



Want to be a residents' council representative?

Are you considering becoming a residents' council representative for your hall? Then read along! The Council urgently needs more volunteers, and NybroTidende has therefore chosen this month to focus on all the questions you could have about being a representative.

What this means exactly to be the residents' council representative? Do I get anything from it? How does it work on the other halls with a representative? And why is it so important that I sign up as a representative? We will answer all of these questions and more, which hopefully will give you the opportunity to sign up as a residents' council representative, and contribute to the dormitory's volunteer community.

What does it mean to be a representative?

As a residents' council representative, your tasks consists mainly of representing your hall (or apartment block) in the residents' council. Before each council meeting, you must (more or less) familiarise yourself with the items on the agenda, which you can find on the notice you receive each month in your mailbox. You and your hall/block then vote on whether you agree on the various items on the agenda. Some of the halls that have a representative in the residents' council have this vote in continuation of a kitchen meeting, which they usually hold at the end of the month, such that the agenda is discussed when the hall is already gathered.

Then you meet up to the monthly residents' council meeting, usually at the beginning of the month (the specific date is stated in the notice). As a representative, you will then vote on the various points based on the vote you previously had. If you or your hall have any comments to the points on the agenda, then you should also express these at the meeting.

All in all, you can say that you have the opportunity to be the "voice" of your hall in the residents' council.

What do I get from it?

But is not hard to sometimes have to vote based on the hall's opinion if you mean something else? And is it not annoying that many forget to appreciate the work you are doing as residents' council representative? Well, yes it is, but the benefits simply outweigh the downsides.

First of all, as a representative, you get the opportunity to contribute to the volunteer community at the dorm, which gives you a lot of knowledge about the dorm and the various processes that take place here. Due to your contribution, you also have the opportunity to attend the dorm's fun active parties. Through this event you can get to know a lot of new people and expand your social horizons.

All for a job that's super important, but that does not necessarily take a lot of hours every month.

Why is it important?

Another thing you get from being a representative is that you help ensure your hall and your own participation in the decision-making processes that concern every resident.

Look at the residents' council as a type of democracy, where we ensure that all voices are heard. If your hall does not have a voice, then you miss the opportunity to be heard, and even worse if there are not enough representatives in the residents' council, we as residents lose the opportunity to influence the decisions made there, which affects us to the greatest extent.

Few representatives in the council

At present, only 8 out of 18 halls are represented in the residents' council, and all apart-

ments are without representatives. If you take a look at the following list of residents, you might notice how empty it looks. So there is a lot of need for you in the council!

Canoe trip starting just outside your door

As were entering spring, the activity on Lyngby lake is increasing. Some of Denmark's most visited canoe routes are located right outside your door, so it's about time to explore them!

If you have not already noticed, Nybrogård dormitory is one of a few in the country blessed with free canoes and kayaks. You can use this opportunity on canoe tours of varying lengths. The tours follow the 30 km long Mølleå stream and passes, among other, Lyngby Lake and Furesø lake. The tours offer beautiful forests, a lot of old mills and interesting industrial areas, but be prepared to carry the canoes a lot (see map) - therefore bring wheels! All tours described here start at the dorm.

MØLLEÅ UPSTREAM — TO FURESØ LAKE

The canoe tour upstream towards Furesø is perfect for a relaxed sunny afternoon. The tour passes Marienborg and Frederiksdal before it ends at Furesø. Here you will find Frederiksdal fribad beach with included bathing bridge, kiosk and restaurant, where you can easily spend an hour or two. The trip takes about one hour each way, and it is possible to pull your canoe up on either side of the beach.

MØLLEÅ DOWNSTREAM—TOWARDS THE SEA

If you want a longer trip, you will have to head east. The really hardcore canoers can sail all the way to the end of Mølleå stream's mouth at the sea, but it takes two days to get back and forth for most people.

If you are up for a two day canoe trip, you can stay at Strandmøllen's shelter, approx. 500-1000 meters from the sea. The shelter is free to use, but you must book it beforehand (see info box). There are also fireplaces, primitive toilets and, occasionally, firewood. So the essential needs are covered. Small tip: Remember toilet paper! There is also a large lawn with space for tents so that is always an option if the shelter is booked.

