Food of the future?

If you have not followed up on various news broadcasts over the past few years, then read this brief update: With more and more people on the planet, the production of food will eventually become a problem, considering the climate. By 2050, it will require about 70% more food to be produced. One real solution is to use insect powder in food as a substitute for other forms of protein, fat, fibre, vitamins and minerals, as insects contain all of these. Thus, you do not need to consume as much food.

This is a table of the nutrient contents of crickets.

Many are, however, of the belief that insects are some of the most abominable things to eat, but what if they can help reduce the problem? The largest Danish producer of edible and prepared insects is "Din Insekt Butik". In its online store you can buy everything from insect powder to chocolate-dipped insects, insect chips and insect protein bars. Maybe the fun variants can alleviate the fear of trying something new?


Although it is getting brighter and everything is blooming, there are also some minor drawbacks. It is not a terrible draw-

Daylight Saving time was introduced in Denmark in 1916. That is many years before all other countries in the EU, as they did the same, in 1980.

But why have daylight saving time? Daylight Saving Time was introduced to utilize the hours of light as much as possible.

The idea dates back to 1784, but one reason why it was not introduced earlier has probably been because it was meant as a joke. Benjamin Franklin, one of America's



founders, wrote an essay on how one could reduce the amount of candles burned if people would wake up one hour earlier. However, this proposal was not seen as useful until WW1, as there was a strong shortage of resources during that period.



2: White Day

It is time for the second article in our three-part miniseries. Last month we started out with Valentine's Day, which was February 14th. This time it is a phenomenon called White Day, held a month later; March 14th.

Another difference, is the way of giving the gifts. In these Asian countries, you do not always only the person you like that you gift chocolates, it can also be as a general kindness or social commitment (this can be seen both on Valentine's Day and White Day).

White Day 14 March




Some context is needed, as not everyone has heard of White Day. In Asian countries, such as Japan, South Korea, Vietnam, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Malaysia and China, Valentine's Day is usually a day when women give things (usually chocolate) to men. Men are not expected to do the same on Valentine's Day, which is why White Day is a thing. For on this day it is the other way around, the men give things back to those who have given them something on Valentine's Day. This is the fundamental idea of White Day, but there are many different ways it is used.

The first time this phenomenon was seen was in Japan, in 1978. It was deliberately made, with the reason that it would be more fair if the men also had to give something back to the women who had given them something on Valentine's Day. Something that has evolved in the years after is an unspoken rule that the gifts men should give should be more expensive than the women's. Up to 3 times more expensive.

So while Valentine's Day is usually chocolate inspired, White Day is a bit more varied. It can be chocolate (especially white chocolate), but marshmallows, lingerie, jewellery or cookies are also popular gifts.

That is, you can easily give something to a friend (no matter which sex), as well as to your teacher or boss, without necessarily signalling that you have a romantic interest in that person.

Spending Valentine's Day on something that is not romantic, is also something you see elsewhere on the planet. There has been a trend in recent years to celebrate Galan-



game with the same title. White Day: A Labyrinth Named School is a 2001 Korean video game that was updated in 2015 so that it could run better on computers and on consoles (e.g., PS4).

The game is a survival horror game, where you find objects around the school to help solve riddles and puzzles and to move on with the story. The game takes place around White Day, where the protagonist sneaks into the school at night, to place some chocolates and a diary for his crush. There are others in the school as well and everyone gets trapped in there and the objective becomes getting out of the school alive.

He informs, at point I, that there is presently 90,000 kr. on the union account, and that 18,000 kr. is added monthly from the 30kr. each resident pays via rent. Of the 18,000kr, approximately half will be spend on the salaries of those who are employed through the residents' council. The Inspector, the Secretariat, the Complaints Committee and the Net-Group is not part of this category, as the inspector is paid by KAB, and the Secretariat and the Complaints committee paid by KAB via. Lars Kaj and Net-group is paid by the network account. So the treasurer, the TV/Antenna manager, NybroTidende and the Secretariat is financed by the union account.

