Cleaning of the ventilation shafts

Cleaning of the ventilation shafts will soon start. This is being done to create a better indoor environment with a lower risk of fungus development. This type of work can get pretty dirty, so KAB has sent out return envelopes to everyone in order to find out if they will be home on the day of the cleaning. This gives the residents the option of having the cleaning done from the inside, which will allow workers to mask off, preventing the dirt from spreading inside.

If can not be home and do not wish to lend your key to KAB, the clean-

ing can also be done from the outside, but it will not be possible to mask off, and it will take longer to clean up afterwards.

Remember that even if you are home all day on the day of the cleaning, you still need to return the envelope, so the workers do not have to check whether everyone is home.

The editorial staff sincerely hopes that everything works out without any noteworthy problems and that no one ends up with a big clean up because they forgot to return the envelope.

Re 1) Jonas D59 is chosen as moderator and Danish is chosen as the language for the meeting.

Re 2) 9 voting members are present.

Re 3) Minutes of the last residents' council meeting approved

Correction to item 5: Only DKK 2900 has been granted to the football clubs.

Correction to item 9: Thomas B64 is representative for AB-even and Line B57 is representative for AB-odd.

Was not discussed at the meeting since the treasurer had cancelled

Re 6) Announcements

Nobody wants to sponsor the athletics field, so if anyone has suggestions for action, they are welcome to contact Camilla L01.

A portion of the residents are interested in cleaning up the basements, and any others interested should contact Mikkel J21. The chair room will not be cleaned out. A warning will be sent out before any of this work begins, so residents will have a chance to remove their belongings from the basements.

Re 7) Board meeting

A board meeting was held on Wednesday December 5th, 2012.

Alexander was appointed as chairman, Jakob as deputy chairman.

The lease agreement has been reviewed with the intention of limiting the allowed number of residents of one room to one. Apartments are not affected by this, since there can be children present.

New criteria for applying to the dorm have been discussed, with the intention of preventing a high number of residents from moving out, since this problem involves high administrative expenses and affects the social life in the hallways.

The revision protocol has been approved.

The financial report has been approved. There are errors, but they will be corrected, and will not affect the rent payments.

The old method of calculating heating and electricity utilities has been reconsidered, since the new method probably is not cost-effective.

An error in the study control has resulted in many residents not being approved. The problem will be looked into, and a solution will be found.

Cleaning out the basements will be discussed within the board.

Re 8A) User account for printing on the computers in the Secretariat. KælderCaféen would like a user account for the computers in the Secretariat. They need to print various material for KælderCaféen once in a while, and the obvious place to do that from would be the Secretariat, as opposed to now where it is being done primarily at DTU. It involves no more than 10 pages color print per month.

Two members of KælderCaféen currently have access to the Secretariat, which means no extra keys are currently necessary. The common printer in the GH-basement, outside the Secretariat, is not functioning properly. It might be possible to use the Secretariat's printer during office hours, to avoid unauthorized persons having access to confidential information.

A temporary solution can be proposed until the other printer in the GH-basement is functioning properly again. A notice will be posted on nybro's web page when the printer is working again.

Thea D43 has been given permission to print on the Secretariat's printer until the other printer works again.

Re 8B) KælderCaféen's financial report 4th quarter and annual report.

See appendix sent out with the notice.

For the period October 1st, 2012 – December 31st, 2012, there has been recorded income of DKK 57,947.20 and expenses of DKK 63,375.24, with a result of DKK -5,428.04.

A balance of DKK 10,399.65 – the goal is to have a balance of around DKK 20,000.

Re 8C) DKK 200 expense for postage. In connection with the many grant applications Camilla L01 has sent out to raise money for the athletics field, she has had expenses of DKK 200 for postage, which she would like to be compensated for.

Unanimously approved. Camilla will receive compensation.

Re 8D) New jerseys for FC Nybro. The men's team is applying for around DKK 9000 for new shorts and jerseys as replacements for the pink-colored ones. The best deal will be sought out.

A vote has been held within the football team to buy new jerseys in a different color. The team has also advanced to first division, and would like some new, nicer jerseys.

A budget is not presented, but it is expected to cost less than DKK 9000.

It is two years since last time new jerseys were bought and there are still many jerseys left. It is just because of the color, new ones are wanted.

No color has been determined yet.

This problem will be a recurring one, since someone will always be dissatisfied. Limits on how often new colors can be chosen could be imposed.

A proposal to let someone at the dorm sew the new jerseys is made, but this will most likely not be cost-effective and it will be difficult to find anyone willing to spend so much time on it.

Abstain: 6

Of the abstaining and votes against, 7 were decided because the reason for changing the jerseys was only to change the color.

The proposal is declined.

Re 8E) New storage room for the girls' football team. Items had started disappearing from the old storage room, prompting the application for a locked room, where the equipment can be stored.