After the long canoe trip there is a good opportunity to take a dip in the sea at Strandmølle Inn, 500 meters south of Strandmølle road which leading in to the campsite.

For a relatively large group with little to no experience in canoeing it took about 7 hours including breaks to reach the campsite at Strandmøllen from Nybrogård. It is therefore a good idea to reserve a lot of time for the trip-especially with all the

tempting locations for breaks you see on the way.

The trip eastwards can certainly also be shortened to lasting just a single day. For shorter trips, I usually turn around at Brede Værk as the longest stretch of canoe carrying is located after that point, so I usually avoid it. At Brede there is also a nice café for coffee breaks. In my opinion, however, the best lunch location is at Fuglevad, where there are plenty of benches and a few lavatories that flush. Brede back and forth takes approx. 3-4 hours excluding breaks.

Remember the following equipment from the canoe club's cellar room: vests, wheels, two paddles per canoe and mid-seat (if needed). It is also advisable to invest in a waterproof bag and case / plastic bags for the phone.

Internal correspondence

(A) Bicycle workshop purchase requests - V. Kristoffer Runge (L-10).

For discussion and vote.

It's time for new tools for the bicycle workshop, especially after the recent clean up, for which there was a lot of support. Some tools are worn/broken, others are simply gone. We have therefor produced a list of tools that we would like to purchase. (See attachment 1).

B) Bicycle workshop upgrades - V. Kristoffer Runge (L-10)

For discussion.

Short description: we are considering installing ceiling and lighting in the roof, and get an overall electrical update in the bike workshop. Estimate of 40.000 kr. I think it is a good investment, because many people are using the workshop. Especially is the exposed Rockwool and electricity not optimal and need improvements. Before collecting offers, I would like to get a sensation if the request has any support.

Katja (P-32) mentions that in connection with the renovation of KælderCaféen, the operations account covered materials and the bar was responsible for installation.

John (Operations) will investigate how much the operations account can cover e.g. materials.

C) Raised contribution to internet - V. Rasmus Lau (S-21).

For discussion and vote.

Short description: Monthly, an amount of 12.450-12.810 kr. is paid for the internet service (which corresponds to 415-427 residents paying 30 kr. monthly). Yearly, 128.000 kr. is paid to K-net (25,0-25,7 kr./user/month). The rest goes to the net group for maintenance and operation.

Savings have been made through the years as no mentionable investments have been made, so we've had enough resources until now. We would like to make a significant quality improvement in the internet connection. So far, we have changed the terms to make it possible for us to sanction private wireless internet connections, but we do not want to make use of the sanctions before we have upgraded the wi-fi (we are waiting for equipment from K-net). This upgrade would empty the net account. In addition to this, we have experienced serious trouble in collaborating with K-net, the ideal solution would be to change provider.

We have gotten an offer at approximately 510.000 kr. as upfront payment and 200.000 kr. every year (about 40kr./user/month with 427 registrations). The net group would therefore suggest a preliminary increase in the price of 10kr. /user/month, total of 40kr. /user/month to secure the capital for the coming upgrade and in recognition that the collegium should have an attractive and low price internet that can handle what the future demands, which might require a new provider.

We have received an offer of around 510,000 DKK as one time payment and min. 200,000 kr. Annually (equivalent to 40 kr./resident/month at 427 residents). The Net

group will therefore propose a preliminary price increase of 10 kr./resident/month, a total of 40 kr./resident/month to ensure capital for the imminent upgrades and acknowledging the need for an attractive, affordable network that can handle the future for the dormitory, which may require a change of provider.

The problem is most pronounced in the summer days and at major events around the lakes. The possibility of establishing parking permits is discussed.

Rasmus (S-21) mentions that it has previously been investigated but was deemed to be too difficult administratively compared to the benefits.

Kasper (R-66) informs that KælderCaféen will have its summer party again this year, with about the same setup as last year. The date is set as the 11th-12th of August 2017.

In addition, fishing is also a way to wind down, as you need to let go and can not do the things you go and stress about when you're out in the middle of the lake. Jon calls it a great form of meditation. And when you sit and enjoy the beautiful scenery you can just as well look for birds at the same time. According to Jon, there is a very large biodiversity in Denmark, which means that there are the most species per. Area unit.

