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New editor wanted!

In August, Emma was dubbed as the third and last editor of NybroTidende. She has proven to be a good match, but risks becoming the only editor! Mikkel is throwing in the towel after a long period of pressure from his studies, and Jakob is disappearing during the spring to study in Australia. New forces are yet again needed.

What does the job entail:

As editor of NybroTidende, your job each month is to write one or more articles for the coming month's issue. Every issue must be finished at least 4 days before the residents' council meeting, which means the deadline is always close to the end of the month. All articles are written in Danish and the translator then translates them to English. The writing is very flexible and just needs to leave enough time for the translator to translate the articles before deadline.

The editorial staff usually holds two monthly meetings, the first of which is usually held shortly after the residents' council meeting. At this startup meeting, they brainstorm ideas for articles for the coming issue and talk about anything

outstanding from the previous month. Depending on the time available and the number of ideas, a responsible is appointed to each idea already at this point. After that, editors are pretty much free to decide when to work on their assignments. Around halfway through each cycle, a halfway meeting is held to look over the ideas and decide if they are still possible while new ideas are brainstormed if old ones are discarded. Each meeting takes around 30 minutes which means you are only committed for around an hour.

The work load is usually unevenly distributed, so that the editors are most busy towards the end of the month. This is up to each editor, however, and by planning their time well, it is possible to avoid this problem. The number of hours put into the job varies from month to month, but so far, each editor has contributed with around 10 hours per month on average, give or take a few each month.

Do you want to be a member of the board?

At the residents' meeting on December 2nd, the dormitory's resident representatives are being elected—that is to say, 2 out of the 3 will be. All residents at the dormitory can run for election as long as they expect to keep living at the dormitory at least until December next year.

The board's composition:

As residents, we have 2 representatives in the board, which also includes 2 representatives from the educational institutions and 2 from the municipality. There is also an alternate member who is usually present at the meetings just like the two representatives. The alternate, however, has no vote at the meetings, unless one of the representatives have cancelled.

Of the two representatives, one is elected for a 2-year period, while the other is elected for 1 year. At the moment, Alexander E16 is the 2-year representative and Jakob is elected

for 1 year. The alternate is also elected for 1 year, and that is currently Camilla L01.

What happens in the board?

The work can be split into two primary tasks. There is the daily work and there are the meetings. The daily work consists primarily of reviewing and approving dispensations from the dormitory's residents. These dispensations usually deal with residents who wish to stay at the dormitory a while longer than what is usually allowed. Sometimes, requests come in from outside which must be handled.

The daily work can also consist of handling tasks that are desirable for the dormitory. In the past years, there has been work on restructuring the study control process so that the dormitory's secretariat will be able to handle a larger part of the tasks in the future, which will hopefully lead to less errors and doubts.

The board meets 3 times yearly, once in December (Thursday the 5th), once in April (budget) and once at the end of September. The December meeting is held in Copenhagen, while the two others are held at Nybro Kro. The meetings are rounded off with a meal and they are usually finished between 20:00 and 21:00.

At these meetings, there is a fixed agenda to go through and it concerns everything from problems at the dormitory to large economical decisions. A future decision will for example be what to do about the ventilation at the dormitory.

If you are interested, meet up at the GH-basement on Monday, December 2nd at 19:00 to hear more or to run for election.

Mikkel would like to move item J up before item E. Samuel should have had KælderCaféen's financial report on the agenda, but it has not been sent out, so it will be discussed under announcements.

In the future, the residents' council would like to see the names of the item holders on the agenda as well as information whether the item is up for vote or not.

5) Economy

The treasurer has not shown. No one has received any numbers from him. A deal is being made with Danske Bank to remove the dormitory's account fee.

6) Announcements

KælderCaféens financial report:

Balance: DKK 11,000

The difference in expenses for purchases and sales in quarter 3 has been exceptionally high, compared to quarter 2. Since the question is somewhat complex, the situation will be reviewed and answered at the following residents' council meeting. The question is posed why drinks are being given out for free. This is to increase sales by bringing more guests into the bar.

Possibility of a water tank in connection with the solar panel system.

A report has been made, which recommends placing a water tank next to the janitor's office. 3 tanks have been considered with different sizes and placements. Burying the tank will not be possible because the ground water is only 1 meter below ground. The item will be brought up at the next meeting after more information has been sent out.

Fire regulations:

Last time, Lars Kaj told us that we might have to lose our bulletin boards. Now, a new decision has been made, which means we can keep the boards but we are advised to move everything unnecessary from them. e.g. outside advertisements.

Signs at CD and ST information from last meeting

The signs have been ordered and will be installed upon delivery.

Review of the dormitory's composition

The chairman of the residents' council will give a summary of the dormitory's composition so there is no doubt about who you should address if you, for example, would like to propose changes to the ventilation, submit a complaint or dispensation application, etc.

