

Bicycle clean-up

A clean-up among the bicycles and trash will take place at Nybrogård dormitory on October 8th, 2017.

The Dorm's clubs

You may, as a newcomer to the dorm, have recently taken a look at what activities are actually taking place at the dormitory. We can tell you that there are many different clubs and associations at Nybrogård!

One of the larger associations is the Canoe and Kayak club, which will be talked about in this column.

First and foremost, it's free to borrow the canoes and kayaks. However, it requires registration at the inspector, Lars Kaj, during the opening hours of the office (see page 2). You will need to bring a filled form, which can be downloaded from the dormitory website. You are registered electronically via your laundry card, and you are then a member of the association in which more than 20% of the dorm's residents are members.


To borrow the kayaks or canoes you must, after registration, contact the club chairman and get a mandatory introduction to the equipment. The rules can be read on the dormitory website.

To reserve canoes and kayaks, the booking system is accessed through the website. You should then log in with your residents' login information (this login is the same as one used to log in to K-net).

If you want use the sea- or touring kayaks, or learn the technique required, it is highly recommended to take a so-called EPP2 course (also known as IPP2), which the canoe and kayak shop at Nybrovej 370 offers. The course teaches the most important techniques for kayaking. The course usually lasts a weekend with a full program Saturday and Sunday. I took the course in sea kayaking last year in the first weekend of

October, and it was a big success! You get much more experienced with the kayak, as the vessel can be very lively during first experiences

Buy clothes with a clear conscience



Many assume that the **Red Cross** store is aimed only at the elderly, but its target audience is largely all age groups with different styles.

The inventory in the store is very varied; It sells everything from **ball gowns** to **sportswear** for both sexes, **caps, shoes, unused nylon stockings** and brand items such as **Lacoste, Abercrombie & Fitch, Adidas, Polo** and much more.

The **prices** are incredibly **SU-friendly** and can be as low as 35 kr. and up to 200 kr. per clothing item.

If you care about **environmentally friendly** choices, the second-hand principle is a good starting point. In addition, all employees are volunteers and all income goes to charitable causes.

The Red Cross store is located on **Lyngby Hovedgade 46, 2800 Kongens Lyngby**. If you want to donate clothes, this can be done in the dormitory's laundry container, which is located at the entrance to the laundry facilities.



KælderCaféen's Summer party



For the second consecutive year, the Celar Café welcomed Nybro residents and their friends to the annual two-day summer party, Friday and Saturday (August 11th & 12th respectively)



This year we have had an some unfortunate weather. This has meant that most residents have preferred to stay indoors. Nevertheless, all residents participated in beer croquet, volleyball and a round of small talk behind the NO buildings on Friday afternoon and early evening. At about 10pm, the party continue in KælderCaféen under the JK kitchens, where many more residents participated, and the mood changed significantly when grey weather was replaced with colourful lights.



Both Friday and Saturday evening brought a festive atmosphere to every corner of KælderCaféen's premises. Everything from the residents of the college, the neighbours from P.O.P. dormitory and friends from elsewhere enjoyed themselves.

"I have been to a few different theme parties at the dorm, but of all of them, this has been the best. The mood is great, and KælderCaféen is better than so many other dormitory bars! I'm happy to have some good friends at the dorm and I love how you really feel the strong community!" Told Rebecca, (who lives at Grønjord dormitory) before she hurried onto the crowded dance floor for the song Spice Girls' 'Wannabe'.),

Meanwhile, the bartenders' vouchers were used extensively, and the guests stood

ready to order with Mobile Pay and Visa. However, the problems already occurred on Friday, when the Credit card terminal's battery mysteriously 'died' and the guests only had the opportunity to pay via Mobile Pay or cash. Saturday evening, an even bigger disaster occurred when the Mobile Pay app chose to go down, so the only way to buy alcohol was by cash. Fortunately, surprisingly many guests had cash, and in just over an hour sales went in retro mode without any form of digital payment.

