- The opportunity to save another person's life
- Good conscience
- You get to know your blood type
- You can get iron tablets free of charge if you suffer from iron deficiency
- Possibly overcome your fear of needles
- Sweepstakes and other membership benefits

Donation locations

There are many places where you can donate blood. Virtually all of Denmark's hospitals have a blood donation department (Gentofte can only extract plasma - see more on the website).

Some larger workplaces, such as Novo Nordisk and Ørsted, also have blood donation facilities (primarily for employees); also DTU Lyngby campus. In addition, Lyngby Stadium (Lundtoftevej 53) is, during some periods, open for everyone to make donations.

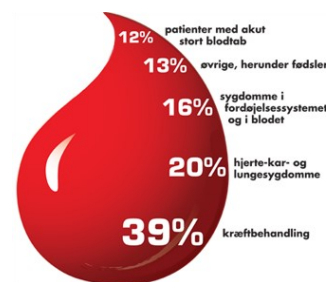


Quarantine rules

However, before one can donate blood, there are a number of things to consider. The list of factors that can put you in quarantine is really long! The most common reasons for quarantine among young people are:

- Diabetes (permanent exclusion)
- Fever over 38 degrees (2 weeks quarantine after complete recovery)
- Pregnancy (both during and 6 months after birth or abortion)
- Sexual Diseases (4 Months Quarantine)
- Drugs (1 month's quarantine - Hashish only 24 hours)
- Piercings (4 months quarantine)
- Travel (see travel quarantine card on Bloddonor.dk)
- Tattoos (4 Months Quarantine)

You are typically told, that the donated blood goes to acute blood loss, but it is actually only 12%. See for yourself here:

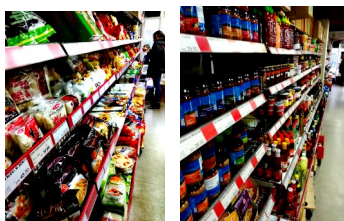

We have been in dialogue with the music room and have been met with understanding but not much support to remedy the problem. There has

been talk about putting up sound insulation, but since it has taken a few months purchase any, I doubt that it will soon be set up. Moreover, I am not sure that it will suffice in dampening the noise. We would therefore like to vote for further time limitation. Brexit—what now?



And now to a story from beyond the Danish borders: Britain will - as planned - no longer be a part of the European Union on March 29, 2019, which is after this issue is published. It is probably a story that most people are aware of - but does it have any significance for us here in little Denmark, that a large nation chooses to leave the Union? Learn about Brexit — and what will happen next!

Let's start with the beginning: On June 23, 2016, a majority of voters in Britain voted to leave the EU. The vote was very close when 51.89% of Brits voted for Brexit, while 48.11% voted to stay in the Union.

Who voted for?

If we take a look at the numbers, a picture of who actually voted for the UK to leave the EU begins to form:

- 73% of voting Brits under the age of 25 voted to stay
- 60% of Brits over 65 voted for Brexit
- 56% of the 45-54 year olds voted for Brexit
- 81% of full-time students voted to stay
- One in 10 decided which to vote for on the day before the election

So, it seems that the youth of Britain wants to stay in the Union while the elderly want out.

What countries make up Great Britain?

Many refer to Great Britain as England. However, that is by no means the truth.

The United Kingdom consists of the countries England, Scotland and Wales. If you add Northern Ireland, then you get the United Kingdom (UK). All four areas are part of Brexit, but only England and Wales voted to leave the Union while Scotland and Northern Ireland voted to

stay in the Union. But nevertheless, the majority of the Brits (i.e. the UK) chose to vote to leave the Union.

Why did the British vote to leave?

One of the reasons is that there has been a lot of migration to the UK over the past many years. Up to 3 million EU citizens have come to work in the UK, which has affected the welfare and British health system. In addition, a number of refugees came to the UK in recent years. Also the EU-critical party UKIP is probably also one of the reasons - the party grew steadily before the vote and put pressure on a having the vote. It was believed that it was time for the British to be master in their own house.

What does Brexit mean for the UK?

It only depends on whether or not a deal is brokered with the EU.