7) Review of the minutes of the last board meeting or agenda for the next one

Nothing new.

8) Inward correspondence

A) Alarm in GH

There are mixed feelings in this matter, because not much resident information is stored in GH. The old alarm just made a noise and it was only checked out if residents of GH found the noise annoying.

Vote: 4 for, 1 against, 7 abstain

B) News regarding the copying machine in GH – payment system

The machine in GH is intended to be a resident accessible machine for which usage payments would be charged against a resident's rent, but KAB would then charge DKK 50 per person for an administrative fee. An-

other system has been considered. The price for printing a page is DKK 0,50 and it costs DKK 17,000 + DKK 24,000 to install. Is there even a need for the residents to print at the dormitory when it is possible to print (for free) at their schools. Some hallways do think it is a good idea.

C) Result of the vote for TV channels

Many residents voted for DKK 160 per month, but the most popular costs DKK 286 per month. How do we make most people happy? Some think that too few have voted, since only around 80 out of 600 have voted. A lower limit as to how many residents must vote? We need to please the majority. Maybe 3 polls was too much?

A new polling system is underway, which will make it possible to vote in a new way. Plus the possibility of voting I am happy with the current TV package.

D) The Bicycle Workshop has updated their regulations

See changes. Brought to the attention of the residents' council because no procedure exists for making changes to club regulations under NYK. A thorough cleaning has been finished this weekend.

Vote: 10 for, 0 against, 1 abstain

E) Restructuring the network operations

The Network Group takes care of tasks related to the web-page, forum, mailing lists, resident database, DNS. The web page server will be outsourced and this will cost around DKK 10 per month. The rest of the tasks should be moved to K-net in an effort to collect all dormitories in K-net on the same system. The plan was to vote for this proposal, but this has not been clear enough in the notice, so an item for voting will be added to next month's agenda.

F) Funding for kayaks

Some fiberglass kayaks have been damaged, and the Canoe Club would like to fix them. A lot of money has been spent this year, but not so much in the past years as a whole. The

fiberglass kayaks should last 5+ years if they are cared for properly.

G) Raised member fee in the Exercise Room

The item is dropped because Alexander has not shown up. More information is necessary. e.g. what will the money be used for? Why raise the fee?

H) New chairman of the Cinema Club

Jonas Høj GH-even is volunteering – Thomas from AB-odd is also volunteering.

They have decided amongst themselves that Jonas will become chairman and Thomas will become deputy chairman.

D) Complaint regarding running on the roof.

Do not run/walk on the roof. It is

noisy and the roof is not built for it and will break. Future complaints should be addressed to The Complaints Committee, since they are supposed to handle these matters.

9) Other

Proposal to create a guide for submitting items for the agenda

The network Group will take a look at what a template for submitting items should look like, and how it will be done.

Purchase of soda

The chairman of the residents' council has approved that Mikkel J21 has purchased soda for the residents' council. No objections, but a proposal is made to offer everyone at the dormitory the chance to "earn" the money that is paid for wear and tear of the car.

The dormitory board

1 member is leaving as well as the alternate. 2 new residents are needed for the dormitory's board.

10) Date for next meeting

The next meeting is December 2nd, starting with the residents' meeting at 19:00, where residents are urged to send in items of greater impact, followed by the residents' council meeting around 20:00.

10) New members and alternates

Ann-Louise is moving, so she is changing from representative of NO-even to representative of PR-odd.

Should the football teams be the dormitory's only sports club?

Through many years, the dormitory men's football team has been the dormitory's only sports club, offering sports to the residents at previously unheard prices—free. The past years, there has been a significant development in this area.

Last spring, the girls decided to create a counter piece to the men's team, by establishing their own. Since then, they have successfully competed in the dormitory tournament and created a socially successful team. Although the clubs have obviously centered around sports, the main focus has been, and should be, the social aspect. As one of the few initiatives at the dormitory, the teams have managed to collect people from different parts of the dormitory several times each week, which has created close bonds and acquaintances between people that would otherwise not have met each other at the dormitory.

In 2013's early winter months, the next step was taken. As a result of the proposal of the dormitory tournament, the teams established a sports association behind the dormitory's football teams. An association which has given all the dormitory's residents new possibilities for the future.

As an addition, it has been necessary to collect a yearly fee of DKK 250 for the first season (DKK 200 for the next), which has been decided will be put towards social activities for the club members.

The interesting part of the establishment of the association, however, is neither the teams or the newly established membership fee. It is instead that the teams are now a sports association on equal terms with the other sports associations found in the area (e.g. Lyngby BK, AB Gladsaxe, etc.), which gives better opportunities for applying for field time, both indoors and outdoors—free

of charge.