After KælderCaféen experienced accident after accident during the summer holidays,



from flooding to burglary, the economy has not been at its best. However, the bar got a push in the right direction as the number of bar guests became comparable to that of the bar's New Year's party. With a lot of customers, revenue was rising while people enjoyed rounds of foosball, a beer pong tournament and a lot of alcohol. On Saturday, the bartenders were persuaded to stay open for an extra hour, and on both Friday and Saturday the guests had to be forced out of the bar and lured with the offer to continue in one of the AB kitchens as they were not ready to stop for the night. However, the party died down a little as people lacked alcohol and did not have the opportunity to bring supplies from the bar.

The bar's turnover is non-profit; KælderCaféen's profits go solely to the bar's volunteer bartenders, maintenance and improvement of furniture and offers to guests of the bar. Therefore, it is for all visitors that the economy

does as well as possible.

Coordination between the bartenders could be a lot better. During the two evenings, several bartenders burned out and replacements had to be made both Friday and Saturday, so a couple of bartenders could get a few minutes breaks after 5-6 hours of hard work.

"It's important to be a strong team when you are a small group of 3 who will have to keep a bar running every Friday - as well as several Saturdays each year. Therefore, we arrange active parties a couple of times a year that will mix us together so that we can better coordinate our shifts and help each other" Says Kasper from PR-even, who manages a large part of the bar's projects.

However, the bar could use some more volunteer bartenders. *"I'm really glad I signed up as a bartender shortly after I moved in"* says Bertil from EF-odd, who after almost a year as active in the bar is under training as a senior bartender. *"You really get an expanded network and some fun experiences!"* Besides the experiences, you get 10 vouchers a shift, used to buy all types of drinks and can be used whenever you want to, even on behalf of your friends. That's the equivalent of approx. 400 kr. Per shift if you choose the expensive drinks. **

In spite of Saturday's hangover and lack of participants, the summer festival was a success both socially and economically. The location of the day down by the lake was the same as last year, but it has been proposed to move the party more centrally to the middle of the JK kitchens and closer to KælderCaféen. Especially after an incident where one of the bartenders found it hard to find the place, it has been discussed whether the place is optimal. In addition, one can only hope for better weather for next year's festival.

The residents' representatives in the Board wants to, as in previous years, to organize and implement a bike clean-up of the dormitory. This is not as such a board assignment (but it is a tradition for the residents' representatives in the board to be assigned). We therefore wish, like last year, a salary made available at 2x15 hours for planning, warning and bicycle clean-up (this includes distribution of strips and warn-

ing letters, poster production and poster hanging, communication with residents and the police and the completion of the clean-up itself).

A) Frederik requests input for the increase of resident involvement.

It is proposed that representation in the residents' council could be a prerequisite for the payment to the kitchen coffers.

D) The Council is informed that there are currently only two key carriers. A third will be sought after the summer vacation.

E) Clara is interested in the position as Secretary and it is agreed that she commences a trial period after the summer vacation.

A) Formalization of the dorm Facebook group v. Rasmus Lau

The group has grown big. The current admins are a mixed bag, ca. Half from the network group.

There has not been a vote of rules for eg. Approving new members, purchase / sale, advertising. Some requests for membership are rejected without further approval. There is also a lot of purchases / sales of things that are not relevant to very many (clothing, art).

We would like to discuss some completely basic, simple rules and vote on them at the meeting. In addition, we propose that the net group in the future be the only admins of the Facebook group to ensure consistency and an opportunity for NYK to keep track of it.

B) Cinema club door replacement v. Lukas Abrahamsen Larsen (J-32)

The door to the Cinema Club has been replaced with the same system as the laundry room chips use. The problem is

that the system can not handle any more doors, which means there are two options: We either buy separate washing chips for the Cinema Club, which will cost 100 kr. a Piece - or to upgrade our current system, which would make it free. The latter will cost 1,935.00 kr. a year but result in us being able to use our current chips. Additionally, a code will be assigned to each chip.

I therefore seek money to upgrade the system so that we can keep current chips instead of investing in separate.

Furthermore, I can not attend the next meeting, and will therefore send the former cinema club chairman in my place.

