Fungi in the dormitory kitchens

This month we're talking about something you probably haven't heard before: The versatile fungi.

Fungi are all around us and they add both good and bad things. Fungi add flavor to the meat sauce. Some think chanterelles are luxurious. We get mold on our rye bread. Another fungus named *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* causes bread to rise and produces the alcohol in our beer, while the blue cheese gets its name and flavor from the mold *Penicillium roqueforti*. You were already aware of many of the examples of how fungi affect us every day, but did you know that penicillin was originally discovered in a mold called *Penicillium chrysogenum*? Or that Novo Nordisk has inserted a gene for insulin in baking yeast and uses it to produce the insulin they sell to diabetics in the world? and that *Aspergillus niger* can cause severe lung infections, but at the same time, the species is used to produce much of the world's citric acid.

This time around, we will not be

covering the industrial and food related fungi. No, these are the molds we can find in our kitchens here in Nybrogård. A study has been done in kitchen E-odd and K-odd, on what spores they could find in the kitchens. Spores can be described as the fungus's version of seeds or eggs. They can float around in the air or lie on top of a refrigerator for many years, just waiting for the opportunity to grow. So if there are a lot of traces of a fungal species in a room, it probably means that that fungus is also present. In turn, there may also be spores from fungi that are not in the room. Here, the spores would have just blown in from outside and happened to land on the petri dish with nutrients that had been put on the table.

The indoor climate in a kitchen influences the fungal profile - that is, what spores we find. The profile of a damp room will vary depending on whether it is due to water damage, where in bad cases you will find fungi such as *Stachybotrys* and *Thricoderma*. In addition, the penicillin fungus, *P. chrysogenum*, is

also considered an indicator of moisture. This fungus was found on K-odd, but there were no other fungi that could indicate moisture damage.

You can also say something about the hygiene in a room: That is, whether there are fungi that indicate the presence of moldy food, and such fungi were found on E-odd. These are *Penicillium glabrum* and *Penicillium digitatum*. *P. digitatum* is only found on citrus fruits, so there is someone in the kitchen that may not have thrown out their moldy lemon.

In both kitchens, several fungi from the genus *Cladosporium* were found, which produce airborne spores and generally live outside. All of these spores are most likely to have entered from the garden door, either via the air or on the sole of a resident.

Thus, it can be concluded that there are some citrus fruits that need to be thrown out on E-odd, and that they, at least, are well ventilated.

The tradition of Fastelavn

“Boller op, boller ned. Boller i min mave. Hvis jeg ingen boller får, så laver jeg ballade” These are the magic 17 melodic words to sing, if you want candy from your neighbors. As per tradition, Fastelavn is on February 23rd, so get out your best costume and pack away some of your offense-sensitivity, for when you see a sombrero on the street!

Fastelavn is an old custom, which today is mainly celebrated by children and young souls. The tradition includes Fastelavn buns, and barrel smashing, resulting in the crowning of cat-kings and queens. The tradition has its origins from pre-Reformation times. It was a preparation for the Lent, where the last good things, such as white bread, fatty eats and meat, were enjoyed before giving them up. This also applies to common norms. The celebration became a preparation for Easter and Lent. After the Reformation, Fastelavn was still celebrated in the non-Catholic countries as a folk custom, but the fast was abolished. Therefore, it is also more common among Catholics to fast for the 40 days. The name Fastelavn is derived from the German “Fastelabend”, which refers to the evening before the fast. Carnival or “Carne vale”, which is the name the celebration goes by in some countries, means “Goodbye to the meat”.

The smashing of barrels was originally an adult drinking party event, with meat, dancing and costumes. Back then, it took place on horseback and the cat in the barrel was alive!



The cat symbolized evil, which man fought against by hitting the barrel. Today, to many cat lovers' reassurance, the barrel is filled with sweets or other treats. The costumes of old were uncanny, creepy things to scare away evil, but today, the type of costumes used is varied. It is customary to make a lot of trouble. In the old days, it was erotic in nature and was banned because of the party's sinful nature.

Another tradition-rich Fastelavn item is the Fastelavnsris, and it was considered sacred duty to flog your family with it, as it was thought to rid the body and soul of sin. In addition, going door to door is popular with children, who sing to get candies or money.

Fastelavn marches are popular in Europe and elsewhere, such as the carnival in Rio. If you would like to start the semester with a vacation, but do not feel like skiing, “Fasching” - one of the major German cities - is a recommended destination. It is an

adult-Fastelavn party with loud music, alcohol and celebration among people in costumes. If you are not going to a Fastelavn party this year, it may be that a Fastelavn bun would tempt you as a delicious treat. Podcast: This Podcast Will Kill You

Like so many others over the past few years, podcasts have captured our attention, and this month we thought we should share them with you! This time we talk about a podcast we found a short time ago about various infectious diseases.

