News from the residents' council

April 22 was the residents' council's first meeting of 2015. Several points were discussed regarding the budget and insurance decisions, but there was another point that would affect the residents' day to day life in a more direct way.

Before we move on, we will start with a recap of the budget. The budget is at a balance, and there will be no raise in rent this august. There will, however, be some changes to the price of TV-packages. The new prices will be announced on our webpage as soon as possible, and will come into effect August 1st.

The residents' council has previously initiated new projects regarding ventilation of the dorm rooms, apartments, and the kitchens (Exhaust hood). Attempts to improve the climate in the dorm rooms have been made by installing moisture controlled fans. The fans do not seem to have solved the problem completely, and when you include the fact that one installation costs DKK 3.000, totalling at approximately 1,6 million, it is clear why the residents' council are not very interesting in continuing with the in-

stallations. It is, however, the residents who decide, as long as they express that there is great interest in the project. This should be done through the residents' council. Such an expense will affect rent.

Another point that was discussed regarded the kitchens. There has been some experimentation focused on installing more powerful motors to drive the exhaust hoods, starting with the NO-block. The motors had been programmed to run at specific intervals every morning and evening. The feedback has been very positive. Suction has improved, while having it run at intervals has prevented it from drawing all the heat out of the room.

An installation such as this, is estimated at costing DKK 5.000. With only nine blocks, it would total at about DKK 45.000. Because of this, it is likely that the solution will be implemented relatively soon, mostly because of the fact that the money have already been set aside.

The apartments have also had exhaust hoods installed. These function by having the air pass through a filter, after which it is

led back into the room. This has resulted in very negative feedback, since it lets all the moisture remain within the apartment. Improving these exhaust hoods have therefore been a priority, and solutions such as installing conventional exhaust hoods are being looked into.

The residents' council has also, on behalf of the complaints committee and the residents' representatives, discussed ways of solving problems regarding late payments to the kitchens. Several solutions have been suggested, though a decision as to which solution should be enforced has not been decided. One of the solutions suggested that the person who is late on his/her payments should have their internet disconnected. The solution being looked into by KAB's legal department. KAB has offered to include kitchen payments as rent. The money would then have to be given back to the one in charge of managing the kitchen payments. Implementing the solution would ensure that there are no late payments, but do require more work hours because of the administration needed. This will be discussed by the residents' council. */Jakob, S62*

A colourful dormitory 2:2

Last month we gave advice and guidance as to which plants and flowers could thrive on the kitchen terrace. This month we will be focusing on the rooftop terrace.



The rooftop terrace is, in spite of the overhang, a very open area, and the temperature on the terrace can become uncomfortably hot during the summer period.

What should we plant on the terrace?

Is this where we can grow our edibles? The answer is yes! Tomatoes, cucumbers, lemon trees, herbs, almost anything could thrive here. Whether or not the plants will thrive, depends on one thing: WATER! The limiting factor when it comes to choosing what to plant isn't the heat or the sun. What limits you, is what you want to plant, and who is going to water these plants?

Self watering planters

Self watering planters are the best way to ensure that your plants are well looked after. Aldershvile plant school have a self

watering system called Pindstrup Maxikap, which has a capillary effect. This works by having Sphagnum peat (plant soil) in the lid's three containers. The capillary effect will then ensure that the soil draws water the container below. A planter bag lies on top of the system, and holes are cut into the bag where the three plant soil containers are located.



Citrus fruits

Lemon trees and other citrus trees have the potential to become a source of fruits. They are also very decorative and exotic, and are said to thrive on the terrace. The only problem is that they need the temperature to stay above 10 °C, which can become an issue during winter. A solution could be to relocate the plants during winter, e.g. to a plant hotel. Here you would pay for the m² your plants would take up, and a gardener would look after them.

Tomato experiences

At ST, there has been success with tomato plants on the rooftop terrace. The plants were placed in self watering planters, which can hold 20 L of water, reducing the amount of times it needs to be filled. The ST gardeners' advice is to break off branches without fruits growing on them.

Urban gardening

You will also be able to grow other plants, to expand your inventory of home grown food and herbs.

You can always get advice at Aldershvile plant school.

The current trend is called 'Urban gardening'. The trend has quickly spread to the major cities, where plants are being grown on terraces and there is always room for herbs or chilies on the smallest of balconies.

Kickstart the Kitchen garden

Kickstart the Kitchen garden by growing your own vegetables indoor, so that they can be *planted* in the kitchen gardens instead of being *sown* there.

In this way, you'll get an earlier reap and exploit the kitchen garden more efficiently. You would be able to harvest rucola, radishes and leaf lettuce at early May, or cabbage, peas, and lettuce from the end of May. An early harvest also brings the opportunity to

sow or plant another round in the same dirt.

Vegetables that should be sown early: Celery, leeks, artichokes, cabbage, Tuscan kale, cauliflower, and summer cabbage.