C) New key bearer v. Rasmus Simling Kristensen (A-38)

Since Henrik relocated from the dorm we have been lacking a third key bearer for when someone locks themselves out. I would like to take up this post going forward.

It should be noted that everyone at the dorm can apply for the job by meeting at the council meeting on 4 September.

D) Purchases for KældersCaféen after water damage and burglary. v. Kasper Hansen (R-66)

KældersCaféen has recently been exposed to accidents.

1. Flood in the basement
2. Burglary.

Therefore we, the board of the bar, have chosen to seek money as this is a larger amount that we can not pay immediately.

1. We want to buy a dehumidifier (file 1) it is not big enough to take the whole bar, but it will be able to cope with the space where we often fight the water.

The price is 2200 kr. for the one we have

appointed.

2. Regarding the burglary. Here we have had our safe deposit box stolen, with an internal value of around 10,000 DKK incl. iPad (for Mobile Pay) multiple valued papers from our suppliers, agreements and other types of important papers. In addition, sales for the last weeks were also stolen at the same time. Also our key bundle used inside the bar during openings was also stolen. This meant that we had to replace all the locks and keys throughout the bar and the warehouse.

Therefore, we would like to request money for replacement of locks and new keys, value: 6000, -New mesh value: unknown waiting for offer (max expected 1000 kr.). New safe deposit box (see file 2) value 1999, -

New resident? In need of tips?

When you need to move, whether it's the first time, the third or the 5th time, there are many things to keep track of. The economy has to be in order, the food usually has to be cooked, the rent must be paid and you also need to study. As we have all heard a lot of times, being a student is great but also tough a lot of the time.

Economics is probably the most important to keep track of when you study, but probably also one of the most important to keep track of throughout your life. When staying at a cheap dormitory like Nybrogård, it is possible to make it work from nothing but stipends/grants. However, sometimes you have to be very careful not to have all the small purchases you make pile up. Otherwise you may end up having spend all of the money you had available before the month is over.

This is we could then make a budget. Before you get scared away from the idea of having plan of your finances and running screaming away, let me explain. You do not have to spend hours compiling a strict or super detailed plan in excel (however, nobody will stop you if that is something you want- kudos to you), but I just mean that it's a good Idea to have some kind of idea of where your money is going when they disappear from your account.

Some tips on how to realize such budget goals without having to bother with calculations are, for example:
to allocate a fixed amount for what you need to buy from the supermarket.
To check in on your account status even though you may not need to do anything else than just check how much money it was that you had to spend for the rest of the month.



If you, like myself, have a student job (study relevant or not), it's a little easier to make your economy work, but just because you have more money between your fingers, this does not mean that you can stop thinking about managing your spending. However, it is still highly recommended that you try to apply for student jobs as the extra money adds a lot to the average day, but it can also be used to add to your CV. All job experience is more relevant when it comes to job searching than your grades, however wrong that sounds.

Study control can not really be avoided as resident of this dormitory. It is around August / September that the administration sends the request. If you have just moved in, do not worry about it until you have lived here for about a year because you, in your confirmation of accepting a room at the dormitory, had to provide proof of your study activity. On Nybrogård's Facebook page, the secretariat has put some guidelines on how such a proof of active study should look, in case you had any doubts about some of the details. Nybrogård's Facebook page is a good place to check regularly for information, tips or if someone is selling furniture or clothing for cheap.

Another good thing to know when you live in this dorm is the opening hours for the various facilities we have. The opening hours of the inspector, secretariat and network group are probably some of the more important. Information about it can be found on the dormitory website Nybro.dk.

As mentioned, Nybrogård's Facebook page is a good page to remember, but there are also other good things to remember, such as Facebook.com/BedreStudieliv, offering advice on food purchases, cheap recipes, reminders about all the things to remember when moving notifying Borger.dk, how to save up for vacations when on relying on grants, cool events for young people in Copenhagen and lots of other good tips and tricks.

However, this rigmarole of an article must not be interpreted as a raised index finger, but more as a way to make people think about the choices they take in relation to their economy. Well then, i'll stop being an annoying parent with that tone of superiority which we all know. My monthly quota for it is completely used up, so i hope you have a good September, studies and parties!

