Rejsetid?

Soon, it really will be summer, and for most it means that you can see the end of exams approaching - or the start of re-exams, but if you have not already arranged the holiday, there are plenty of cheap solutions!

For flights we have 3 tips; 1. either order them 1/2 to a whole year in advance so that you can get them cheap, 2. you do the opposite and order them the day before so that you can get some of the extra, extra cheap cancellation tickets - at the same time you live life dangerously, 3. almost no matter when you order tickets, it is a



good idea to do so after Tuesday of a new week, as this is where the prices start to fall.

You can also take the train to many places, which can be cheaper than flying. Germany is a very good option if you are on a budget, as both transport by train is cheap, but also motels or Airbnb are relatively cheap. And the food, it's so easy to find cheap, but at the same time pretty good, food in Berlin.

Biking and hiking are also options that you should not forget! Denmark is really rich in places you can go. The Margorite route is a classic, but you can easily go to Sweden or Norway as well. You can even take a ferry to e.g. Bornholm, it is only extremely expensive to take ferries if you bring a car.



It can be a little harder to get this planned, but if you love either canoes or kayaks, then there are also opportunities to find routes in Scandinavia where you can bring a tent. But otherwise you can always just try a canoe trip in the two lakes right by the dormitory if you don't want to do it for more than one day. First aid (Not life-threatening situations)



It can quickly go wrong in a kitchen. Knives, stoves, Friday beers... There are several elements in a dormitory kitchen that are not completely harmless. Fortunately, there are often several residents in the kitchen at a same time, so if an accident occurs, then there are likely to be people who can help. NybroTidende has reviewed three risky accidents in a dormitory kitchen with a refreshment of the various forms of first aid.

-Deep cuts:

Cause: Knife

Situation: The kitchen knife has just been sharpened and you accidentally drop it onto your foot, wearing only slippers. The sharp knife strikes the tip, and blood starts running.

First Aid Method: Logically enough, the damaged area should be raised to minimize blood loss.

The injured person is thus placed with the foot raised high while a compression bandage is be-

ing applied. If you do not have a bandage from a first aid kit, the sock can be used.

When should I call 1813? If the cut is more than 2 cm deep and/or wide.

Countermeasure: Wear shoes in the kitchen!

-Burns:

Cause: Deep fryer

Situation: You are in the process of deep-frying French fries, as you accidentally press on "P". As you go over to water the flowers at the window, you do not notice that it begins to smell burnt. Suddenly, it is on fire. You panic and pour water on the flames, but this just makes it all flare up over you and you are now on fire.

First Aid Method: 1. Roll around, 2. lukewarm water on burn areas - not ice cold! 3. Moist dressing on burn areas.

When should I call 1813? When it is 2nd degree burns or worse, or if in doubt.

Countermeasure: Not having the heat on too hot + lid / fire blanket instead of water!

-Bone fractures (open and closed):

Cause: Your alcohol consumption / your clumsiness

Situation: Tour de Kitchen is often wild, so it would not be atypical if the kitchen's biggest

party animal fell from the table. In the case of incorrect landing, this can quickly go wrong, and broken limbs are not something you wouldn't associate with drinking. But what do you really do if you are sober enough to assist yourself?

First aid method: In case of open fracture: Ring bandage. In case of a closed fracture: Support the fracture in the position the injured person is in. - If the injured person is unconscious, place him / her in a stable side position.

When should I call 1813? Always on suspected broken limbs.

Countermeasure: Control your drinking!

NB! Remember that every hallway should have a first aid kit. If you find that they need to be re-supplied, empty or simply not there, then contact Lars Kaj.

General election

A new government must be elected on June 5th. As always, this also entails a large group of new voters, whether they have recently turned 18 or whether they have recently become politically engaged. For a new person in the Danish political system, it may seem like a jungle to make heads or tails of it all. What is a Candidate? What is the difference between voting for a party and for a person? We will try to review the things that can be confusing to new voters here.

We start by defining a few of the terms used.

For general elections, the 179 seats in the Danish Folketing are distributed, two of which go to Greenland and two to the Faroe Islands. The remaining 175 seats are divided into circle mandates and in supplementary mandates. The circle mandates are selected directly from the number of votes in one of the country's 10 major circles. The supplementary mandates are not affiliated with a constituency and are distributed among the parties according to rules that must ensure that the relationship between mandates in the Folketing reflects the relationship between votes for the individual parties. Each candidate can be selected from the constituency.

