Minutes of Residents' Council Meeting

Monday, April 8th, 2013 in the GH-basement

Re 1) Mikkel J21 is chosen as moderator and English is chosen as the language for the meeting.

Re 2) 14 voting members are present.

Re 3) Minutes of the last residents' council meeting approved

Correction to corection of minutes for the previous meeting: it was JK-even, not KL-odd

Re 4) Agenda approved

Re 5) Economy

NYK's account holds DKK 121,334.07 and the network account holds DKK 218,756.41.

DKK 227.45 has been paid to the Cake Festival, DKK 200 to Camilla L-01 for expenses in connection with grant applications for the athletics field, and DKK 9,369 to the Canoe Club. DKK 1200 has been paid in salaries in March.

Re 6) Announcements

At the last meeting, it was noted that the rooms in the basements were not insured, but it turns out that everything is insured.

The new garbage bins have been received for sorting of garbage.

Re 7) Board meeting

There is no agenda yet for the next board meeting.

Re 8A) Items for discussion proposed by the board

1. What needs to be renovated?

-Work is being done on ventilation, kitchen exhaust, doors as well as others around the dormitory. A report will soon be released on this.

-Ventilation of the kitchens is proposed renovated – possibly with a switch that can turn it on and off as needed.

-New doors, especially in the kitchens, that have better insulation to stop sound travelling through them.

-Move the space heaters in the kitchen, which are currently placed above the windows where their efficiency is questionable.

-Break down the wall between kitchens to create one big kitchen. This is a load bearing wall, and will be very expensive to do.

-Better insulation in the kitchens, so they are not so cold during the winters.

-New table benches outside.

-New heaters in the apartments to replace the old ones that no longer function.

-The bicycle sheds do not contain enough room for everyone's bicycles, but we are not allowed to build more bicycle sheds with roofs. The tiles in the sheds are also in bad shape, and could be replaced.

2. Which new initiatives/arrangements could benefit the residents and the dormitory's cohesiveness.

-There are plans to use the CD-basement as a social room with sofas, games, etc. A paper with ideas for furniture, etc. has been handed out to the residents' council representatives – e-mails can be sent to Thomas C22 with ideas for what to put in the room.

-Fireplaces are proposed but there are rules from the municipality that need to be respected. There are also parts of the year when fires are not allowed. This should be taken up at the next meeting.

-It is proposed that the kiosk could be closed down and converted to a lounge with tables and sofas. The kiosk

can not just be closed, since there is a contract. It can be a future goal, but it takes time.

-More events and activities for the residents that do not revolve around partying.

3. How would the above be prioritized against the lowest possible rent?

-Everything costs money, so it will not be possible to get it all with the rent that we have now. Would it be alright to raise the rent a little if it means that more of these things can be done?

-Most of the above proposals to improve the dormitory can be done without raising the rent. Nybrogrd Kollegiet already has a very low rent compared to other dormitories, so there is a consensus for paying a little more to gain more social activities and better facilities.

4. The composition of residents (short/long term residencies, Danes/foreigners, academic/shorter studies) and their influence on the study environment?

-There are many more living at the dormitory for shorter periods than there have been before.

-It is proposed that foreign students from the same countries are spread out to create a better distribution. That also goes for the distribution of residents with academic and shorter studies. There are also many high school students who are still young and attached to home and therefore not very social at the dormitory.

-There could be a little text field on the application where an applicant could write whether or not they were planning to participate actively at the dormitory. This could make it easier to differentiate and hopefully bring more social people to the dormitory. Of course, special consideration will still be given to an applicant who has no place to live.

-It is necessary to reach out to the residents of the dormitory who are not as social – Danes and foreigners.

-Info meetings could be resumed to make it easier to get into the

dormitory and become active in the clubs, etc. -If the number of exchange students should be higher, it is proposed that some sort of check be in place, to determine whether they wish to be social or not, to reduce the number of ghosts in the hallways.

-Exchange students and residents on different educational paths create a good dynamic balance in the hallways.

-If we wish to adopt a motivated applications system to the dormitory, the municipality, the board and the dormitory must agree on this. It may discourage some people from applying – especially exchange students. An exception could be made for exchange students to maintain a good balance of exchange students and Danish students at the dormitory.

-A better distribution of residents on short and long educations is proposed to prevent hallways where everybody is always moving out.

-Dinner clubs also often alleviate some of the problems with inactive residents.