It is also time for the plants that demand heat, like tomatoes, peppers, chilies, and aubergines. Wait until mid April with cucumbers, corn, squash and beans



The need for an ergometer has always been present. Partly because of the many rowers at the dormitory and partly because it is a superb machine for everyone wanting to exercise. The need for the machine has greatly increased, because of a recent increase in members. With the expansion of the exercise club (approved at the previous meeting), this is finally possible. I have allied with two residents because I am not a rower and have no experience regarding ergometers. These residents have experience with ergometers and I have received an offer from c2shop.dk(appende) for a slightly used Concept 2 Model D PM 3 in black. The offer is at DKK 6000. This offer has been deemed reasonable since it is a machine that can be placed indoors, is very durable, and is easily maintained.

-Mathilde: The ergometer will last, as long as the chain is lubricated. Dust can, however, become a problem but is easily removed. The electronics are assumed to be the first thing that breaks down, but is easily protected.

Another issue is the noise that it generates. The machine will be relocated if the noise becomes a problem.

can sanction / involve the use of the network, internet and TV signal".

The Kældercafé is plotting to renovate!

Most of you have probably already heard that the Kældercafé is making plans to renovate the bar. This is mainly because they've been seeing a decrease in guests over a longer period of time, and the bar is getting worn down. This is why we've put a group of bartenders to the task of coming up with plan as to what the bar should look like heading forward. The idea is to end out with a completed plan, after which we will request the money needed at the residents' council. It is important to note that we are non-profit, and are therefor unable to save up for the various things that can go wrong, except if we raise the prices significantly—but no one is interested in that happening.

What is wrong with the bar?

If you take a closer look next time you're in the bar, you'll see how worn down it has become. Remnants of old benches that have never been reattached, are still mounted on some of the walls. Several of the drywalls contain holes in them that have been there for more than five years. One of our remaining benches is in very bad shape, and its recent renovation consisted of a cola-box and a piece of wood to replace a leg.

Our toilets are worn down, and at times somewhat nasty. The lighting in the bar is bad, and missing in some places. Many of the stools are so worn that they are falling apart, and the sofas don't fit with the height of the tables. The staircase to the bar is

poorly lit and, on dark days, an actual hazard.

There are more problems behind the bar. The board at the entrance to the bar is missing a piece of wood after an old computer installation. The dish washer is unstable and almost completely broken. It is already unable to wash with soap, which is a major issue!

We have, on top of all of this, been hit with water damages on multiple occasion. We've had an actual flood of the bar that damaged the inventory in such a way that it was unsalvageable. We have also for long periods, more than one year, had water in the basement every time it's been raining a little too violently. This is incredibly tough on the furniture and the indoor climate.

We are, of course, trying our best to maintain the bar. The bar is operating brilliantly, but it is balanced by trying to keep the prices as low as possible, and there is therefor not much money left for major issues. The bar has not yet requested money for renovations since march 2012, but were hoping that we will now be able to.

What are we planning?

As a part of the planning process we've had a group of people going around the dorm, asking every kitchen what they would like for the bar. We're also thinking, now that we were doing repairs, that we can just as well shine it up. We don't see a point in repairing and painting some wall, and not the rest

of the bar as well.

The project is still on its way, and nothing is final. Ideas regarding the following are being worked on in the meanwhile :

We would like a brighter bar, not only when it comes the colours but also regarding the lighting, without making the entire place light up. The Water Diviner

This film may not be known to most, but that isn't so strange. Despite appearing in cinemas in 2014, it will not be available in Danish cinemas until the end of July. The movie is worth watching none the less, and is why we've chosen to review this movie so that you can have something to look forward to!

The Water Diviner is instructed by Russell Crowe. Russell Crowe is also playing the main character, who is an Australian dad that experiences a great tragedy in his life. We are in the year 1919, World war I has just ended and Connor (the father) has had to see his three sons go to war for the Australian and New Zealandian army, ANZACV, without returning. All three are presumed dead in the battle of Gallipoli (Gallipoli Campaign) and, yet, the mother won't realize it. Connor is now living in great sorrow. The loss of the three boys is immensely great,

and only gets worse as the wife forces him to continue reading them bedtime stories while they are, obviously, not there.

In his powerlessness, Connor travels to Turkey where the sons are said to have died—which in itself was a long journey back then. The allied forces are just starting to investigate where their troops were killed and who is buried where. The area is, to put it mildly, a wilderness filled with mines and mass graves.

Connor faces a lot of resistance against him entering the area to look for his sons, and what is he supposed to look for? Meanwhile, Connor meets a Turkish family who has also been affected by the war with their own losses, which in turn makes them understanding for his situation, while also seeing him as the enemy. Nothing is ever easy!

The film is very moving and you quickly understand how powerless Connor must

have felt. The characters are played incredibly well, and while Russell himself is doing a great job, it's his fellow actors who have won the awards. It should also be mentioned that the lead female role is, Ukrainian Olga Kurylenko, is particularly stylish and beautiful in this movie ;)

The entire story is inspired by real events. While everything in the movie probably didn't happen in exactly the way it's presented, the circumstances were still incredibly tough. The battle of Gallipoli was a terrible battle for ANZAC, who was used as bait by the British to allow them to move their own personnel to somewhere safe. The cost was great for both ANZAC, the Brits and the Turks. A total of 131.000 soldiers are thought to have died as a result of the battle.

Watch the movie, it's moving and fantastically executed. 5 out of 6 stars from here.
