

The dormitory is lacking in volunteers

Thanks to the many volunteers at the dorm. We live in a very cool place with incredible facilities and opportunities. The volunteer activities are, however, running out and it is precisely why we need your help!

Here at Nybrogård dormitory, we have a lot of clubs, groups, councils and even a bar, all of which exist only thanks to the many dedicated and sweet volunteer residents who, over the years, have wanted to lend a hand in making the dorm a cool place to live in.

Unfortunately, the dorm has lost a large part of its volunteers, which means that many of the opportunities and facilities we have at this time, will not necessarily continue to be available, unless there are new volunteers.

In this article we will describe some of the clubs, councils and groups that are lacking your help, and tell you a bit about why it's so cool to be a volunteer at our wonderful dormitory.

The Residents' council insures your influence



The residents' council is lacking in representatives from the different hallways of the dormitory. At present, eight hallways are not represented in the residents' council, which means

that many residents do not have the opportunity to have a say in the things that get passed.

If the residents' council have no volunteer representatives, then the residents will lose the ability to influence the actions that may affect us at the dormitory.

"The Residents' Council's is important for us residents, because it's the way we get a say in what goes on at the dormitory in relation to the economy and various actions made. If there is no residents' committee at the dormitory, it will become more difficult to implement changes. By making sure that your hallway is represented in the residents council, you make it possible to continue your influence in the actions that affect us as residents and our day to day lives at the dormitory" says one of the current residents' council representatives.

Want to be residents' council representative of your hallway? Then come to the next residents' council meeting, where you can join the residents' council.

KælderCaféen makes the weekends more festive

KælderCaféen is the dormitory bar where many residents spend their Friday evenings and where the monthly theme parties kicks off the weekends.

KælderCaféen runs solely on volunteers in the form of a board, bartenders and members in various committees, including a theme party committee, design committee, shopping committee, etc.

The bar is especially lacking in bartenders, creative minds in the design committee and people who want to be responsible for the procurement of all the bar's alcohol etc.

At present, KælderCaféen has 34 more or less active bartenders, which may sound like a lot, but to ensure that the bar can stay open every Friday and one Saturday a month, we need many more.



Also for rentals of the bar there is a need of the volunteer bartenders so that the current bartenders do not work overtime, and to avoid any closures, there is a need for many more bartenders.

"The bartending position is not just about being behind a bar and mix drinks. It's much more than that. You are helping to contribute to a party for both the guests, but also behind the bar. You get fun experiences and a sense of unity" says Lea who is one of the volunteer bartenders in KælderCaféen.

Also in the design committee there is plenty of work. The committee currently only has a single member, who is mostly doing all the posters, slides and other creative and visual elements for KælderCaféen.

Know your library: Stadsbiblioteket

Despite declining library book lending, many libraries are still expanding with several new activities. Lyngby's library, Stadsbiblioteket, is no exception. However, few know about all of the new (and old) offers, so we have chosen to give you a little overview.

Stadsbiblioteket is, first and foremost, a good place to study—especially for those who do not study at DTU, but who do not want to travel too far for a study room. But others, who think the usual group/library rooms are too boring, can certainly also benefit from the library.

OPEN AND CLOSED STUDY ROOMS

Reading rooms are located on the top floor with tables (and in most cases power sockets) along the window sections, so you have a really nice view down to the pond, Mølledammen. The proximity to Mølledammen also means that one can easily get out and ventilate the brain when reading becomes too heavy; it takes 15

minutes to walk around the lake, and then you have energy for a few more hours of reading. Although the "open" study places are usually relatively quiet, one can also borrow closed 1-2 man study rooms or a larger group room.

COFFEE AND ACTIVITIES

You can also get energy for reading from coffee and sweets in the library Café. Both the coffee, cakes and buns are relatively inexpensive and quite good. The café is managed in cooperation with Magneten, a support centre for mentally disabled adults, so you also support a good cause by buying coffee here.