Re 8B) Establishment of a dog club at Nybrogård Kollegiet

There are gradually coming more and more dog owners to the dormitory, which is why Malene M06 and Line M01 wish to establish a dog club. The purpose of the club is to create the possibility for the members to share the experience of owning a dog. Take communal walks, and perhaps in the long term, have dog trainers visit the dormitory, purchase toys and training equipment for agility and the like. There will not be any need for a 'club room', but at some point maybe a small room for storage.

There is a positive attitude towards the club being established. If there is going to be an agility course, it should be a permanent facility at the dormitory. One of the grass areas can be used to set up the agility course when needed. A requirement for the minimum number of members could be set before any funding can be applied for. Some residents are against a dog club, since this may attract more residents with dogs, which some residents do not want. This dormitory is one of the only dormitories in the vicinity of DTU that allows pets. Most

dog owners live in apartments and this makes it possible to do something good for the apartment residents. It will also be possible for dog owners to help each other take care of their dogs if necessary.

Re 8C) FC Nybro is applying for DKK 6,072 for the 2013 season

FC Nybro is applying for funds to cover tournament participation fees for both the men's and women's teams in the dormitory tournament, including referee fees. A smaller amount is wanted for ice spray and tape. See appendix to the notice.

A proposal is made to establish a membership fee beside the DKK 125 per semester which are for ice spray and tape among other things. There has not yet been a decision on what to use the current fee for, since the club is still organizing itself. It is not possible to apply to the municipality for funding. A proposal is made to decide what the current fee will be used for before the next residents' council meeting. It is proposed that the whole item is moved to the next meeting until it has been decided what the current fee will be used for, but if this item is not approved, the team will not be able to play matches for the time being.

The moderator is Jonas D59

Presentation of the institution's budget for the coming operational year

The dormitory's board, together with KAB, has prepared a draft for the dormitory's budget for the period August 1st, 2013 to July 31st, 2014. The budget must be presented to the residents before it can be approved by the board and this will happen at an extraordinary general assembly on April 22nd, 2013 at 19:00 in the GH-basement. The budget will then be processed in the dormitory's board.

Note: The released budget is thorough and clear – this should be mentioned to the board.

Increased rent

A more or less substantial increase will not be avoidable.

DKK 88 for single rooms

DKK 186 for double rooms

Discussion of individual entries:

The increase is due to the addition of another man to the team (the gardener).

The electricity consumption varies greatly.

Specific questions can be directed to Flemming Bøgebjerg at fbh@kab-bolig.dk

Proposals to decrease this entry:

Campaign on consumption.

Reprint of article in NybroTidende by ecoists – Jonas is taking care of it.

Energy-saving competition.

Graph on page 4 expands on this.

The graph extends until 2023

Note the variation in the curve over the yearly profits towards 2023. This is because work will be done renewing kitchens and replacing refrigerators during the years.

A proposal is made to possibly stall the renovation of the dormitory:

Opinions:

Maintenance is important because it attracts new residents and holds on to the current ones.

It will lead to energy savings in the long run.

Replacement of electrical installations in KældersCaféen (DKK 125,000)

This is noted as an expensive entry.

The budget was created based on a current quote.

Lars Kaj points out that they will get more quotes on this work. This entry can change.

Whether this entry is fixed is up to the board.

TV channels and packages

The budget says 88+ TV-packages:

Scepticism over the current package.

Talk about removing TV2.

NB: It is the responsibility of the residents to decide which channels they want. A list of channels can be obtained from YouSee, which will be looked at by Nikoaj G-4. This will not have an effect on the rent before next year.

The janitor's building needs window replacements (DKK 194,000)

Lars Kaj explains that these must be replaced.

Will the rent for the janitor's building increase?

If the employees' salary increases, so does Lars Kaj's rent. This is not happening.

Very expensive administration.

Dissatisfaction is shown towards KAB's administrative work.

NB: To the board:

Is it possible to cut down on the costs of administration by KAB? Possibly limit the costs by reducing the tenant turnover.

This will be discussed at the board meeting Wednesday, April 24th.

Expenses on the telephone entry need to be added.

KældersCaféen has received a telephone.

Refinancing of loan.

Where does the large reduction come from?

NB: This will be discussed at the board meeting.

DKK 40,000 each year to be used by the residents' council.

The money is being appropriated so far.

This could be used for paying interest on loans, since that could reduce the rent in the long term.

NB: Should the money be used by this council for operational expenses? This should be checked and brought to the board – what are the rules?

Lars Kaj will replace all light bulbs with LEDs.

He is making calculations from readings from LM and AB.

Better and cheaper.