8. **Inward correspondence**

A) NybroTidende electronically for the apartments by Keegan O-2

For VOTING AND DISCUSSION

NybroTidende print hundreds of pages every month, which are put together as our local newspaper. Due to the high costs and envi-

ronmental consequences of ink and paper use, as well as wear and tear on the printer, we discussed at the last resident council meeting to stop printing NybroTidende.

There was support from the residents council to keep the printed versions of NybroTidende for the kitchens. That being said, I suggest that we stop printing NybroTidende for all apartments at Nybrogård which would mean financial and environmental savings (since NybroTidende is still available from Nybro.dk).

What was discussed: uploading NybroTidende to the dormitory's Facebook page, as well as sending it via. mail in both Danish and English. In addition, it was discussed whether it is necessary to print both the English and Danish versions for the kitchens, it was debated whether it is more inclusive towards the foreign students to only have the English version, however, it was mentioned that some foreign students have great use of the Danish version as a way to practice the language and relating to this it was mentioned whether it would be more inclusive to have only the Danish version. But since the point only concerns whether to refrain from delivering physical versions of the Newspaper to the apartments, the point was voted on and the discussion about only printing the English version for the kitchens will be resumed at the next meeting when the residents' council representatives have had the opportunity to discuss it with their hallways.

The vote: 6 in favour, 3 abstained, NybroTidende will not be handed out in its physical form to the apartments, but will be available online.

B) Digital voting or similar during the residents' and residents' council meetings by Josephine B56

For VOTING AND DISCUSSION

So that it is possible to see which kitchens are voting what / which residents' council representatives so that voting during the

meetings are improved and go faster and are easier. Suggestions for how to do this or what App would be appropriate for the purpose.

What was discussed: There was not really anyone who had any suggestions and therefore the vote did not take place.

C) First-aid kits at the kitchens by Josephine B56

FOR VOTING AND DISCUSSION

Lars Kaj informed: that all content for the first aid kits and new and updated first aid kits can be handed out / picked up at him during office hours.

D) Dishwashers for the dormitories' kitchens to save water and detergent / soap.

FOR DISCUSSION

This is just for discussion, to hear what others think and whether it should be investigated further in relation to price etc.

What was discussed: It was perceived as a good idea by some and thought worth prioritizing, while others were more sceptical about the kitchens being able to facilitate dishwashers (due to frequent clogging of the drain pipes, however, this has nothing to do with the dishwashers, but with the residents' use of the sinks). Frederik from the board informed that the residents' council would not be able to make this decision, and that it is up to the board to de-

cide.

Some representatives thought it was worth prioritizing and thought it was a good idea and would be ready to investigate it further. It was mentioned by the board that it is expensive. Lars Kaj thought it would not work, between the residents, but here it was argued that it works well for a large number of dormitories.

E) Change of sublease contract; v. Kristoffer Runge L-10

FOR VOTING AND DISCUSSION

It is proposed to change the sublease contract, so that there will also be a point regarding the payment of water and heat usage etc. and clearer rules for any compensation needed. - Change the notice period to 6 months. - subletting of apartments does not necessarily have to be to a couple.

It was informed by a member of the secretariat that the sublease has been changed to include a field where the deposit and the rent are stated, and that the rules of compensation and payment of electricity and heat is up to the tenant and must be agreed upon by both parties. Furthermore, it was informed that the normal termination period for apartments and rooms is 6 weeks to the first day of the month, and that a sublease contract is usually no longer than 6 months and that it would therefore be a little far to move the termination between sublessee and tenant. It was also added that, if one needs a new sublessee during their rental period, that the rules relating to the fact that the contract must be completed and signed correctly and approved by the secretariat no later than four weeks before the lease period can enter into force, can be bent a little, so that you can find a new sublessee as soon as possible and avoid "rent loss". In regards to subletting of apartments, the rules for subletting clearly state that one may sublet their apartment to either a couple or a friend pair if both parties are on a stay abroad or outside commuter distance. If only one party is on a stay abroad or outside commuter distance, then half of the

apartment can be subleased out. The voting was withdrawn.

F) Gift to the Presidents. v. Kristoffer Runge L-10

FOR VOTING AND DISCUSSION

It is suggested that a gift card or similar be given each year to the presidents at the dormitory.

