- We are the dormitory's monthly newsletter, and write about everything that happens around you.
- Bus 191 leaves from the dormitory 28 and 58 minutes past every hour between 6:58 and 19:28 and leaves from Lyngby, going back to the dormitory 22 and 52 minutes past every hour between 6:22 and 18:52

# Minutes of Residents' Council Meeting

**Tuesday June 12th, 2013 at 19:00 in the GH-basement.**

The treasurer is sick. It is noted that new network equipment has been purchased. DKK 60,000 has been used from the network account.

7) Review of the minutes of the last board meeting or agenda for the next one

8) Inward correspondence  
a. Financial report from kælderCaféen. See appendix 1. A small deficit of DKK 2000 because of errors with cola and payments. Otherwise, it looks good. It is noted that the total income is DKK 80,500 and the current balance is DKK 25,000.

b. News from the Dog Club: A space on the web page is wanted. See appendix 2. Everything web-related must be sent to the network group. The council

discusses the possibility of noting which hallways do and do not allow dogs as well as the establishment of an allergy-block which can be an option on the application. It is deemed too troublesome to keep track of but the proposal is forwarded to the dog club.

c. Establishment of an antenna group—suggestions from Lars Kaj/Mikkel: Previously (10 years or more ago), an antenna group (1 man) existed. He/she took care of antenna changes. The job was paid similarly to the Secretariat and Complaints Committee. The Antenna Group makes sure that all newcomers are set up with the small TV-package until they ask for the large package. It is then the Antenna Group's responsibility to change the package and notify KAB. The job is proposed to entail 8 hours of monthly work—the person would be responsible for changing packages. Lars Kaj has this responsibility as it is now, and it is discussed whether it is even necessary to change this, as well as the necessity of the job. The person could be responsible for changing packages and doing surveys—what do the residents want? It is concluded that the job will not be advertised.

Extra item:  
Change the notice period for package changes from three months to one month? As it is now, packages can be changed with three months' notice. Can this be changed? It should be possible. Possibly with a month's notice. Can KAB handle this? Who changes it? A procedure is considered for informing residents about the small and large packages when they move in. The information is available on the web site (possibly with an updated reference to the Antenna Group).

- A record of the package distribution is available from KAB. Normal procedure for choosing new channels for the packages is to bring up the subject in the residents' council and

send out a poll to all residents. In the end, the result should be approved by the residents' council. This is particularly important in situations where the rent will rise as a result of this change to the channel package (everyone should be heard).

Conclusion of extra item: Lars Kaj will look into the possibility of changing the notice period to one month.

9) Inauguration of new council members and alternates, including information of council members leaving the residents' council.

Thomas C22 leaves. A new representative is needed.

10) Other  
New chairman of the bicycle workshop: The bicycle workshop's current chairman is moving in October, and a new is therefore needed.

Note: This should be posted in Nybro-Tidende.

LED-lighting poll:  
Not all data has been processed. Preliminary comments: residents have criticized too cold lighting and the lights being on all the time. LEDs have changed this. Everyone is positive about the energy saved. The color has been a worry for some of the residents. It has been noted that the whole hallway should be lit—dark corners arising from too few sensors has been criticized. Lars Kaj will look into it (the communication between lamps and sensors). Possibly LED without sensors. An e-mail with the complete results will be sent out soon.

Noise in ST-odd:  
ST-odd has problems with people who do not live in the hallway that make noise and take things. A doorbell system can not be installed, since this is too expensive. The residents' council can advise that

people do not walk through ST. In order to lock the outer doors, both the door and the frame will need to be replaced, ruling out this option. The current case regarding the binding and noisy outer doors' durability is noted. The possibility of video surveil-

lance is discussed, but dropped.



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## Swap market at Nybrogård on September 7th!

### Free is best!

On September 7<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 to 16:00, NybrogårdKolleget will host a swap market in the PR basement. This is to accommodate all the new residents that are arriving in connection with the semester starting. We would like to welcome them with this event, but everyone is welcome – friends neighbors, families, children, senior citizens, etc.

A swap market is a simple concept which operates under a short set of rules:

- Bring a couple of clean, functional items that you would like to give away (clothes, books, furniture, etc.) Or just come empty-handed!
- Place your items on the tables in the correct categories.
- Take the things you would like to bring home with you. Free!

### Can I just take what I want?

Yes! You give what you can, and take what you need. This is not a 1-1 exchange or a quid pro quo concept – just the pure enjoyment of giving and the pleasure of receiving something for free.


Swap markets are very enjoyable – you can find the most practical and weird things. The atmosphere is always good. The first few times, you may come home with too much, but then you start to let go of the stuff. You think 'I have enough' and 'oh, the abundance!'

### The idea behind it

A swap market is a moneyless event – everything is free. It is inspired by the idea of circular economy and gift economy. The thought behind it is that things should flow to where they are needed most without economic limitations. When you have access to everything you need in this way, the importance of ownership becomes a myth. Sharing becomes much more valuable. At NybrogårdKolleget, there is already a custom of sharing with each other, be it bicycles, cakes, books, canoes, etc. We would like this culture to expand and inspire the rest of society.

