Subletting of rooms

Most of you are probably already familiar with the term "sublet". As part of the rules of the college, it is possible to sublet your room in a given period, e.g. if you are going to study abroad or work far from home for a period. Over the recent past, we at the board have noticed that more and more write back and forth about sublease on the dorm's Facebook group. This is obviously an easy and quick way to find interested subtenants or to sublease. However, we wish to inform you that you must remember to respect the rules applicable to sublease here at the college, else you risk losing your lease.

The current rules can be found in the rulebook on nybro.dk. Last in this article we have copied the regulations paragraph 6, which deals with subletting.

If you want to sublet your room, then pay particular attention to the following:

- 1) You and your subletting party must sign a sublease. This can be obtained in the secretariat, who's in charge of the management of all that has to do with subletting of rooms. The lease must be signed no later than one month before the sublease starts.
- 2) The subletting party must be a student during the entire period - even if the person only rents the room for less than 3 months. This is evidenced by the regulations in §6, paragraph six
- 3) According to the lease you are still responsible for paying the rent to KAB. The subletting party commits to pay the rent to you.

The Regulations regarding subletting
§ 6 A tenant who is terminated due to breach of the regulations, can not stay as subtenant at the dorm.

Section 2: A subtenant who is terminated due to breach of the regulations, can not be con-

sidered for the standard rooms or apartments in the residence.

Section 3: Sublease must be done through or with the consent of the dorm's sublease Secretariat. All other sublease constitutes a breach of the lease and will result in contract termination (see Law on subsidized housing § 90 paragraph. 1 no. 6).

Section 4: Sublease can only last for up to 7 months. Exemption can be granted due to absence in relation to an education.

Section 5: You can not, when subletting, free yourself from the obligations, stated in the original lease with the exception of those mentioned in the lease.

Section. 6: For a room to be subleased, the subtenant must meet the then-current rules for admission to the dorm. Subleasing must also, throughout the rental period, at any time be able to demonstrate study activity.

Chilies at AB

70 chili plants at 1.5 - 2 meters have decorated all AB-Even's windows throughout the summer.

8-10 varieties



I'm not a piece of meat





The KælderCaféen needs more bartenders!

After a long and hard renovation over the summer, The KælderCafé can finally look back on the first month since its reopening. We have received a lot of feedback from customers and bartenders who have been pleased with the new design, even though there are minor items that still need to be adjusted.

When it comes to bartenders, we've had to say goodbye to a few over the summer, and as a result, we have, among other things, had to stay closed a single week since. We would therefore wish for more bartenders, so that we can ensure that we are always open for business. In order to lure you in, I've made an outline of what it means to be bartender at the Kældercafé.

Only work when you can and want to
We do not work with a fixed work schedule. Instead, we have an online work calen-

dar, where you assign yourself on days when you want to work. If we're missing bartenders at an opening, then we obviously ask to hear if anyone has the opportunity to work. In the end, it's always yourself who choose, whether you can and will work, and if you do not want to work then it's **. You can not be forced to work against your will.

Get 10 points for every shift

As a result of agreements with the residents' council, we will not pay bartenders in the form of money. This isn't possible for our economy to bear, bearing in mind the low prices we go for. We reward all the bartenders with 10 points for each shift they take. Each point can be used on any drink, beer or anything else we sell in the bar-even when you are not at work. You may therefore collect points over time. Furthermore, it is possible to buy both cans and bottles

with points. You can ensure a cheaper bar bill in the future through a job as a bartender.

At least one shift every third month.

We are very sympathetic to the fact that you also need time to do other activities. Therefore, we only require that you work once every 3 months. More would, of course, be super, but is not required.



Did you know that there are a multitude of clubs, groups and rooms you can access and join?

Here is some short and quick info on the many offers:

Cinema Club: Located in the AB basement. Membership costs 100kr.

Small sports room: In the CD basement where you can play hockey and table tennis. This room is for everyone.

Art Club & music club: In the Community basement. Free membership.

Secretariat, residents' council, complaints, sublease office, network administration and board of directors: the GH-basement.

The Kældercafé: Located in the JK basement

Bicycle workshop and canoe/kayak room: Located in the LM -basement. free membership to both clubs. Canoe Club has a compartment for paddles / oar and vests while boats lie outside at Lyngby Lake.

Exercise Club: The gym is located in the NO basement. The price is DKK 200 and a yearly fee of DKK 100.

ST: The basement has water damage. Has been used as a storage.

The old room is to receive small changes and optimizations, so that it's easier to get around, such as moving the wall bars. Before the hole is made, which is being planned, no machines will be moved in to the other room. The room also needs to be ventilated and hopefully equipped with mats if a good deal presents itself. Seasonal foods



Now that we go towards colder fall days, it is good to have some food that warms the entire body. Which is why I love soup in the autumn, and especially soups made from the season's ingredients such as pumpkin. Made in the right way, pumpkin soup tastes great and its nice colour is just another reason to indulge in this particular soup. Serve the soup with a little sour cream and freshly baked bread, then it's simply the best!

[Creamy Hokkaido pumpkin soup with sour cream \(2-3 people\)](#)

INGREDIENTS

- 1 Hokkaido pumpkin
- 1 onion
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1 Litre of water
- 1 vegetable bouillon cube
- 1 package of cream cheese, for example. Philadelphia
- A little cayenne pepper
- Optional: Add a little chilli or grated ginger to make the soup more spicy
- Bread and sour cream served separately

PROCEDURE

The pumpkin is rinsed, cleaned of seeds and cut into medium-sized pieces. The skin can be cut off, but since it becomes soft when it is cooked and blended, this is far from necessary.