What was discussed: That it shouldn't necessarily be a gift that you simply got annually, but something you could be nominated for i.e. due to extra amount of effort or as a thank you from the club members or as a kind of farewell prize. It was also discussed whether to create a money pool for this purpose and that a chairman could then be nominated and that the prize / prizes be financed by this pool. It was decided that work has to be continued on this point and Kristoffer decided that he will take the point up again at one of the upcoming meetings when the idea has been further elaborated.

The vote was withdrawn.

G) Modification of the "New" rule regarding club funds (adopted in May 2018) by Kristoffer Runge L-10

FOR VOTING AND DISCUSSION

Club chairmen do not have to show up at a certain date to get the funds. But meet up once a year, at any residents' council meeting, to get funding for the following year.

What was discussed: Whether it would be possible for the presidents to meet up at any resident council meeting during the year, or to set up a permanent annual meetings to delegate the sums available and budget plan. Furthermore, it was discussed whether additional meetings should be set up for the presidents, and that it might not be desired to put more demands on the presidents of the clubs, as there is already a large shortage of presidents. In addition, it was suggested to hold a large meeting where there is cake etc.

Voting did not take place as there was

nothing to vote on.

H) Should we have an ATM at the dormitory? v. Kasper Hansen P-16

FOR VOTING AND DISCUSSION

With many residents at the dormitory and far to the closest ATM, we could get out own? Don't know if there is a price to get one or where an optimal location should be, - But it's up for discussion

What was discussed: That it is considered unnecessary. It was mentioned that Netto is not far away and that one could quickly ride their bike there or to the train station to withdraw money or that one could have cash lying ready in the room in the event that one wanted to enjoy a Friday night. Also, that it might be more obvious to upgrade the terminal to include other payment cards instead of setting up an ATM at the dormitory. It was mentioned that the disadvantage of a new terminal, which can accept other payment cards, is that it is more expensive to operate as there are several charges to be paid, which is also why Ahmed would prefer to avoid using this in his Pizzeria and Kiosk.

I) The clubs at Nybrogård dormitory TO INFORM

There is a lack of presidents for the following Clubs, if people wish for them to remain active / become active again; Board Game Club, FC Nybro, Canoe and Kayak Club, Art Club.

What was discussed: Mads E31 wants to be president of the board game club, which will be voted on at the next meeting, as it must appear as a point on the agenda.

Whether to write an article in Nybro-Tidende regarding Information to the Presidents on the club funds.

J) Resident council representatives TO INFORM

K) Club funds: This item was added at the meeting. It deals with the availability funds for the clubs.

The available funds the clubs can apply for and receive will be voted on:

Bicycle Workshop:

Applied for 2000kr the previous year.

Voting: 8 in favour, 1 abstained.

What was discussed: about how the situation is with the new cabinet with tools in the bicycle basement, whether it works with the key system or whether tools disappear.

It was informed that there are no missing tools and not everyone knows that this cabinet exists and how to become part of it. So there are not many who have a key / access to it yet.

Exercise Club:

Applied for 10.000kr. previous year.

Vote: 8 in favour, 1 abstained.

What was discussed: how the payment will take place in the future and that it should no longer take place in cash nor bypassing the residents' council. Right now, payment happens when you join the club by paying 200kr. The original idea is that 100kr. is for cleaning and the other 100kr. constitutes the registration fee, then the club members must pay 100kr. annually for the cleaning of the room. But there are problems with the administration of the money and the collection of the annual amount, therefore it was discussed

whether the administration in the future should go through KAB, so that the money can also be viewed / is not located outside of the dormitory's account and is included in the accounting.

It was informed that there is a vote on FB regarding the future of the club. And that the president's plan is to listen to the wishes of the members and see which equipment works and which does not work.

Brewers Club:

Requested 2.000kr. last year

Vote: 7 in favour, 2 abstained

What was discussed: If the room for the brewers club could be renovated, as it needs it or if another and larger room had to be found as the present room is in the CD-basement and is the size of the room that the canoe and kayak club has for storage of vests and paddles etc.