When we begin sharing, e.g. through swap markets, our material needs are much more easily met. That means we can spend our energy on something more fun and important than earning money to shop for – like spending time with each other, visiting family, playing sports, enjoying nature, writing a book or working as a volunteer.

In Denmark, way too many good, functional things are thrown out – also at the dormitory. Instead of being used again and again, they are demoted to waste, a strain on the environment. The Environmental Group at the dormitory collects useful items from the trash areas and gives them away through groups on the internet ([facebook.com/groups/freethestuffcph/](https://www.facebook.com/groups/freethestuffcph/) and [freecycle.org](https://www.freecycle.org/)) as well as on swap markets (<http://byttemarked.wordpress.com/>). Just last week, we found three beds, some chairs and a table! It is not only a waste problem, but a resource prob-




lem. Think about it this way: whenever we throw away a t-shirt, we are not just throwing away the 150-200 grams the t-shirt weighs, but also the 3,7kg of materials used to produce it, and 2700 liters of water! There is an enormous ecological benefit to recycling, but a swap market is first of all about sharing the experience and raising our quality of life. A swap market is a social and a cultural event where people across generations and social classes meet. The swap market makes sense. Economically, ecologically and socially. Come join us on September 7<sup>th</sup> at Nybrogård.

### Where is it happening?

The swap market is being held on Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 to 16:00 at NybrogårdKolleget, Nybrovej 304, 2800 KongensLyngby. It will be located in the PR-block's basement. Look for the sign 'P R S T' at the driveway. Walk through the R-entrance and go down the stairs.

# World Championship in Your Neighborhood

It is a great and rare honor that the World Championship in Kayaking Marathon is held just here, in Denmark, on Bagsværd Lake the 19th - 22nd of September. Just a short bike ride and you can experience the marathon up close.

### Why should I go?

Kayaking has become a very popular sport during the last few years. Denmark has always had many talented athletes in watersports, and kayaking is not an exception. This year Danish kayaking athletes have already won 11 international medals in junior and senior leagues at the World and European Championships.

You should go because you can experience Denmark winning more medals in kayaking, because it is just 12 minutes away, because there will be drama and excitement, because you and your friends from the kitchen should go to a big sports event and because it is free.

### Where?

The race will mainly take place in the opposite end of Bagsværd Lake, on the rowing stadium (about 10 min. on bike). The start and finish lines and portage will be here. The race is about 17-25 km. and is on a 4 km track. Within every round there will be a portage where the athletes have to get out of the kayak, run approximately 200 meters with the kayak, and start kayaking again. This is usually the most dramatic part of the race and the point that can change the results of the marathon completely. However, the race can also be observed from the dormitory's end since the bend stretches almost all the way to our end of the lake. So, if you are lazy and do not feel up to walking all the way to the portage, you can also enjoy the competition from here without the big transport hassle.

Race with biggest chance of medals:

K2 Women Senior - Henriette Engel og Jeanette Løvborg

K1 Men Senior - Rene Poulsen

K1 Men Junior - Casper Pretzmann

K2 Men junior- Casper Pretzmann & Morten Graversen

You should keep an especially keen eye on Henriette Engel and Casper Pretzmann. Henriette is seasoned and has already won in her category at three previous events, though all of them was with another partner than her current, Jeanette Løvborg. Besides that, she also won gold medals at the European Championship 2013 and the Olympics in K1 (single person).

Casper competes in the junior league and participates each year in both K1 and K2 (with Morten Graversen). Casper has previously won bronze at both the European and World Championships in the 1000 meter race, while they won gold together at the European Championship in the marathon category earlier this year. Casper also won gold in K1 at the European Championship in the marathon category earlier this year, which makes him one of the big favorites this year.

### Bonus Info:



# The ball is rolling again for F.C. Nybro!

The dormitory's two football teams have officially been on break over the summer, and although they have been kicking the ball around now and then, it was first around the end of August that the teams seriously found their way back to the fields. Just like before the summer, the teams are practicing on the fields by Engelsborghallen (right after Netto on the opposite side of the road). The men have practice Tuesdays and Thursdays from 18:00 to 20:00 while the girls practice Thursdays from 18:30 to 20:00.

From the men's team, the possibility of joining practice just for 'the fun parts' - such as the match at the end of practice - has been opened. This means you do not have to go all in to participate, if you just want to play around a couple of times per week. They have also hooked up with another team which makes it possible to play a match with relatively many players on both teams at every single practice!

### The tournament so far

Both of the dormitory's teams have played in the tournament all through the spring where the women and men's teams have played 7 and 9 matches respectively, as well as a couple of matches in the cup tournament.

The women have done best. They have put themselves in a fight for the top of the women's 2<sup>nd</sup> division with their great playing and fighting spirit. At the moment, they are in 2<sup>nd</sup>

place, although it will be difficult to advance further since Egmont's girls have a clean sheet so far. But they can still try to keep the competition at bay, and they can be happy that they have already played against Egmont twice.