Activities at the library include lectures, quizzes, exhibitions, film screenings and concerts, which often target the slightly older clientele. However, zombie movie viewings have been spotted before!

If you are a book nerd, it can also be exciting to go hunting in the library's book sale. It is usually located in the basement, and the books typically costs 5-10 kr.

SAVE MONEY

Something that particularly surprised me about the library has been all the free resources found here. And no, it's not just about books. While it in itself is fantastic, that you can order any book from any li-



brary (through bibliotek.dk), there are also other resources, many of them online. For example, try to check out the list at www.lyngbybib.dk/e-biblioteket. If you are a registered user in the Lyngby-Taarbæk libraries you get free access to drivers license help, Danish and English magazines, Filmstriben (free streaming of 20 movies per month), language courses and Gyldendal's red dictionaries. Especially Filmstriben is pretty cool— there is in fact a (free!) movie collection, which is comparable to Netflix.

And if that was not enough, there is also free legal counselling once a week and something as unique as fitness/ "motion" backpacks, which is a collection of materials providing inspiration to do sports.

The library contains so much more than you think.

This month it's Emma's turn to talk about how she has travelled around South Africa.

Baz Bus

I was not interested in getting into the country and chose the "safe" route along the coast.

Baz Bus is a tourist bus that drives along the coast. A safe, pleasant, almost punctual minibus, with primarily young back packers who travel between Cape Town and Johannesburg (Jo burg). It drives both ways and stops at all the places along the coast, which the tourist handbook suggests worth visiting. You pay one amount and then you can bogey it just as crazy as you like.

My route—Everyone's route

Most I've met started their South African travel adventure in **Cape Town**. Cape is a wonderful city and when choosing between Cape, Durban or Johannesburg, Cape is undoubtedly the greatest on all parameters! I could write an entire article just about Cape. You can easily spend a week in the area and see something new and impressive every day.

Between Cape Town and Durban there are countless opportunities along the coast. Some stops will be suitable for drinking, others for national parks, bungee jumping, hiking, surfing, jumping from rocks, etc.

From Durban to Johannesburg (Jo Burg) you must go through Drakensberg, a mountain range with sublime opportunities for fantastic hikes, horseback rides, and wow... the views!

After Drakensberg is Jo Burg which has Soweto. **Soweto** is a known township because Mandela, for 14 years, lived in this part of town, but in general it is notorious for being extremely criminal and uninspiring. BUT, Baz Bus arrange trips from Johannesburg to the **Kruger National Park**. It is recommended before flying home! It can not be described in words why, just spend the extra money and do it!

Coast to coast

The book *Coast to Coast* is almost your Bible

and you'll find them at most hostels, for free. It highlights each stop on the Baz Bus route, what there is to see and do, and recommendations on hostels. Coast to Coast and Baz Bus have the same stops and several hostels in the book are pickup points for the bus, that is damned smart!

They have a website, www.coasttocoast.co.za, but everyone I met had it in book form, as you won't always have internet access.

New apps

Uber

Do not count on being able to hitchhike a cab for yourself on the street. To get what we call a "normal" taxi you'll need to call and order it. Small mini buses and local taxis drive on the streets, which should be quite cheap, but stuffed. The best and safest way to get around was with Uber. Everyone uses Uber and they drive a lot better than the taxis.

WhatsApp

Everyone I met in SA used WhatsApp to communicate. They do not use Messenger and text messages because not everyone has Facebook, it takes a lot of space on your phone and it is cheaper to use data than calling. They are completely unable to understand why I did not have this app, and that there are places that do not use WhatsApp. Maybe we should try it?

Phone/Phones

As you can understand, a phone with internet is almost indispensable. You can, with your passport in your hand, easily buy a sim card and data, and is really recommended.

Speaking of phones, remember to bring an additional phone. Why? Because the chance of meeting someone asking you to hand over your stuff is, unfortunately, quite high.