Gardening Club:

Requested 2.000kr. last year

Vote: 7 in favour, 2 abstained

It was informed: that there are 36 gardens with 41 members, and that there are 10 on the waiting lists for a total of 9 gardens.

Music practice room:

What was discussed: As the chairman is abroad, a POA must be made so that the club can be allocated its yearly funding, as well as make other decisions or apply for other projects at the residents' council. The club informed that they need the money for the soundproofing project of the room the club is located in.

10. New members and alternates

Frederik O3 no longer represents the M, O and S Apartments.

Lisa B60 joins as representative of AB-Even.

Frederik H02 joins as an alternate for the H and L-Apartments.

Mads E31 joins as representative of EF-Even.

Anna S15 would like to register as an alter-

nate for ST-Odd (since she was not present at the meeting, this will not come into effect until the next meeting she meets up to / participates in.).

11. Other

Lars Kaj informed about the defibrillator, which has been installed on the heating central's south side, next to the large brown chimney.

In addition, he also informed that they have now moved into the new office, which has an entrance on the north side of the heating central.

Lars Kaj suggested that we, like in the old days, could hold an annual intro party for all residents of the dormitory, where the clubs, the residents' council, Lars Kaj (the inspector), the board and possibly others, participated and informed of their duties and what their post entails. This is so that the new residents would get an idea of how the dormitory is connected, how it works and how they can influence the dormitory's everyday life and future.

If the event is re-introduced and held, an article about it will be written in Nybro-Tidende.

FOR DISCUSSION AND VOTING


Due to the fact that I have received extra study related work, I have substantially less time and can therefore no longer prioritize


I therefore hope there is someone who wants to take the chance and try it out.

Denmark and the world of handball



Denmark recently won the World Men's Handball Championship 2019 on January 27. — and even on home field! But taking a step back, how did the sport begin, and have we won a World Championship in Handball before? You'll find the answers in this article.

Let us begin with the essential: No, it is not the first time that Denmark wins the World Championship in Handball. The awesome women's handball team won the World Championship of 1997 in Germany. And it was not just any country that Denmark defeated—it was in fact Norway, which was also defeated by the Men's team in Herning this year. The Women's team has also won second place in 1962 and 1993, and have won third place in 1995 and 2013. The Men's team placed second in 2011 and 2013, and placed third on home field in 2007. If you add up the number of medals won by the men's handball team, then they place on a solid 7. place—shared with Croatia— with five medals in total. France is leading with no less than 11 medals, of which 6 are gold medals. In the Women's Championship, Norway is currently the team with the most medals, 10 medals in total, of which three are gold medals. Russia is, however, in the lead with four gold medals.

The history of handball

Let us leave the topics of world championships and medals and return to what it is all about, namely handball. Because that is where we Danes enter the picture!

The game of handball was invented in Denmark (believed to be) In the year of our Lord 1897. The inventors were R. N. Ernst (1872-1937) and Holger Nielsen (1866-1955), who were employed in the school system of Nyborg and

Ordrup Latin- og Realskole respectively. Handball was therefore invented as elementary school game, originally only for boys, and has since spread to men, then girls and women. The first matches were held in the years 1900-1910 in Copenhagen, Randers and Fredericia and thus long before anyone thought of constructing a large building called Boxen in Central Jylland. The handball matches began as indoor 7-man, outdoor 7-man and outdoor 11-man matches. The latter, however, did not survive, but Germany, however, continued the 11-man outdoors as an alternative to the English 11-man football game.

The first national tournament in Denmark was held in 1921 in Copenhagen, and all teams - except one from Helsingør - came from Copenhagen and were affiliated with Copenhagen schools. In 1935, the Danish Handball Federation was founded, and the following year the Women's Handball began a national tournament. The Danish Championship has, however, since 1970 been a generally provincial affair with teams from Jylland being dominant in both the women's and men's championships.

Handball reached international levels with the very first World Cup in 1938. Here the tournament was played in Berlin, and handball was also on the Olympic program in 1936 in Berlin (though as an outdoor game with 11 men). The familiar form of indoor handball with seven players was added to the Olympic

program in 1972 in Munich for men and in 1976 in Montreal for women.