To end their partnership with the EU, they will have to pay approx. 39 billion GBP — according to the current divorce agreement. In addition, it is likely that the so-called "Backstop" comes into effect. This intends to keep an open border between the EU country Ireland and Northern Ireland, which is part of the UK and therefore not a closed border. But with an open border, the UK will continue to be part of the EU customs union, and this is not wanted by some parliamentarians.

What about Denmark?

If the British leave the EU without a deal - resulting in a hard Brexit - then it is not without consequences for Denmark.

If, for example, you have bought airplane tickets to the UK after March 29, 2019, you may run the risk that your flight will be cancelled due to Brexit, since all UK airlines will have to re-apply to fly into European (read: EU's) airspace. And you will not be compensated if your flight is cancelled as a result of Brexit. Therefore, remember to read the fine print if you order in the UK.

As a student, you may want to exchange, but if no deal is made with the EU on student exchange, then Danish students may risk being treated as other students outside Europe and must therefore pay higher fees for studying in the UK.

The Danish economy is also expected to be hit, whether or not they work out a deal. Seven-eighth percent of our exports at 91 billion. DKK goes to the UK, and such goods will be subject to customs duties when they are to be imported into the UK. The supply chains with our export goods can also be expected to be affected. It is estimated that Denmark is the third hardest hit among EU member states (after Ireland and the Netherlands). With a hard Brexit, Denmark can lose 1% of our gross domestic product - in addition to some jobs.

What happens next?

This issue is published before 29 March 2019. What the final outcome of Brexit will be, is not known at this time. The editorial staff can therefore only encourage keeping your eyes and ears open.

Food Column: Easter edition!

it is April! The Easter bunny is about to drop by, but instead of chocolate eggs, there are a lot of recipes using eggs that are perfect for Easter lunch. There are lots of different variants that go well with curry herring.



Boiled eggs:

Bring 1/2 dl of water to a boil in a pan. Gently lay the eggs in the boiling water, and cover with the lid. - On electric stoves: switch off the heat and leave the pan on the plate. - On gas stoves: let boil on the lowest setting.

Soft-boiled eggs: 4-5 min

Soft but firm eggs: 6-7 min

Hard-boiled eggs: 9-10 min

Cool the soft-boiled eggs under running cold water for a moment. Cool the firm and hard-boiled eggs by placing them in cold water before peeling.

TIP! Cooking times for eggs varies depending on the size, temperature and age of the eggs, therefore the cooking times are only guiding. Puncture the eggs with an egg piercer or meat needle at each end to avoid cracking during cooking. If many eggs are to be boiled, put the eggs in a sieve and immerse them in the boiling water. Cooked eggs are good in salads, such as cold cuts, egg salad, as side dishes for lunch and soups.

Eggs with mustard sauce:

Ingredients:

- 8 firm or hard-boiled eggs
- 15-25 g butter (1-2 tbsp)
- 2 tablespoons of wheat flour (20 g)
- 4 cups of milk
- 1/2 teaspoon coarse salt
- ground pepper
- Possibly 1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1 tablespoon coarse mustard or sour mustard

Procedure:

Melt the butter in a pan at medium heat. Whisk the butter while adding the flour. Add the milk while whisking the mix. Whisk constantly until the mixture is smooth and lump-free. Boil at low heat for approx. 5 min, whisk regularly.

Season with salt, pepper and possibly grated nutmeg. Add the mustard, stir and add the eggs.

In the microwave: put butter in a bowl, cover with lid. Microwave at 1000 watts for 1/2-1 min. Add flour and whisk until it is absorbed by the butter. Add milk. Microwave at 1000 watts for approx. 5 minutes, or until the milk boils. The milk must not overboil. Whisk the sauce until smooth. Season with salt and grated nutmeg. Add the mustard, stir and put the eggs in.

Accessories: possibly rye bread

Filled eggs - 2 variants (4-8 pers.):

Ingredients:

- 4 hard-boiled eggs
- approx. 1/2 dl cream
- 1 teaspoon of Dijon mustard
- 1-2 anchovies or European anchovies (can be omitted)
- 1 tablespoon of chopped parsley
- A pinch of pepper from grinder
- possibly salt
- 1/4 red pepper (30 g), capers or black olives

Procedure:

Peel and cut the hard-boiled eggs lengthwise. Remove the egg yolks. Stir the egg yolks with the cream, Dijon mustard, finely chopped anchovies or European anchovies, and parsley. Season with pepper and possibly Salt. Fill the egg whites with the mix using a teaspoon or spray bag. Rinse the pepper and remove the kernels. Cut it into pieces and decorate with the peppers, capers or black olives.