At the moment the equipment is stored in the manager's apartment

A proposal to change the lock is made, since the current one is broken.

There are many storage rooms available, though they need restoration. The football teams can each get their own room.

Lars Kaj will be asked for a new lock and a new storage room.

Re 8F) The Complaints Committee's complaint about KælderCaféen. KælderCaféen has received a complaint from a resident, as a result of excessive noise and the behavior of persons leaving KælderCaféen. This complaint and KælderCaféen's role in it is urged to be taken up for discussion (the e-mail is sent to all residents' council representatives).

The subject of the exam periods has been discussed many times and there has been plenty of possibilities to engage in this discussion, so this will not be brought up again.

In the e-mail, guards are proposed to stand outside KælderCaféen to avoid people being noisy and disturbing residents of the JK block.

There is a complaints telephone in KælderCaféen, but the bartenders are not good at picking up – this can be accounted to them being busy, and having a hard time hearing the telephone. A mobile phone has been proposed, but this has not been approved yet. A light could be installed in the bar that would blink while the telephone rings.

When KælderCaféen closes, a bartender exits the bar along with the guests and tries to get people to move away from KælderCaféen. During a night, a bartender will also regularly go outside and check out the situation. It is proposed that bartenders increase the frequency of these situation checks.

The mail is only forwarded to inform the residents of the dormitory that they are not all equally good at respecting sleeping residents when they are leaving KælderCaféen.

The music volume has been raised so much that the telephone is not audible, and it is proposed that the volume be lowered again.

Residents are urged to go down to KælderCaféen to alert them of the problem while it happens, so something can be done immediately.

The bar exists to contain the party and avoid parties all over the dormitory.

The primary problem is outdoors.

A proposal to build a smoking lounge in KælderCaféen, but it is too expensive to be plausible.

We must take into account that everyone in KælderCaféen is a volunteer, and it is not necessarily their responsibility to take care of drunk people that can not control themselves on their way home from a party. It is however KælderCaféen's responsibility to avoid police involvement.

A 'default' reply to complaints regarding KælderCaféen is proposed, where information is given on how the inconvenienced resident can act to improve the situation themselves. The complaint will of course still be treated as before.

This complaint will also be discussed at the next bartender meeting.

Re 8G) Information regarding the newly established sports association at Nybrogård Kollegiet. Nybrogård-kollegiet's sports association has been established, which at the moment includes the two football teams. This gives them the opportunity to use fields outside the dormitory.

Re 8H) New key person

Thomas C22 leaves his post and Troels C18 takes over as the only applicant. He is planning to stay at the dormitory for at least 3 years and is often at the dormitory. He is studying electronics at DTU.

Re 9) New members and alternates

Mikkel K43 no longer represents JK-odd because of absence.

Jakob R52 leaves and Emine takes over as representative for the CDG-apartments.

Re 10) Other

An indoor place is wanted, where it is possible to place items/furniture, e.g. a basement, so it can be given away to other people who might need it. Usually the good furniture is sorted and given to international students that need e.g. a bed. A large part of the waste is thrown away because it is unfit for use. If a basement room is to be used, there must be appointed a person responsible for it. Allwin D66 will discuss cleaning the basements with Mikkel.

It is not alright to have doormats, shoes, etc. outside the doors. This is a problem for the cleaning personnel.

A new soap is wanted for the floor washing machine, because it smells really bad.

Unused room in the CD basement is proposed renovated to build a lounge with couches, games, foosball, etc. There will be no music, beer, etc. allowed in the room. It should be a place where residents can relax and is only for residents of the dormitory. A lock should be placed on the door. Fire hazards should be considered in the room. The room is often used for table tennis, but this can possibly be moved. Work in progress.

The board would like to attend a residents' council meeting on Monday, April 8th, 2013.

The web page will be rewritten to accommodate easier access to information about subletting.

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

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Radiomarken's Future

If you were to accentuate something that makes Nybrogård Kollegiet completely special, you would most likely have to mention the beautiful, natural surroundings we enjoy. The surrounding areas have been protected for many years in an attempt to preserve them as they once were.

Exactly that protection now seems to be cause for changes to those same areas. Gladsaxe municipality has initiated a care plan recommended by the forest- and environmental protection agency (Skov- og Naturstyrelsen), which seeks to restore the area to the state at which it was when the protection was enacted back in 1993.

But what does that entail? And how will it affect us at the dormitory? We will attempt to outline this for you below. Nothing has been finally decided yet, and that should be taken into consideration when reading the outline below.

One of the biggest items on the care plan is to ensure a better animal and plant life at Radiomarken. A big concern is brooding birds that build nests in the tall grass over the summer. During previous years, this grass has been mowed with machinery – a method that will be replaced by putting grazing animals on the land instead.