This creates the opportunity of establishing completely new activities for the dormitory's residents. In the future, it will be possible to apply for sports fields or gymnasiums if anyone is interested in establishing, for example, a Zumba, volleyball or badminton team. The first successful example is already nearly a reality. The football teams have been awarded an artificial turf field in Bagsværd. But more about that later!

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
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Election in Gladsaxe Municipality

Hopefully, most of the dormitory's residents completed the 11,5 minute bike ride to Stengårds-skolen, whether they are politically interested, make use of Gladsaxe municipality or even place their vote on a well considered candidate! But what was the result?



Karin Søjberg Holst, (A) Socialdemokraterne, is continuing as mayor of Gladsaxe. Socialdemokraterne won another seat. Jakob Skovgaard Koed, one of the dormitory's residents also won a seat for Socialdemokraterne.

Enhedslisten also advanced from 1 to 3 seats. Among those three was the dormitory's politician, Susanne Yazdanyar. Dansk Folkeparti advanced from 2 to 3 seats. Venstre and Det Radikale kept their 4 and 1 seats, respectively, and Liberal Alliance became a new party in Gladsaxe city council with 1 seat. SF gave up 3 seat, ending with 2, while Konservative went from 3 seats to 1 seat.

Gladsaxe municipality, with 50,801 voting citizens, received 34,747 actual votes. A turnout of 63,39%.

Karin Sjøberg received an absolute majority with 4,644 votes. The runner up was Trine Henriksen from Enhedslisten with 916 votes.

From the dormitory's own candidates, two of the three were elected. These were Susanne Yazdanyar from Enhedslisten, and Jakob Skovgaard Koed from Socialdemokraterne.

It is Christmas, it is cool, how time flies. Nothing is different from last year!

The same things we eat, the same things we do, the same things on TV the same gifts.

The same problems, it is expensive and hard, with a completely overdrawn credit card

The peppernut

Christmas can not be avoided. It is a time for clichés, but also tradition and enjoyment. And what would Christmas be without all the clichés? **Here I one of them: The peppernut (a Danish Christmas bisquit)!**

But not the cliché version. This recipe is from the founder of the Cake Festival, so get to it! A new taste of the cliché is right here:



Peppernuts (ca. 200 bisquits)

300g wheat flour

100g butter (softened)

175g sugar

2 eggs

1/2 tsp. cardemum (1g)

1 tsp. cinnamon (1g)

1 tsp. salt of hartshorn (3g)

1 shredded lemon peel



All of the ingredients are mixed thoroughly together on a counter-top (tip: weigh all of the dry ingredients off and place them in a big pile, make a depression like a hole in the middle, place the butter along the edges and the eggs in the center. That will keep everything in place). Roll the dough into 1cm thick sausages and place them along side each other on a flour dusted sheet in the refrigerator. When they are cold and stiff (around an hour later), the sausages are cut into small pieces and placed on a greased baking sheet (on baking paper if the sheets are disgusting) Bake at 175 C for around 10 minutes. The peppernuts should not be as dark as the ones found in stores. They are ready when lightly golden.

B) Application for funds for football fields

The fields will be available one weekday evening and the teams will practice together during this period.

While organizing Nybrofestival, the dormitory leases a lot of equipment from outside, while we have invested in other things ourselves over the years. Previously, the festival has owned a set of breaker panels, but these disappeared or were stolen before 2005. I can offer the dormitory some equipment at below market value. I suggest the dormitory invest in a 63A breaker panel, two 32A breaker panels and 4-6 cable

spools. Two extension cords will also be needed (32A red CEE) from Harald Nyborg to connect everything. Total price, excluding cords from Harald Nyborg: DKK 12,800 VAT included.

G) KælderCaféen is applying for DKK 10,000 to install a card reader in their service entrance.

We wish to install a card reader in KælderCaféen just like the ones installed on the doors to the laundromat and other facilities around the dormitory. Many people need to have access to KælderCaféen's facilities. We spend a lot of time administrating keys for KælderCaféen, which is also not very safe, since keys can easily be lost or not returned when the keeper moves away. If this happens, all the locks in KælderCaféen must be replaced, which is a big expense for KælderCaféen. With a card reader, the responsibility for administering access can be given to Lars Kaj and easily cancelled upon resignation as voluntary bartender or when the resident moves out.

Cake Festival, a festival with soul

"It surpassed all our expectations", the founder of Cake Festival reports, referring to November 9th, 2013. Ann-Louise did not come up with the idea for Cake Festival overnight. The festival has soul, it has a story and it turned a normal fall afternoon in November into a gathering place for 110 cake lovers.

November 9th, 2013

They never know how many will come, the 5 behind the Cake Festival twice a year. Again this year, they beat all previous records with 110 visitors in the three hours the festival is open. "an enormous number of people arrived within the first half hour, makin us very busy writing up cakes and typing them into the system, but there is still room for many more cakes and guests", Ann-Louise says happily.