The scare stories are, for example, of two Swedish girls from my hostel who had just lost everything except an old mobile phone, clothes and an extra credit card that was tucked deep in the bag. One of the girls had in turn received cuts inside the mouth from the group of seven who had tried to stop her from shouting for help and they had both got bruises on arms and hands. I always had contacts spread a little all over the place and an old

Nokia in my pocket.

Durban has clearly become more criminal compared to 10 years ago. A local lady at the library told about how necklaces in gold were being ripped off in the street, and if the rings are not given voluntarily, they bite your finger off. *I did not wear jewellery on the entire trip.*

The big difference in crime in general that tourists experience seems to be that in Europe, people steal your stuff, where they in SA threaten their way to your stuff. *I never went on the streets alone.*

Is there something positive?

Many met me with "ALONE!? In South Africa? Don't ... It's dangerous ... It is dangerous here..." I wish I had been greeted with:

"GREAT! Take care of yourself, but enjoy the countryside, the beautiful scenery, the warmth. Hope you meet some nice people."

Because the journey has been a little handcuffed. My surroundings made me very cautious, less open, less adventurous, but your trip to South Africa does not need to be like that.

If I had to do this over again I would spend a few days in Cape Town and go on day long hikes and see the beautiful scenery. I would spend more time along the coasts which are "safe" (everything is relative), see several waterfalls, drink more beer with the other tourists and jump from several rocks at the falls. I would find someone to travel with, I would get an extra phone that actually works, I would spend more time in the Drakensberg and less time in Durban. I would go to the apartheid museum on a day where I could actually be bothered to read the signs, and dwell in several national parks! There are National Parks without dangerous wild animals where you are safe and where there are camp sites and a "simple living" atmosphere.

I clearly want to go back! It has been a cheap trip, easy to plan and easy to experience something new every day!

And pictures of the trip, pf! There was no room for them.

The ordinary presentation of the collegiums budget for next year is therefore deferred one month in connection to the council meeting in the start of May. 8. Inward correspondence

A) Bicycle workshop purchase requests - V. Kristoffer Runge (L-10). For discussion and vote. It's time for new tools for the bicycle workshop, especially after the recent clean up, for which there was a lot of support. Some tools are worn/broken, others are

simply gone. We have therefor produced a list of tools that we would like to purchase. (See attachment 1).

B) Bicycle workshop upgrades – V. Kristofer Runge (L-10) For discussion. Short description: we are considering installing ceiling and lighting in the roof, and get an overall electrical update in the bike workshop. Estimate of 40.000 kr. I think it is a good investment, because many people are using the workshop. Especially is the exposed Rockwool and electricity not optimal and need improvements. Before collecting offers, I would like to get a sensation if the request has any support.

C) Raised contribution to internet – V. Rasmus Lau (S-21). For discussion and vote. Short description: Monthly, an amount of 12.450-12.810 kr. is paid for the internet service (which corresponds to 415-427 residents paying 30 kr. monthly). Yearly, 128.000 kr. is paid to K-net (25,0-25,7 kr./user/month). The rest goes to the net group for maintenance and operation.

Savings have been made through the years

as no mentionable investments have been made, so we've had enough resources until now. We would like to make a significant quality improvement in the internet connection. So far, we have changed the terms to make it possible for us to sanction private wireless internet connections, but we do not want to make use of the sanctions before we have upgraded the wi-fi (we are waiting for equipment from K-net). This upgrade would empty the net account. In addition to this, we have experienced serious trouble in collaborating with K-net, the ideal solution would be to change provider. We have gotten an offer at approximately 510.000 kr. as upfront payment and 200.000 kr. every year (about 40kr./user/month with 427 registrations). The net group would therefore suggest a preliminary increase in the price of 10kr./user/month, total of 40kr./user/month to secure the capital for the coming upgrade and in recognition that the collegium should have an attractive and low price internet that can handle what the future demands, which might require a new provider.