Also for beginners

If you are sitting there thinking that fishing is something you would enjoy, but you may not have enough experience? Then do not worry, according to Jon, everyone can join the fishermen wave.

If you are a beginner, Jon suggests that you start fishing with a standard 9-foot pole and a small float or a hook with corn on it. You can do that for a couple of hundred kroner and you should not think too much about it and not fight much with the fish.

If you are interested in fishing, there is a lot of help to get, including books at the library.

In addition, Jon recommends the shop Forst and Jagtuset, which lies just behind the station at Ulrikkenborg Square. Here they should provide a very good service and he is

sure that they want to help people who want to do some standard fishing. In the store you can also get rods for 200-300 kr. (And of course also in the thousand kroner class).

Fishing rods can also often be purchased cheaply on flea markets, and Jon points out that although the rods are from the 80s they can easily be used anyway.

One of the oldest stocks of carp

If you go for your first fishing trip at Lyngby lake or Bagsværd lake you will quickly catch something. Here, among others, Rudds and perch are some of the most common fish to catch. For those who want a little more of a challenge, zander and especially pike are a bit more fun to catch because they are bigger.

If you want the bigger challenge, you have to go for a carp. According to Jon we have one of the oldest stocks of carp, and the challenge lies both in the fact that there are not so many of them and that, due to their size, it is a bit of a challenge to pull them in. According to Jon, they can be compared to a tractor that continuously pulls on the line, and it may take about 20 minutes to get it hauled in.

Mud fish for dinner

Jon can definitely recommend other fish, and mentions that it is also a way to get food, while considering the environment and animal welfare.

However, he recommends to not eat the fish

caught at the Danish lakes, as the many nutrients that are used in agriculture spread to the lakes so that the fish get a taste of mud in the summer period.

In winter you can eat the fish caught on the lakes, but Jon recommends that you still put them back as these fish have a function and, for the sake of the lakes, he does not think that they should be removed.

When fishing on the lakes for fun, Jon believes that it is important to ensure that the fish do not suffer unnecessary stress. One can, for example, remove the barber from the hook or try to handle all the fish while they are in the water.

According to Jon, it is also about staying popular among the other fishermen and the many people at the lakes, taking care of nature and the animals in it.

Join a boat for a fishing trip

If you want to catch fish for eating, Jon recommends that you go out to the coast. Here it is quite cheap and easy to go fishing as you can get a fishing license for 180 kr., And it takes 5 minutes to order online. By the coast you also have the opportunity to go out with a fishing boat in Øresund, where you can also get tips and advice on techniques.

In addition, there are also many anglers in Denmark so ask away, and there are definitely some who want to go on a fishing trip.

VARDE, FOR THE YOUNG?

Those who read the March edition of NybroTidende would have read that Varde actually has a lot to offer: old streets, (relatively) many shops, cafes, restaurants, bodegas, swimming pool, parker. Which is all well and good for a rather boring, "old", mid-twenties person like myself—but does the city offer anything to the young and adventurous?

The answer is, surprisingly, yes. Although I have frequented bodegas, there are two party-warty-drink-yourself-under-the-table club places as well as a few "modern" bars (more modern than bodegas anyway)... not to mention the pizza/Shawarma house which is open until five o'clock in the morning. For a city with 13.000 inhabitants where the average age is probably at the low end of the scale, this is quite impressive.

The most surprising thing is that the bars are actually visited and that the nightlife is actually relatively lively. Sufficiently lively for me to hear drunk and loud singing/screaming high school students outside my window in the evening. Also on workdays. By comparison, Nybrogård is actually quite peaceful, either that or I have really nice neighbours.

For the more peaceful teenagers and children there are also some great, big skating ramps and a wildly impressive music playground with light show, which I have to admit that I too quite like.

FARTHER OUT ON THE COUNTRYSIDE

The Municipal's largest town is, contrary to what you would think, not the area with the most shops and bars. Blåvand, the cottage area at Denmark's westernmost point, is the



municipality's true tourism hotspot. When you walk on the large, almost stone-free beaches and hilly heathland, you hear a lot of German and Swedish mixed with children's laughter and dog barking. Nature lovers will enjoy the only 4-5 year old Filsø lake a little further north, which was recently flooded and is already Denmark's sixth largest lake and a paradise for birds and ornithologists.