Cake Festival cares about everyone

It is not surprising that Ann-Louise and the team behind her are pleased. It looks like they really hit an interest with width and consideration for the minority. KælderCaféen, which is primarily used for social events featuring alcohol is filled with whipped cream and sugar in myriad forms on this particular day. This creates the gathering place for sugar craving fans. 32 different creations were baked and brought on November 9th, and to wash it all down, regular old H2O.

The Cake Festival i always placed in spring and fall. The next Cake Festival will be in March/April 2014. All cakes are designated by name and a sign listing the ingredients of the cake. This is partly to allow for easy tallying of the votes but also so those with allergies can join in without getting sick.

The South Jutlandic cake table

7 hard, 7 soft. That is what a real South Jutlandic cake table is made of. It was exactly this tradition that Ann-Louise brought to Nybrogård Kollegiet and organized a cake table for friends and the hallway. "There was a high demand for cake in the hallway. That is why we organized a cake table for the hallway including

friends. Since it was such a success, I thought why not expand it to the whole dormitory?" A cake meeting was held at the dormitory, where many came and ate cake and participated. 8 people joined (5 are left now, Maria, Maria, Jakob, Esbern and Ann-Louise) and became the team behind the Cake Festival that many have enjoyed in spring and fall these two past years.

Capacity

The concept will probably be the same next year, but then again why change it, when the team behind it has found something that works? Ann-Louise adds "Water Is served, but if guests wish to drink tea or coffee, they are welcome to bring some themselves, since we are not capable of handling coffee and tea. We are interested in gaining more people on the team to tackle jobs, but also to bring new ideas. It is generally a small work load. We take action a month before the festival, so it is not very demanding.

The Cake Festival is about real contact

The Cake Festival actually has a facebook page, but with only 62 likes on the page compared to the 110 visitors on the day, we can conclude that the festival already has quite a collection of local fans. It also shows that a social gathering that does not include alcohol or partying has wide local interest for many residents of the dormitory. "We see many residents bringing their friends and family. It is so enjoyable", Ann-Louise tells, hoping the tendency will continue.

Chocolate money

It costs DKK 20 to enter for those that do not bring a cake. This means that the festival is practically self-financed. "Any profit is put into the next Cake Festival. Posters, silverware and prizes for the winners of our cake contests. The money was originally intended to finance extra cakes to make sure there were enough, but we have not done this yet, and it does not really seem to be necessary, since there has been plenty for everyone." Ann-Louise tells.

My name is Nanna D. Thomsen, I study nutrition and health and have resided in the dorm for about a year. Recently I took over the position as chairman of the garden group.

Furthermore I have a passion for food and raw goods from nature. From this passion comes the idea for this column.

Hope you will enjoy this column.

When I want to relax, it probably will not surprise anyone that I often end up in the kitchen. I enjoy spending time making food from scratch with good ingredients. The food column this month is a result of a good Sunday in the kitchen which ended with homemade pasta.

The pasta can be made with different fillings. I have given to suggestions, but as always, the sky is the limit. I hope you will try the recipe. It is definitely worth spending time on.

Pasta for two

- 100g wheat flour
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tbsp. olive oil
- 1/4 tsp salt

Mix the salt into the flour before placing it in a pile on the table. Make a depression in the flour where oil and the egg can be poured into. Mix it gently and kneed the dough for 10 minutes. Let the dough rest for an hour. While the dough is resting, you can prepare the filling. Roll the dough into a very thin layer—with a pasta machine if you have one—and use a glass with a diameter of around 7cm to punch out circles.

Put 1/2 tsp. Filling onto each dough circle and fold the dough over the middle, across the filling. Dabbing a little water on the dough around the edges before closing it may help. When the dough is closed, press the edges together with a fork.

Let the pasta dry for around 30 minutes before boiling them for 4-5 minutes.

Pumpkin filling for 1 portion of pasta dough

- 100g pumpkin pulp
- 30g ricotta cheese
- 20g parmesan cheese
- 50g almonds
- 1 clove of garlic
- 1/4 onion
- Olive oil
- Salt and pepper

Cut the pumpkin into small cubes and roast them on a skillet in oil for 4-5 minutes. Chop almonds, onion and garlic and roast it together with the pumpkin. Let the mixture cool off before mising it with ricotta and shredded parmesan cheese. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Spinach filling for 1 portion of pasta dough

- 120g fresh spinach
- 80g ricotta cheese
- 2 tbsp. parmesan cheese
- 1 tsp. herbs e.g. mint or parsley
- Salt and pepper

Rinse the spinach and boil it lightly in a pot with a bit of water. Squeeze out the water and chop the spinach finely. Let the spinach cool before mixing it with ricotta shredded parmesan cheese and herbs. Add salt and pepper to taste.