Fry the chopped onion and garlic in a pot and add the pumpkin.

The mixture should fry for a few minutes.

Add water and broth and cook for about 20 min.

The soup is blended with a rod blender, after which the cream cheese is added. Mix it all together by using the hand blender again.

Finally, add the cayenne pepper (Optionally also Chilli and grated ginger) to taste, and serve with bread and sour cream.

Tip! If you want more filling for the pumpkin soup, you may add pieces of boiled potatoes, carrots and leeks. This is added after water and broth, and blended with the rest of the soup.

INGREDIENTS

- 200 g rye flour
- 300 g of durum flour
- 600 g of wheat flour
- 150 g of oat flakes
- 25 g yeast
- 3 carrots
- 4 tbsp. Greek yoghurt
- 1 dl sunflower oil
- 5 cups water
- 2 tsp. salt

PROCEDURE

Dissolve yeast in warm water. put the oatmeal in and let it soak while the carrots grate.

Add oil, yogurt, and salt, and stir together.

Then add the rest of the ingredients into the mixture and knead well. The wheat flour is added a little at a time until the dough no longer sticks to your fingers.

Let the dough rise for about 45 minutes with a cloth. Place the bowl in a warm place.

Knead all the air out of the dough and divide into two equal lumps.

Roll the dough into two loaves and place them on a baking sheet and let them rise for about 30 min.

Scratch loaves and brush them if necessary. with a little milk.

The loaves are baked at 210-220 ° C for about 30 min.

Then it is just enjoying the lovely warm pumpkin soup with the delicious homemade bread! Absolutely perfect for a cold autumn day, where most of all just want to put on a movie, throw your feet up on the sofa, and warm yourself on a fantastic autumn soup! Bon appetite! Louise P-20

Lyngby Turistfart



The story of Lyngby Turistfart (tourist touring company) spans three generations. The company started in 1947 when the haulage Rich Andersen sees business opportunities in the form of bus driving because the war is over, and he believes that the Danes want to travel. In 1947 he buys a used 25 seater Ford V8 bus and in 1949, Lyngby Turistfart started.

In 1950-1959 one of the buses had a closet for cooling your drink, which was a great luxury. During this period, permission to be allowed to drive in the Allied occupation forces zones in Germany is granted, which means that there will be a huge interest to go across the border. Renting of a 30 seater bus in this period, for half a day, was at DKK 60. In 1961 the company's longest trip goes to North Africa. Lyngby Turistfart is growing steadily and is looking to expand. In the 60s, call radios are mounted in all buses. In 1971, The company moves to Chr. X's Allé where there is room for a modern workshop. The first double-decker bus arrived in the 80s, and comes with air conditioning, and tourists are driven to and from the national attractions. The fleet now stands at 23 buses. The buses drive 1.5 million. km annually, and has a turnover of 20 million DKK.

Carsten Andersen, who is the third generation of the family that started the company and become operator in 1989. Lyngby Turistfart today has many partners and is running nationally but also in the rest of Europe. Carsten Andersen became sole owner in 1998.

A fun fact is that Lyngby Turistfart in 1995 received a business award in recognition of being an exemplary company in good momentum with satisfied customers and loyal employees.



Is the lyngby vase really from lyngby?

Yes, the Lyngby vase is from Denmark - Lyngby Porcelain Factory. The porcelain factory opened in 1936 in Kgs. Lyngby, and fabricated porcelain services, vases and other handicrafts. However, the factory closed in 1969

In 2012, the porcelain factory Denmark - Lyngby Porcelain re-opened, which again makes design and artwork. A little fun fact is that if you get be married at Lyngby Town Hall, you'll receive a Lyngby Vase as a gift. The Lyngby vase was designed in 1936

Inside Out - Inderst inde

When I look at my circle of friends, it is obvious that we all get older... 18th birthday celebrations are gradually replaced with 25th and cinnamon. Sad, is not it?

I must, however admit, that we do not all behave as middle-aged, self-controlled and adult. A proof of this is, among other things, clear when you look at what cinema films are trending among many young people. Yes, yes, movies like Jurassic Park has since lured many to the movies, but I would probably guess that even more in my circle of friends vow to see every Pixar movies released. How can this be? It's children's film, is not it?

At my student job I have many colleagues with small children, and of course they have also all been to the cinema to see "Inside Out" -or in Danish, "Inderst inde"(Deep down). As one colleague said over the dinner table: "It's a super children's film, but they just have so much more depth as you

actually only get to realise when you were a little older" - and it's true! The creators behind both Disney and Pixar Film often put much more thought behind the characters and their actions, than just what is needed to create a children's film. And it clearly captures the slightly older audience.

Inside Out is from my view a great movie and, for example, a much better film than the new Minions film that most of all was a collection of good clips, but a bad movie. Inside Out has a story it wants to tell, and although emotions are simplified, the film does a good job of showing how the different emotions come into play, and all are important. It's incredibly fun to see how Pixar has tried to transform all the things happening in the brain, to things that can appear in a cartoon. The film manages simultaneously to create a good balance between the actions of "reality" and what happens inside, especially the girl's head.



As the film reveals, there is need for all of the emotions to grasp the things we experience, and it's not necessarily smart or necessary to always be either happy or positive. An important point for all of us!