What about the candidates? Which terms should you know? First of all, there is the election threshold. The election threshold indicates the proportion of votes cast that a political party must have in order to be represented in Folketinget. In Denmark it is 2% of the votes. Before you even have to worry about the election threshold, a party must be approved. If a party is already in Folketinget, they can automatically run again, but if not, they must collect signatures. The number of signatures must correspond to 1/175 of valid votes.

There may be a number of different candidates on the ballot: the Folketing candidates, of which there are most. The leading candidates are the candidates listed as No. 1 on a party's candidate list. Then there are the Members who are not affiliated with a party. Most famous is the comedian Jacob Haugaard, who was elected to Folketinget as a non-affiliated Member back in 1994.

To be elected as a non-affiliated candidate, you must have 20,000 personal votes, which brings us to the kind of votes you can cast: personal and list votes. When placing a personal vote, you vote not only on the party but on the specific candidate. This helps to choose who will sit in the Folketing. If you place a list vote, you help to choose which party should be stronger in Folketinget. If a party uses a party list, the candidates will be placed in a prioritized order. That is, the top candidate will get the list votes first until they are elected. Then the next one on the list will get the next votes.

There are, of course, different names for the different types of voters. A voter who always votes on the same lot is called a core voter, while those who make their choice each election are called margin voters. Sofa voters are those who do not vote at all, rather than giving a blank vote.

Now that we have some of the terms in place, it's about finding out how we can vote. To vote you must use your voting card. The voting card will be automatically sent, and about five days will elapse from the election being announced and you receiving it. On the voting card there will also be information on where you should go to vote. Those who are not at home or otherwise prevented from voting at their polling station can send their vote by letter instead. You can get information about postal votes in your municipality. These votes can be cast the last three weeks before election day and until the penultimate day before election day.

The reader is hopefully a little wiser about how a general election in Denmark takes place. Now we only need to start voting. The Folketing election has a total of 13 parties this election, three of which are new players: Nye borgerlige, Klaus Riskær Pedersen and Stram Kurs. The rest are well known, with old acquaintances such as the Venstre, Socialdemokratiet, De Radikale, Dansk Folkeparti og De Konservative. This

article will not attempt to outline the issues and policies of the various parties. We could have used an entire version of Nybro-Tidende on that. Folders, debates, party websites and the many posters are the best ways to orientate. Have a good election!

The item was presented, no one interested was present at the meeting it was proposed to make a post on the Nybrogård Dormitory Facebook page, and it was informed that the chairman will move out at the end of May. The chairman spoke about what he had done in his time as chairman, which meant cleaning up the room, arranging work Saturdays / work days with pizza, buy new tools and then he has set up a new locker with lock.

No voting took place as there were no interested parties.

B) Grass area for wildflower meadow v. Camilla Daoust D-10

FOR DISCUSSION AND VOTE

I was inspired by this article <https://www.dn.dk/nyheder/sadan-forvandler-du-din-graesplaene-til-en-vildblomstereng/> and have shared it on Nybrogård's Facebook page where I've received a lot of support.

The proposal is to transform some of the grass areas of the dormitory that are not really used into areas where wild flowers can grow, for the benefit of bees and butterflies.

In addition to being beautiful and beneficial to nature, these areas could be

placed next to e.g. some shrubs and stones that can be difficult to mow around. This will make it easier and less time consuming to cut the grass.

I suggest that we convert some of the ABCD grass area, as there is a lot of sun and much grass area that is not used so much anyway. This could be done as a pilot project where we buy 10 bags of seeds that cost 49kr each. It will transform 120 square meters of grass into wild flowers and cost just under 500 kr.

What was discussed: that there was some anxiety about the insects. There were concerns about how it would affect nature when you change it into something that naturally does not occur.

It was asked what these small areas of flowers can contribute with that Radiomarken, Lyngby Lake, Bagsværd Lake, Åmosen and the other protected areas cannot contribute with. It was informed that there has previously been such a flower stripe along the road and that it is not known why it disappeared, it was further informed that it previously gave a great pleasure to the older ladies in the area.

It seems that there is generally agreement that it is considered a good idea, but both CD-Even and CD-Odd mention, among other things. that they do not want it close to them, but that they otherwise thought it a good idea, which both PR-Even, EF-Even and EF-Odd agree with. It was suggested to make a map of the places where the flowers would be sown to the next agenda so that everyone can have a chance to give their opinion and as it is easier to relate

to specific places. Camilla said that she has already been developing a map, but since others have not had the opportunity to see this map (before the meeting) and because Camilla will be moving out earlier than expected, it was decided that until the map has been on the agenda and a person who will take responsibility for the task is appointed, no decision can be made.