KældersCaféens Birthday



90 million on new rowing stadium

On 24 March 2017 it was decided that Denmark will host the World Cup in canoe and kayak sprint 2021.

But why would NybroTidende choose to write about an event four years prior to its occurrence? You are quite right, canoeing and kayaking is not that interesting, but the 90 million kroner expensive construction project that starts in 2017 is perhaps?

Why a new stadium?

Bagsværd Rowing Stadium and the waters of Bagsværd Sø hosts the blood, sweat and tears for the world elite in both rowing and canoe / kayak, on a daily basis. However, there is a huge BUT at Bagsværd Rowing Stadium. It does not have the international requirements to host major championships. E.g. there are several places not deep enough for a minimum depth of 2 meters.

This would never allow a VM to come to Denmark, if not the Fund 'the Danish Rowing Stadium', had collaborated on a major upgrade of

Denmark's Rowing Stadium.

The project has been mentioned in the news:

Gladsaxen, Gladsaxe local newspaper 2 May 2014

A project for 90 million kroner.

The total cost of the entire project is expected to amount to at least 90 million.

It is assumed that funding will be provided through funds, and by Gladsaxen's access to documents it's shown that the project has already received pledges of support of 50 million from a private foundation. As Gladsaxen could reveal in 2013, Mærsk Foundation is already deeply involved in the project.

Fond donates the rowing-sport 50 million for a new national stadium

A large donation sets off a long-awaited modernization of Denmark's national rowing and canoeing center in Bagsværd. We are used to seeing big smiles on Danish rowers' faces when

they pull medal after medal home at the Olympics. In Bagsværd, however, it is neither gold, silver nor bronze which makes them cheer. It's news that the modernization of Danish Rowing Stadium will become a reality with a donation of 50 million from the AP Møller Foundation.

Danish Canoe and Kayak Federation February 4, 2016

Rambøll selected as the building consultant

The newly elected Board of Directors of the Fund has just been appointed and has immediately kicked off their work. As its first task, the Board has appointed Rambøll as the building consultant to, among other, assist the project in connection to the future architectural competition. The other four pre-qualified consultants in addition to Rambøll were Arkitema, Cowi, Emcon and Kuben Management.

The foundation "Lokale og Anlægsfonden" supports the project with half a million kroner for the implementation of an architectural competition in 2016th



NybroTidende Food Column: Seasonal foods



Easter is in April, and what says Easter more than Easter eggs? Eggs are a sure winner on the Easter table, but the conventional preparation (hard boiled, soft boiled, scrambled eggs, etc.) Can all be a little too boring and monotonous. On the occasion of Easter, I chose to try some slightly different and more fun recipes with eggs.

Filled eggs with shrimp (1-2 persons)

- 100 g shrimp
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp. soft butter
- 1 tbsp. sour cream
- 1 tbsp. mayonnaise
- Salt and pepper
- Possibly garnish with dill.

Boil the eggs for 8 minutes, then peel and cut them along the length and remove the egg yolks. Then mash the yolks with butter, sour cream and mayonnaise. Chop the prawns roughly and stir them with the egg mixture. Add salt and pepper. Fill the mixture into the eggs. Possibly garnish with dill.

Assessment

The mixture of shrimp and eggs tastes great in this way, and I'll definitely make it again!

Filled eggs with garlic (1-2 persons)

- 1 tbsp. garlic cream cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tbsp. sour cream
- Possibly garnish with parsley.

Boil the eggs for 8 minutes, then peel and cut them along the length and remove the egg yolk. Mash the yolks with sour cream and stir well with garlic cream cheese. Fill the mixture into the eggs, and possibly garnish with parsley.

Assessment

The mixture of garlic cheese and egg yolk isn't

to my taste, but it must not stop others from trying out the recipe.