DKK 1 million to be saved per room by using LEDs in the rooms – provided it is communal.

NB: Jakob will take this up at the board meeting.

Another Cake Festival—another success!

The Cake Festival is no longer just a one hit wonder, but is rather on its way to becoming a tradition here at Nybrogård Kollegiet. The people behind this sugar rich festival have been persistent in their wish for a cake festival from the beginning, and that means that on Saturday, April 20th, the third event of its kind was held—and once again using Kælders-Caféen's facilities.

The doors opened at 14:00, at which point the tables were quickly filled with cake after cake. A total of 31 cakes participated in the festival and competed for this year's three prestigious awards.

The awards this time consisted of "The most creative", "Marilyn Monroe" (most beautiful) and "The mother cake" (best tasting). The winners of each category are shown in the column to the right. Ann-Louise was awarded with a gift certificate to Specialkøbmanden, Lærke and Pernille received a gift certificate to La Glace and Jakob and Marie received a gift certificate to Fru Hurup in Lyngby.

The winners were as a new twist decided by a vote from everyone present. Where previously, there had been judges to decide the winners, this time, the audience's favorites were quite simply the winners. Congratulations to the winners.

As always, people could also participate without a cake. For the small fee of DKK 20, you would be admitted to participate in the actual cake eating—perhaps the most enjoyable discipline for many. That meant the total participant count reached 69. So even though there were two bakers behind several of the cakes, there were obviously some who took advantage of this offer!

As always, a great deal was done to ensure that everyone could participate, meaning that also this year, the bakers were required to list the ingredients of their cakes. This ensured that diabetics or people with other allergies could participate safely.

Everything ended at 17:00 after three hours of sweets. Rarely is so much sugar and sweet stuff gathered in one place, and naturally not all of the cake was eaten during those three hours.

**Cold buttermilk
 with cookie rusks**



About me

My name is Nanna D. Thomsen, I study nutrition and health and have resided in the dorm for about a year. Recently I took over the position as chairman of the garden group.

Furthermore I have a passion for food and raw goods from nature. From this passion comes the idea for this column.

Hope you will enjoy this column.

The last few days have been really nice, and it has been easy to recognize spring and begin looking forward to summer. With summer comes a whole series of summer dishes. A special dish that brings back many memories of summer is cold buttermilk soup. It is produced in all shapes and sizes and are sold in large quantities in super markets.

I have never really been into the packaged buttermilk soup and choose to make it myself. The most fantastic thing about it is that not many ingredients are needed, and it is super easy to make.

And that is why this month's recipe is for homemade cold buttermilk soup with cookie rusks.

Cold buttermilk soup

Ingredients:

- 2/3 old fashioned buttermilk
- 1/3 cultured milk
- Vanilla
- Sugar
- Some shredded organic lemon peel

Mix the buttermilk with the cultured milk and add sugar and vanilla to taste. You can also add some shredded lemon peel according to taste.

Remember to buy the old fashioned buttermilk, since the regular kind is actually just cultured skimmed milk and therefore has a very sour taste. The old fashioned buttermilk is a by-product of butter production and has a rounder and milder taste.

Cookie rusks

Ingredients:

- 125 g. cold butter
- 250 g. wheat flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. cardemum
- 50 g. sugar
- 1/2 eggs
- 1/2 milk

Set the oven for 175 Celcius. Cut the butter in pieces and crumble it into the flour. Mix in the baking powder, cardemum and sugar. Bind the dough with eggs and milk. Roll the dough into two rolls and cut each of them in 25 pieces. Roll the pieces into balls and place them on the oven plate. Bake the balls for around 15 minutes in the middle of the oven. Take the plate out and let them cool for 5 minutes. Set the oven for 140 Celsius. Split the balls horizontally and place the tops and bottom cookies on the plate with the cut side facing up. Dry the cookies on the plate for around 30 minutes.

You can also spice up the recipes you like—for example by blending various berries into the buttermilk soup or serving it with honey roasted oats. The cookie rusks can also contain orange peel, vanilla or cinnamon according to your taste. As always, the sky is the limit.

Have fun and bon appetit

This month, we will take a look at Oblivion, an action film starring Tom Cruise and Morgan Freeman in two of the lead roles.

Science fiction is the new black in the world of film. Not that it has not already existed for many years, but this summer's selection will be dripping science fiction. The Hunger Games 2, Iron Man 3, Elysium, Man of Steel, Pacific Rim and After Earth to name a small, interesting selection. Oblivion will be the first of the series and you must admit it is looking good.