Culinary speaking, there are noteworthy places in the Varde area. Pagoden i Ølgod, which resembles an oversized barbecue cabin from the outside, serves HUGE burgers, where everything, right down to the ketchup, is homemade. Prices are significantly lower than your usual burger house in Copenhagen, and you are served six different dips with the fries.

If you are hungry for the sweets, Pandekagehuset at Kvie lake is also worth a visit. Here you can have dessert and pancakes, enjoy a delicious Belgian beer and look out over the beautiful Kvie Lake. I almost forgot, the Michelin star restaurant Henne Kro is also located in Varde. But such a review has to wait until after my dorm residency.

THE UNION COUNTRY—WHERE THE VOLUNTEERS RULE

However, many of the places I have just mentioned are not really in the countryside. You know, areas where you know everyone in the town and where the manure smell is hard to escape.

In connection with my internship I have visited a number of such towns, and what surprised me most here was the unity. I participated in a workshop in a parish of 1100 inhabitants, of whom 130 showed up - and where there were 35 active associations. I visited a city of about 550 inhabitants, 125 of whom had joined forces to buy solar systems.

It's not always a joke that almost everybody knows each other, but it also means that you can realize much larger projects than you would expect from such small communities. Like other places in Denmark, the inhabitants fight for more apartments, clubhouses, town squares, town parks, shared cars, activities for the youth and community events, but in true west Jutland tradition, roundabouts with sculptures are also high on the wish list in the small towns. After all, you are in a rural area.

May is always a busy month with exams and too much reading. Here, tortilla pizzas are the perfect dinner (or lunch), as they are incredibly easy to make and taste delicious. Additionally, if you add a little spring green and other delicious toppings, you will never go wrong in town.

Tortilla pizzas with potatoes

Filling

Potatoes

Spinach

Pesto (Basilica Pesto)

Sliced mozzarella

Tomato sauce

Bathing machine

Garlic, salt and pepper and possibly. basil

Note! This tomato sauce is used in all pizza recipes.

Procedure

Wash or peel the potatoes and cut them into slices and boil them for a couple of minutes (come with a more accurate number). Put them in a colander or a sieve while making the tomato sauce.

Empty the canned tomato into a small pot and let it boil with the spices for a couple of minutes. Cut the mozzarella into slices.

Spread a thin layer of tomato sauce onto a tortilla wrap and fill it with spinach, potatoes, mozzarella and finally some pesto.

Put the tortilla pizza into a 200 degree pre-heated oven for 10-15 minutes. Make sure to check it once in a while so it does not get overcooked. The cheese just needs to melt.

After that, just enjoy a delicious and incredibly easy pizza that also works just as great as lunch for the day after.

The traditional tortilla pizza

Filling

Ham

Pepperoni

grated mozzarella

Tomato sauce

Procedure

Empty the canned tomato into a small pot and let it boil with the spices for a couple of minutes.

When the tomato sauce is finished, spread a thin layer onto a tortilla wrap. Add ham, pepperoni and mozzarella and place it in a 200 degree preheated oven for 10-15 minutes.

When the cheese is melted, take out the pizza and there is nothing more to do than enjoy it. It does not get easier.

Mexican tortilla pizza

Filling

Grated mozzarella

Corn

Bell pepper

Optionally, Jalapenos

Spicy meat sauce

Ground beef

Tomato puree

Cayenne pepper

Chili

Paprika

Procedure

Roast the beef with the spices until it's cooked throughout. Then add tomato paste and let it simmer for a few minutes. Cut the peppers into small cubes in the meantime.

When the meat sauce is finished, spread it on a tortilla wrap and sprinkle with cheese, corn, peppers and optionally jalapenos.

Put the tortilla pizza to a 200 degree pre-heated oven for 10-15 minutes, then enjoy another delicious and easy pizza.

TIP! The tortilla pizzas can be made with all kinds of filling. It's really only the imagination that sets limits!



The summer party starts with a large communal grill, where you can grill food. There will be a big pool, slush ice machine and sale of alcohol.