Filled eggs with salmon (1-2 persons)

- 2 hard-boiled eggs
- 1-2 tbsp. sour cream
- ½ tbsp. mayonnaise
- A little Dijon mustard
- 100 g of smoked salmon
- Salt and pepper
- Possibly chives for decoration

Boil the eggs for 8 minutes, then peel and cut them along the length and remove the egg yolks.

Mash the yolks with sour cream and mayonnaise and season with salt, pepper and some Dijon mustard (I added 1/4 tsp.). Cut the salm-



on into fine cubes and add it to the egg mixture. Fill the mixture into the eggs, and possibly garnish with some chives.

Assessment

The stuffed eggs with salmon tastes just as good as the ones with shrimp, and are definitely recommended!

Scottish eggs

- 7 large eggs, including 1 egg for bread-ing
- 300 g of veal and pork

- 1 tbsp. smoked paprika
- 1½ tbsp. Dijon mustard
- 1½ tsp. flour
- Salt and pepper
- Wheat flour and bread crumbs for breading

Boil the 6 eggs until soft boiled and put them immediately into a bowl of ice cold water. When the eggs are completely cold, remove the shell very carefully. While the eggs are cooling down, you put the meat, smoked paprika, mustard, wheat flour, salt and pepper into a blender and blend it. This makes the meat finer and easier to work with.

Divide the mixture into 6 parts, roll it flat and carefully lay a peeled egg on top of the batter. Fold it gently around the egg until it is completely covered and the batter is evenly distributed around it. Do this carefully, remember that the egg is soft boiled. Then you turn the wrapped eggs in the flour, then in 1 beaten egg and finally in breadcrumbs.



Some cook the Scotch egg by deep-frying them, but I was content with just frying them in a pan with oil until they got colour, and then I put them in the oven for 15 minutes.

Assessment

The Scottish eggs are a little peculiar, but it was definitely an experience to try them!

NO-odd has, without a doubt, one of the most socially well functioning kitchens.


"It's about having a clean, but 'hyggeligt' kitchen and reminding others to do their dishes in a polite way".



Bar review: Vindstyrke 12

The bar reviewer has switched Copenhagen and Lyngby's student bars with bodegas in Varde. The clientele is quite different, but the prices are mostly the same and the interior is the most complete I've seen in a while .

At Vindstyrke 12 sits 'the old gang', playing Meyer in the corner. The average age is, before we step in, about 50-60 years—we then lower it considerably. The music is suited to the usual clientele, but it's rather pleasant. We immediately ask this pleasant establishment about its beer selection, which turns out to be very clear: Tuborg, Carlsberg or Odense Classic—all bottled. On the upside, it's very affordable at a price of

only 16 kr.—even on a Saturday. Not bad. To those who may be in doubt: the coffee punch is, of course, also a thing in Varde, and yes, it was spotted on the drinks menu.

We are, however, only truly impressed when we find our seats deeper in the bar. Vindstyrke 12's (Wind speed 12) interior lives up to its name, completely. The bar reminds you of a ship cabin from last century mixed with 'Huset på Christianshavn's "Rottehullet"'. We are therefore somewhere between 1870 and 1970, but only a bar-shark with a very 'street' hat would be able to attest the actual date. The mentioned shark (with hat) is hanging above the counter and is looking more dangerous and

antique furniture, a pair of slot machines and a collage from the 90's with the bar's regulars (including their dogs). The regulars are so appreciated that there are even nametags on several of the seats

I think that I have rarely been in a bar with such a complete interior, and with a homely feel. No special designer furniture is needed nor innovative signature drinks.

The peaceful atmosphere is, however, disturbed by 10-20 men (most likely from the barracks) who quickly fill the bar. Vindstyrke 12 is apparently not such a bad place for a night out (A great offer is currently given—"10 beers for 140 kr").

Such a flock filled the tiny bar to its bursting point, so we decide to return home, but it is certainly a location which deserves a revisit .