This solution obviously requires a fence to keep the animals inside Radiomarken. The current plan is to build two enclosures – one at the south end and one at the north end (facing the dormitory). These enclosures are separated by a path, as indicated by the picture to the right. Gates will be placed along the fences to grant access to the enclosures from all sides and corners. These gates are intended to automatically close, to keep the animals from suddenly turning up outside the enclosures.

First off, the plan was that the animals should consist of a herd of cows, but after several complaints from various stakeholders, the plan now dictates sheep instead. 15-25 sheep are expected to graze at Radio-

marken. They will usually be split up in the two enclosures, with most of them in the larger one to the north. On special occasions e.g. role playing days, they will attempt to move all of the sheep to the southern enclosure.

As the rules are today, dogs must be on a leash when they are walked at Radiomarken. The plan is to allow the dogs to be inside the enclosures with the sheep, but that they must still be kept on a leash. This rule will hopefully be followed, so possible unlucky situations between dogs and the enclosed sheep can be avoided.


Besides these larger points, a portion of the vegetation will also be removed, because it was much more sparse back in 1993. The enclosures will also be built to look as natural as possible, which means that it will not be an ugly industrial fence or something that will similarly destroy the harmony.

There has been one formal and processed complaint, as well as several strongly critical remarks to the plans that have been laid so far. The last hearing is over and now all we can do is wait for a final decision from the traffic- and technical committee.

The complaints have generally been concerned with the size of the enclosures and the limits they impose on the public's access to the area, which according to the original protection act, must not become limited. The protection should ensure the accessibility, which some feel that these plans oppose.

Several parties have proposed that the northern enclosure should be made smaller by stopping near the yellow mark. This would ensure an open area for easier use in most instances at the current time such as role playing and scout activities.

A Question of Money

The political movements of the day are, with few notable exceptions, largely irrelevant for the operation of the dormitory and the residents' daily lives. We have our own internal events and problems, that are represented as widely as possible in NybroTidende, which does not leave much room for subjects of a political nature. What the current government is planning simply does not deserve a column here; except maybe in one specific area. 'SU', The state-funded student financial aid program.

The question of SU is able to transcend, if you will, politics and the specific politicians, that wish to reorganize it, since SU, for many students in this country, is the essential source of income, and likely so for many students here at the dormitory. This article will not be chastizing or glorifying the current government, because that would make the question of SU political, instead of dealing with the specific problems that arise for the individual student here at the dorm.

Politics have indeed already left its mark on the dormitory in regards to the solar heating system, since the current government wished to change the metering scheme. On the surface, SU and the metering scheme do not have much in common, besides the economic factor for the residents. But this is also where otherwise purely political questions become relevant for us. For these same reasons, only the economic aspects of the political issue will be covered here.

And now, to the core of the issue: What consequences will the government's latest proposals bring to all current or future students? Eight proposals have been submitted, some of which will become effective in July 2014 and 2015, and others in July 2016. A new education should be regarded as a secondary education, bachelor or master's degree. If you are already enrolled in one of these, the new rules will not affect SU for your current education.



1. If the student, after qualifying exams (high school or equivalent), spends more than two years before beginning a higher education, the student will only receive SU in accordance with the rated time for that education. So if a given education lasts three years, you will only receive SU for three years. If you need more money for your education than this, you can apply for a student loan for this purpose. This proposal will become effective in July 2014, but if you have a qualifying exam from 2011 or earlier, you can still begin a higher education under the current rules.
2. In accordance with the current rules, the SU payments stop if you have not attended any exams for 12 months. From July 2016, this will be reduced to 6 months. The criteria for inactivity is based on accumulation of ECTS points compared to the rated time for an education. From July 2014 it will also not be possible to enroll in a course without signing up for the course exam. For the same reason, it will not be possible to cancel an exam, since it will count as an attempt. It will be possible to apply for exemption under "special circumstances".
3. Qualification rules will be changed, making it easier to use credited courses, though this has no direct impact on SU. These rules will become effective in July 2014.
4. The universities will receive smaller or larger financial aid, based on to which degree the students are able to complete an education within the rated time period. This proposal will not become effective before 2020.
5. Today, it is possible to receive unlimited SU for supplemental courses (GSK), but from July 2014, it will only be possible to receive SU for the so called 'turbo courses', and it will no longer be possible to receive SU for single classes at a high school or equivalency program if you have already finished a high school equivalent education.
6. From July 1st, 2015 there will be a limit to the number of educations you can begin and complete with SU – the limit is set to five.
7. SU will be changed for students living with their parents and adjusted according to their parents' income. For obvious reasons this will not be relevant for the residents at Nybrogård. These rules are effective from July 2015.
8. SU aid amount will rise according to current rules at a rate that is faster than other public benefit programs, but from the period 2016-2023, this will no longer be the case. In stead, the amount will be adjusted, so it ends up at the same growth rate as other public benefit programs.