The name of the podcast is *This Podcast Will Kill You*, which is very apt. The hosts take us along through a range of infectious diseases (and poisons!) That can either make our lives miserable or do away with us within days.

The podcast is run by two disease ecologists from the United States, one of whom always tells a story involving the infectious disease. As an example, she spent a lot of time talking about the Spanish flu in their influenza episode. It was the

story of John Snow and his map in the episode about cholera. Another example is the story of the first smallpox vaccine. The other host talks, in simple terms, about the biological aspects of the disease: Is it caused by a virus or a bacterium and how is it transmitted? Through bodily fluids, like Ebola? By a person with the disease coughing on a healthy person, like tuberculosis? or is it transmitted by ticks or mosquitoes, similar to the plague and malaria?

At the beginning of each episode they introduce this week's 'Quarantini', which is a drink they have made and given a name that fits this week's illness. For example, the drink for the tuberculosis episode was "Alcohol consumption" which refers to the alternative name for tuberculosis — consumption.



They post the recipe on their social media every week so you can make the drink and drink along. At the end, they usually ask "How worried should we be?" Or "What about the disease should we be scared by?", While also talking about the status of the disease in question today.

The podcast is on Spotify, iTunes, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.

Food column

It's February, it's still dark, and it's still cold. Fortunately, there are anniversaries that make the month a little more bearable: Fastelavn and Valentine's Day. We bring a Fastelavn-bun recipe for the celebration, and a delicious soup recipe to keep you warm for the rest of the month.

Fastelavn buns

If you are into Fastelavn for the buns, then you have come to the right place. These Fastelavn buns are from Grigos Hjemmebag, but with some changes.

Ingredients

- 2 dL milk
- 25 g of yeast
- 100 g butter, melted
- 50 g cane sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons cardamom
- Ca. 500 g wheat flour
- Some whole milk for brushing
- 1 serving of cake cream
- Powdered sugar
- Possibly some food coloring

Procedure

Make cake cream and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. — We used Grigo's cake cream recipe, but a pre-mix, or another recipe can also be used — or remonce, if you're a little adventurous!

Strain the milk into a small saucepan until it is warm to the touch. Mix milk,

yeast and melted butter in a bowl. Add sugar and salt, then stir until dissolved. Add the flour and cardamom and knead it into a smooth and supple dough. Add a little more flour if the dough is too soft. Set it aside to rise, covered with a damp cloth, for about 1½ hours, until it reaches double the size.

Flatten the dough and roll it out onto a floured table, into a square that is approx. 3 mm thick. Cut it into about 20 squares of the size 10 x 10 cm. Put a generous teaspoon of cake cream or whatever you want, in the middle of each piece of dough. Fold the dough well over the cake cream and place the buns on a baking sheet with baking paper, with the folds facing down. Let them rise for 20 minutes.

Brush the buns with a bit of whole milk and bake them in a preheated oven at 250 degrees for 7-10 minutes. Let them cool.

Decorate with an icing sugar glaze, and possibly with fruit coloring — I used green.

Potato-leek soup

Bring the February cold to life with this warm, creamy potato leek soup developed by Nybro Tidende's own authors.

Ingredients:

- 1 kg potatoes
- 2-3 leeks
- 1-2 cloves of garlic
- 1 liter of vegetable bouillon broth
- 1 chili
- A little cream
- 1 tbsp. Olive oil
- Salt & pepper

Procedure

Clean potatoes and leeks and cut them into small pieces (then they will cook faster).

Heat the oil in a thick-bottomed pot and add the leeks, garlic and potatoes as well as finely chopped chili and cook for a few minutes.

Then add the broth and cook gently for approx. 20 min (until the potatoes are soft).

When the potatoes are soft, blend the soup with a hand blender until the soup is a smooth consistency, and add some cream. Add salt and pepper to taste, and the soup is ready to serve!



Copenhagen Light Festival

Despite being the shortest month, February is a month that offers several different activities. Nybro Tidende has compiled an overview on page 12, but has also selected another two that should be experienced during the month.

Every year, Copenhagen holds a light festival that celebrates the darkness through light. The Copenhagen Light Festival event lasts from the 1st to the 23rd of February and offers impressive light displays on much of Copenhagen's characteristic architecture. There will also be pop-up events and other special events.

Due to the long winters in Nordic countries, every 10 Danes are believed to show signs of winter de-

pression (to a greater or lesser extent). Light, however, is an effective treatment method, and one of the thoughts behind the festival is that people should not feel compelled to travel away to other countries during the winter but that there is plenty of hygge and light in Copenhagen. How about combining DinnerDays with the Light Festival and go to TRIO and enjoy their five course menu with an amazing view of Copenhagen? 
