add salt. Put the dried spices in a tea or coffee filter and close it up with, for example, some string. Let it boil in the soup for approx. 20 min. and then pull it out. Blend the soup until smooth in consistency. Add cream cheese and blend again for a short time. Add salt to taste, and lemon juice if you want. You can serve it along with rinsed and chopped basil, creme fraiche, toasted bacon or bread croutons and bread.

Pork chops in a dish (4 servings):

Ingredients:

- 4 pork chops
- 2 onions
- 1 bell pepper
- 3 carrots
- Peeled tomatoes
- Tomato puree
- Grated cheese
- Paprika, salt, black pepper, chili flakes and cayenne pepper

procedure:

Chop the onions and bell pepper and sauté them in a pot. Chop the carrots and add them. Let them simmer a little and add the tomato puree and the peeled tomatoes. Season with spices. Let the sauce cook at low to medium heat while adding spices to the pork chops using salt and pepper on both sides. Then put them on a pan at high heat until golden on both sides.

Distribute some of the tomato sauce so that it covers the bottom of an ovenproof dish. Place the pork chops in with a little space between them and then pour the rest of the tomato sauce over. Add grated cheese and insert into a 200 °C pre-heated oven for 40 minutes. Best served with rice.

Pound cake with variations:

Ingredients:

- 200 g. butter
- 200 g. sugar (2 1/4 dl.)
- 1 organic lemon, lime or orange, or 1/2 rod vanilla (or 2 tsp. Vanilla sugar)
- 4 eggs
- 200 g wheat flour

Procedure:

Stir the soft butter with the sugar until it is white and foamy. Add grated lemon, lime, orange or vanilla sugar/grain. Add one egg at a time and stir well between each egg (if you are not careful with this step, the dough can separate). Add the flour last.

Pour the dough into a greased pound cake pan/mould of approx. 1 1/2 litre. Bake in the middle of the oven for approx. 1 hour at 175 °C. Stick in a meat pin, knitting needle or small knife tip in the middle of the cake, if anything sticks to it then the cake needs to cook for longer. Put it on a grate.

Variations:

Boil 2 dl. of orange juice with 6 tbsp. of sugar until you have 1 dl. of syrup, you can add



4 cloves and 5 peppercorns with the juice. Use a meat pin on the freshly baked cake and sieve the syrup over it. Let the cake rest for approx. 4 hours, longer is preferred so that it is evenly divided into the cake.

Marble cake:

Stir 1 dl. of cocoa and the juice from 1 orange into 1/3 of the dough. Place half of the white dough in the bottom, then a layer of brown dough and cover with the rest of the white dough. Slightly stir the dough with a fork. Bake like the pound cake.

Apple and cinnamon:

Peel a few apples and remove the core. Cut the apples into large wedges. Coat the apples in a mixture of sugar and cinnamon and place them on top of the dough. Push them slightly into the dough. You can also sprinkle chopped almonds on top.

Plum and vanilla:

Use plums instead of apples and a mixture of vanilla and sugar instead of cinnamon and sugar. You can also sprinkle chopped almonds on top.