Since it is best practice, academically, to provide a list of sources for any research, I will append a link from FIVU (ministry of research, innovation and higher educations) for those who may be interested. Note that the source is politically biased:

what he, himself, meant were bad shots.


In the other room, the duo consisting of Kasper and Thomas won the foosball tournament.

NybroTidende food column: Enjoy the food!

This month:

Chicken curry



About me

My name is Nanna D. Thomsen, I study nutrition and health and have resided in the dorm for about a year. Recently I took over the position as chairman of the garden group.

Furthermore I have a passion for food and raw goods from nature. From this passion comes the idea for this column.

Hope you will enjoy this column.

There is nothing like a good dinner club at the dormitory, and I will strike a blow for exactly that in this month's column. It does require a bit more effort to cook for 10-15 people as opposed to 1, but all in all I think it pays off. Something happens when you share a meal with people that you care about and live closely with. This month's dish was developed in a really cozy dinner club, that was impulsively established on a Sunday afternoon. The original recipe is from the internet, but as always, I have adjusted it a little.

Ingredients for 4 people

- 3 onions
- Whole peppercorns
- 1 tsp. Ginger
- 4 cloves of garlic
- 2 tbsp. Tomato paste
- 2 tbsp. Curry powder
- 1 stick of cinnamon
- 1 red chili (dried)
- 1 can of coconut milk (1 large or 2 small cans of unsweetened coconut)
- 2 dl chicken stock (from the boiled chicken)
- 4 tomatoes (chopped)
- 1 whole chicken
- ¼ dl fresh cilantro
- 1 lemon (the juice)
- 3 tbsp. Oil
- Salt and pepper (freshly ground)
- Mint leaves or cilantro (to top off the dish)

Precedure

Boil the chicken together with the whole peppercorns and one onion (which has just been split in halves).

When the chicken is done, it is deboned (remember to keep the water that it was boiled in).

Chop onions, garlic and ginger finely and fry it lightly until golden.

Add tomato paste, curry, cinnamon and chili, then stir. Add salt and pepper to taste and then pour the coconut milk and chicken stock, while letting the pot boil. Let it simmer for around 20 minutes or until the consistency thickens.

Tomatoes, chicken pieces and cilantro, as well as half of the lemon juice is added. Let it boil for 10-15 minutes.

Add lemon juice, salt and pepper to taste, garnish with mint and cilantro and serve hot.

Served with rice and maybe a piece of good bread.

Hint:

If you have plenty of time, the dish only gets better by coking a little longer.

Django Unchained - There is Nothing New Under the Sun

I do not usually use Bible quotes in my film reviews, since it pertains more to my theologian background – and for those of us whose acquaintance with The Old Testament is a bit rusty, it can be mentioned that the quote is from The Book of Ecclesiastes – although it certainly fits well in context, and if you are acquainted with Quentin Tarantino's filmography and style, my intent with the quote may also be very clear.

I had the pleasure of watching Django Unchained with a good friend shortly after the Danish premiere, and our expectations were sky high, as a result of Tarantino's previous classics such as Kill Bill, Pulp Fiction and Reservoir Dogs. That may also be the reason our expectations were far from met this time around.

Shortly told, the film centers around a slave named Django (Jamie Foxx), who is freed and later takes an apprenticeship as a bounty hunter with Dr. King Schultz (Christopher Waltz), a former dentist from Germany. Django searches for his wife (Kerry

Washington), who lives at a cotton plantation in Mississippi, controlled with an iron fist by its owner (Leonardo DiCaprio), but much of the film also tells about how Django and Schultz track down criminals and capture them dead or alive. In that regard, I will not be telling too much if I say that it usually ends in violently bloody deaths, since anything else would be completely unlike Tarantino.

And therein may well lay the problem with the film that, in itself, is definitely not poorly made. Many of the elements have been seen before: You will already know the general plot outline of the film, if you, for example, have seen Kill Bill. Tarantino's fondness of mixing B-movie elements with a professionally executed aesthetic blood orgy brings nothing new to the audience. Although that does not matter much if you judge the film purely on entertainment value – because it is surely entertaining. The scenography is exquisite as always, and it is a pleasure watching Django and Schultz in action as hard boiled bounty hunters.

Tarantino does bring something new to the table with his latest film, though,

since Django is his first actual western, and the film is chronologically linear, contrary to most of his other films, which consist of small stories that make up the plot together – most notably as seen in Pulp Fiction. But Tarantino has also searched for inspiration in westerns for some of his other films, so the approach may be new, but the method remains the same. I give the film 3 out of 6 stars. Not giving it more than that is based on my unmet expectations of more innovation from Tarantino. The film is still worth watching for the pure entertainment value, though there really is nothing new under the sun this time.