Handball and the Olympics

However, Denmark has not only won medals at the World Cup. The handball women have won Olympic gold medals for Denmark three times: in 1996 in Atlanta against South Korea, in 2000 in Sydney against Hungary and in 2004 in Athens against South Korea. The last time the women were in the Olympics was in 2012 - however, Denmark placed 9th. The men celebrated a victory of 28-26 against the strong French world champions in 2016, when the Olympics were held in Rio de Janeiro and has therefore "only" won Olympic gold once.

European Handball championship in 2020

Are you one of those who think that football is more interesting than handball. Denmark, as you know, has not won the World Cup in football (yet?). However, we have won the European Championship in football in 1992 with a 2-0 victory against Germany in Gothenburg. Likewise, the handball men have won the European Championship twice - in 2008 and in 2012. The women have won the European Championship three times - in 1994, in 1996 and in 2002. Among the women, Norway has won the European Championships seven times.

Will Denmark be able to bring home

more victories in the coming years? We must, unfortunately, have to wait in anticipation.

NybroTidende's February Food column:

Pancake-Edition!

it's March! If you fancy a light snack or dessert or want to set fire to them, then you'll enjoy this one. Flambéing may seem intimidating, but pancakes are cheap to make and therefore better to start off with than an expensive steak.

Danish pancakes: (10-12 pancakes)

Ingredients:

- 3 eggs
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1/2 knife's edge of coarse salt
- 120 g. wheat flour (2 dl)
- About. 3 1/2 dl. milk
- About. 25 g. butter

Procedure:

Whip eggs with sugar, salt and flour until the dough is smooth. Add milk, a little at a time, and whisk the dough until uniform. Put the dough in the refrigerator for at least 30 min. Whip it and add a little more milk, the dough must be as thin as cream so that it easily spreads on the frying pan. Heat the pan well and melt a small dollop of butter on it. Pour enough dough on the pan for it to spread, but not so much that it becomes too thick. Turn the pan so that the dough spreads evenly and thinly. Flip the pancake when it is light brown at the edge and light brown on the bottom. They can be served with jam, sugar, icing sugar, Nutella, syrup, fruit (fresh or mashed) or ice cream.

TIP! The dough can be prepared with 1 1/2 dl. beer and 1 1/2 dl. milk — then they be-

come more crispy. Add 4 tbsp. of melted butter or oil, then the pancakes are easier to bake. Only add fat to the pan when baking the first pancake, for the rest it is unnecessary. Add approx. 2 tsp. of grated orange- or lemon peel or 1/2 tsp. of ground cardamom.

Crêpes suzette: (4 servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 portion of 'Danish pancakes'

Sauce:

- 50 g. butter
- 25 g. icing sugar
- 1 organic orange

Flambé:

- 1/2 dl. cognac or Grand Marnier
- 20 g. sliced almonds



Procedure:

Fold the pancakes into quarters. Melt butter on a pan. Add the sugar, juice and orange zest. Heat the sauce. Put the pancakes in the sauce and heat on low heat. Flambé: Pour cognac or Grand Marnier on the pancake just before serving. Ignite and flambé! Beware. Serve when the fire is extinguished and sprinkle with sliced almonds.

TIP! It may be necessary to flambé twice. The pancakes are served on hot plates.

American, banana pancakes:

Ingredients:

- 1 cup wheat flour
- 1 tbsp. Sugar
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 1/4 tsp. Salt



200 gram mel



5 dl mælk

3 æg



1/4 tsk salt

1 tsk sukker

1 spsk olie

50 gram smør



Pisk mel og mælk sammen.

Pisk æg, salt, sukker og olie i.



Steg dem gyldne i smørret.

- 1 egg, whipped
- 1 cup of milk
- 2 tbsp. vegetable oil
- 2 ripe bananas, mashed

Procedure:

Mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In another bowl mix eggs, milk, oil and bananas.

Slowly stir the dry ingredients into the bowl with the banana mixture. It does not matter that the dough is a bit lumpy (due to the bananas).

Heat a frying pan with fat on it. Pour some of the dough in the middle of the pan and heat them until they are golden brown on both sides.

Serve hot.