The men have fought hard to keep up in the 1<sup>st</sup> division, and despite the desperate single point, the matches themselves have told a different story. It has been possible to match several of the opposing teams' game, but bad luck, and lack of routine and accuracy have made the harvest very sparse so far. But spirits and morale are high as ever despite the results.

### Remaining matches

The women's and men's teams are missing 4 and 5 games, respectively before the season is over. It will be a busy September and October where both teams could use more players.

While the men still need to play against the top three - with key matches being played against Tietgen, Studentergården and Regensen - the girls are faced with important matches against RJK and Nordisk.

### Plans for the winter season

Work is being done on the possibility of an indoor playing field for the winter. So do not be afraid of starting up because of the short fall season. Meet up and join in - you are more than welcome!



## Nut cookies with chocolate-coffee cream



### About me

My name is Nanna D. Thomsen, I study nutrition and health and have resided in the dorm for about a year. Recently I took over the position as chairman of the garden group.

Furthermore I have a passion for food and raw goods from nature. From this passion comes the idea for this column.

Hope you will enjoy this column.

The column is back and I hope everyone had a lovely summer and had the opportunity of enjoying some great summer dishes.

It probably comes as no surprise that I have a weakness for cook books which regularly results in new books taking their place on my shelves. This also happened during the summer vacation and therefore I spent a week in the dormitory kitchen testing out my new purchase. The week was truly a success, so I will bring you one of the recipes in this month's column.

The recipe is for delicious, crispy nut cookies with chocolate-coffee cream. This is a super easy recipe with only a few ingredients, but the result is fantastic.

Have fun and enjoy.

### Ingredients for around 12-18 cakes

Cakes:

- 50g walnuts
- 50g almonds
- ½ dl egg whites (one serving cup pasteurized or the whites from one egg)

Chocolate-coffee cream:

- 50g butter
- 2 pasteurized egg yolks (one serving cup)
- 40g powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. cocoa
- 1 tsp. coffee beans or instant coffee
- 

Remember to taste the cream – you can use more coffee or cocoa if necessary.

### Directions

The nuts are roasted and chopped, and then mixed with the sugar. The egg whites are whipped until stiff and mixed with the nuts and sugar.

Cover a baking sheet with baking paper. Put the dough onto the sheet with a tea spoon in small chunks, the size of a DKK 5 coin. The cookies will flatten out a little during the baking process, so leave some room between them.

Bake the cookies in a warm oven at 160 C for around 10 minutes or until golden and crispy, but still soft inside.

Let the cookies cool on a grate. It might be easiest to move the entire baking paper with the cakes to the top of the grate. The cookies can be kept in an air tight box until needed.

On the serving day, make the chocolate cream by stirring butter, powdered sugar, coffee and cocoa together. Then add the egg yolks one at a time and whip the mixture for a moment over a boiling pot of water. The cream is removed from the heater and cooled until it can be whipped into a light and fluffy cream.


The cookies are pressed together in pairs with cream in the middle and can be served with a good cup of coffee.

### Variations

The cookies can also be enjoyed without the chocolate-coffee cream. This has also been tested and they just taste great.

They can also be served with raspberry cream, which is made by boiling raspberries and letting them cool before turning them in whipped cream.

As a more expensive option, freeze dried black currants can be added to the chocolate-coffee cream – it adds a somewhat sour twist.

## The Prestige

If you take a look at the films that are reviewed in this column, they often resemble films that have drawn a certain amount of attention to themselves in the media – whether it might be about the film's background, quality, depth or just its relation to a largely hyped universe. This month, however, we will go back in time – more precisely to the year 2006, where the film "The Prestige" premiered. A film instructed by Christopher Nolan, the man behind *Insomnia*, the popular Batman trilogy *The Dark Knight*, *Inception* and the newly released *Man of Steel*. *The Prestige* is nothing less than a masterpiece, though it does require you to pay attention from beginning to end. The film tells the story of two magicians, Robert Angier (Hugh Jackman) and Alfred Borden (Christian Bale), who begin their career at the same show, where they are picked to help tie up the show's female attraction. In reality, everything was set up, and while the audience

baffled let themselves be fooled, everything is being controlled backstage – or so you should think. Julia drowns and this starts the internal rivalry and hate that will come to control both their lives in the years to come.

### Fantastic performances!

The story is twisted, captivating and involving, and you are constantly thrown back and forth between the two duelists, as to which one you should be rooting for. Each has their passions and morals, but also their dark sides which only few can acknowledge willingly!

The two leads do their best to make the film a pearl. Bale plays the role of the mystical Borden to perfection, and you are not a second in doubt about

what lies behind his mystical nature. Opposite, you are drawn by his perfection, his natural talent for magic and his obsession with the ultimate trick. Angier is the showman of the two and what he lacks of natural talent for magic, he makes up for with showmanship! His hate for Borden never fades and his savage fight for revenge and justice makes him both a sneaky and scary opponent.

The two leads are not the only good performances. Other top names such as Michael Caine and Scarlett Johansson also perform great, and especially the latter plays the mind more than once.

If you are in need of a gripping and anything but predictable film, then this film is a direct hit. I will say it again – this film is a master piece – simply put, a must see for anyone that will not begrudge themselves a world class film!