Eggs with avocado filling:

Ingredients:

- 2 avocados (approx. 300 g)
- 1-2 tablespoons of lime or lemon juice
- approx. 1 teaspoon of chili sauce or

pickled jalapeños

- 1/2 teaspoon of coarse salt
- possibly 2 tomatoes (150 g)
- possibly 1 small scallion (50 g)
- possibly 1-2 cloves of garlic

Procedure:

Split the avocado, remove the stone and scrape the meat out. Mash the avocado meat with a fork or blend it with lime or lemon juice. Possibly add diced tomatoes and finely chopped onion. Season with salt and chili sauce or finely chopped jalapeños and possibly crushed garlic. Remove the egg yolks and fill the eggs with guacamole.

TIP! Hard-boiled eggs can be stored for 2-3 days in the refrigerator.

Curry herring (4 pers.):

Ingredients:

- 100 g Mayonnaise
- 1 1/2 cup creme fraiche
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2-3 tsp curry
- 1 teaspoon of Dijon mustard
- 1 onion (100 g) or 3 scallions
- 1 apple (125 g)
- 1/2 teaspoon coarse salt
- 1/2 pinch pepper from grinder
- 200 g of marinated specimen fillets

Procedure:

Stir mayonnaise and creme fraiche with lemon juice, curry and Dijon mustard. You can easily add more mustard and curry to taste if you want a slightly stronger dressing. Add peeled, finely chopped onion(s) and apple cut into small cubes. Season with salt and pepper. Remove the brine from the herring and cut into small pieces. Put them in a dish and pour the dressing over, or mix it all together. Can be served with eggs (hard-boiled or firm), dill or chives and bread.

Gentofte flea market

The most important thing to know about this flea market is when and where it is. The place opens on April 7th and they are open all the way until October 6th! They are open every Sunday (It is never closed regardless of the weather) between. 8-14. The address is Bregnegårdsvej 2, 2920 Charlottenlund, just behind Charlottenlund Station. So yes, Gentofte flea market is located in Charlottenlund.

It is fairly simple to get to the flea market from the dormitory, as there are both buses and trains stopping right next to it (the best option is probably to use Rejseplanen) and there is reasonably good parking options in the area if you have a car. It is close to a beautiful forest, if you would like to have a little picnic. In addition, it is best to arrive well in advance and make the best purchases before the market gets crowded with guests.

"Gentofte Flea Market is run by Overførstergården, an independent institution. Overførstergården was founded in 1991 to help homeless people with alcohol problems and psycho-social difficulties. The flea market was opened in October 2000 and is operated as a revenue-covered business where the profits are used for the benefit of the shelter."

Some useful information is that it is only the first 60 cars that can get park-



ing in the flea market (where many of the parking spots are taken by people with stands), the rest must park on Bregnegårdsvej and as a guest you may not enter the area by car at any time, but find spots along nearby roads. If you have a car, it is also good to observe the parking instructions as many are fined every Sunday.

At the flea market itself, the stands are organized in a kind of oval ring and Gentofte Flea market is one of the most visited flea markets in the Copenhagen area. There are plenty of stands

and opportunities to find something for every taste. From old antique items to branded and fashionable clothing, to toys for children and adults of all ages.

The best way to see more is probably to go there. It is about to start, so you can easily go there for a few hours with a friend or a failing member.

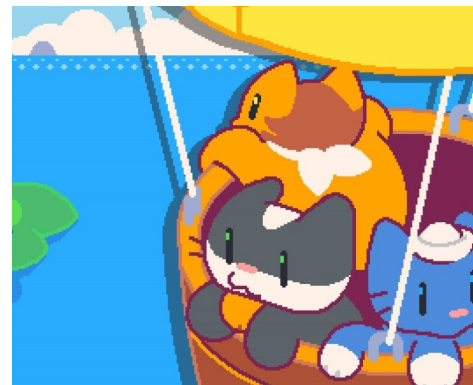