Furthermore, it was suggested to sow it in places that are not used so much, e.g. in front of the pizzeria, at ST and elsewhere.

It was concluded: That the vote cannot take place before the map of proposed planting sites has been on the agenda and a person responsible for the project / one who will take over the item has been found.

The **Board game club** informed that it is up and running and that there will soon be some more interesting games, and that it is planned to make a day where the kitchens are visited

KælderCaféen asked if we have a table top at the dormitory that can be used on top of the billiard table in KælderCaféen, to introduce some table tennis days / evenings. It did not seem like the dormitory had any available and KælderCaféen will therefore consider buying a one.

It was again suggested / asked why there is no cake, snacks, food and drink for the meetings.

It was suggested to introduce it to the meeting in September, where new residents have moved in and old have moved out, to draw attention to the residents' council.

Another said that they had chosen to join the residents' council for the social aspect and therefore felt that food and drink for the meetings could contribute to more fun and socialization.

It was asked about Nybro cake festival, where it was informed that it is held once a year and that there are a number of different prizes that one can win, everything from the finest cake to the best tasting and tallest (has also been awarded). More information will follow by those responsible for the event on the FB page and the dormitory. Furthermore, it was informed that it is typically held during the summer holidays.


A) Laundry machines v. Kasper P16

It is certainly no news that you have been told that you have to come and pick up these key fobs (see picture) at Lars Kaj's office. The reason why such a system is about to be put to use is to prevent strangers entering the dormitory during night hours. One of the reasons that the system was discussed in the first place was the arson committed a couple of years ago. It was the ST building that was set on fire in 2015, on the lower floor. This is probably not the only

reason, but it makes good sense that this is probably one of the reasons.

It will not be necessary to use them in the daytime hours, as people like the postal service must be able to enter the mailboxes inside. There are also many other people - such as Take-Away drivers that come and go, or people who are visited by family and friends.



From the dormitory: The gardens

With Nybrogård dormitory's location in the middle of nature, it is, for some, an obvious opportunity to grow various vegetables and fruits. Nybrogård Gardening club started in 1978 and there are three garden areas, each of which is located next to one of the buildings that are next to the lake: CD, LM and NO. In addition to the 46 gardens that can be allocated to the members of the club, there are also various berry bushes and apple trees at the dormitory's common areas which can be used freely by all residents.

A resident said yes to answering some questions about her garden.

She has had her garden since July 2018, so almost a year. She says she would like to try to grow her own vegetables, adding that she never had green fingers, so she had to start somewhere. In addition, there is also a consideration for the environment included in the decision: You get too much plastic along with the fruit you buy and the vegetables in the shops, and she wants to avoid supporting this.

In the garden she grows a bit of everything: rhubarb, strawberries, radishes, and potatoes are some of the crops. In addition, there are also a lot of salads.


But why do you want a garden at all?

Of course, it is convenient and possibly cheaper in the long run, but it is also a lot of work.

Of course, there are also some bad things. The resident has experienced that the gardens have been dug up after sowing - at the beginning of the year there was a large hole in the garden where she had just sowed.

There is also, as you can also see on the maps of the gardens, Japanese willow in the garden, which grows very quickly and is difficult to get rid of.

But it is all worth it when the harvest comes. With fresh rhubarb during the spring and delicious vegetables over the summer it must outweigh a lot of the hassle of growing and maintaining a garden. And as the resident said herself, home-grown Danish strawberries are hard to beat.

Now that the early summer has past, the next step is to start using the many fruits and vegetables it has brought us. This time in the we will be cooking with rhubarb!



Rhubarb porridge

Rhubarb porridge is easy to make and can be used for several things: on top of yogurt or skyr for breakfast, with some macaroons and cream in a dessert or to combine the sour-sweet taste with lamb.

ingredients:

- 500 g rhubarb
- 1/2 dl water
- 150 g (cane) sugar
- 3 teaspoons of vanilla sugar


The rhubarb is cleaned and cut into chunks. They are put in a pot of water with sugar and vanilla. Let it boil under the lid. Let the it simmer for 20 minutes.

You can add sugar to taste.