Know your city: Frederiksdal



This is the first chapter of a new series about famous places in the Lyngby area, so that both new residents as well as the most experienced resident can learn about the city, 2800 Kongens Lyngby, which we can call home. The first chapter is about Frederiksdal, which is located very close to the dorm.

Get to Nybrovej and go to the right for 2.5 km. Here you arrive at a nice old wooden bridge across Mølleåen, where there are two old houses on either side of the bridge. You have arrived at Frederiksdal. But who is this Frederik, from whom the area must be named and what can you experience there?

To start the story about the name "Frederiksdal", it's really a good idea to start with the name "Kongens Lyngby" as you would normally speak of it as Lyngby, so who is this king?

The name Kongens Lyngby refers to the fact that the land of Lyngby belonged to the Danish king until the Reformation and Lyngby therefor belonged to the Danish king. A lot of kings have therefore resided in the Lyngby area. For example, Sorgenfri Palace on Kongevejen, north of Lyngby Centrum, was a summer residence for Christian X.

At some point in the 17th century another Danish king was in Lyngby. It was Frederik III, and one of the places that he especially enjoyed was the valley he was named after, Frederiksdal. Thus, it is a Danish king who has laid name to the place.

Frederik III bought the land in 1668 and had plans for a big entertainment establishment on the spot. But he died two years later in 1670, and his son, Christian the V, gave up the plans. Instead, he surrendered the land to his consort to provide for the operation of Frederiksdal mill, the farm, and the forestry industry. Originally Frederiksdal mill was a copper mill, which was later converted to a paper mill. Therefore, Mølleåen and the hydroelectric power from this was once very important for the local industry in the Lyngby area.

Later in the 1700s the paper mill was abandoned, and subsequently the mill was used as a grain mill. In the middle of the 19th century a paper mill was again installed, which was closed down again, and at the

end of the 1800's the grain mill was also closed.

Today, only the present lock, Frederiksdal lock, is found under the old wooden bridge.

Today, however, there are no kings in the area, so Frederiksdal offers many experiences for Lyngby citizens. The actual sluice does not have great function today. However, it is possible to transport the canoes and kayaks from the lower part of Mølleåen on the east side of the wooden bridge to the upper part of the river on its western side. Therefore, you need not take the boats on land, but use the ramp beneath the wooden bridge where the boats can be towed.

It's about 2.5 km from the dormitory to Frederiksdal, which can be done in 10 min on a bicycle along Nybrovej or half an hour on the forest trail along Mølleåen. Also bus 191 towards Sorgenfri St. stops at Frederiksdal.

Frederiksdal Canoe rental

Just east of the wooden bridge you will find Frederiksdal Canoe rental. However, through Nybrogård's Canoe club we have the opportunity to borrow our own canoes and kayaks (Provided you are a member).

Frederiksdal Fribad

Although Nybrogård is not located close to sea, there are excellent opportunities for beach and bathing in the immediate vicinity, namely Frederiksdal Fribad. If you start at the dormitory you have to cycle over the wooden bridge and continue 200m up Frederiksdalvej, and then take the road on your left which leads down to the shore of Furesøen. Here is a small sandy beach and a bathing bridge that invites you for a beach trip in the summer. However, you should be

aware that the water in Furesøen can be stationary for a long time, which can make the water unclean. It is therefore a good idea to only bathe in the water if it has been a little windy and the water, therefore, been in motion.

At Frederiksdal Fribad you will also find a restaurant where you can get "Churrasco", which is a Brazilian barbecue buffet.

All in all, it is a nice place where you can pass many pleasant hours during the summer (that is, when the Danish summer weather allows it ..).

The Old Garden

Before crossing the wooden bridge, if you coming from the dorm, you can walk up to the Old Garden, which is a cosy place with tables and benches that give way to enjoy a picnic or the like. There is also a kiosk on site where drinks can be purchased, if it is open.

Food wagon mystery

Smoked and Greens? What does that mean? Is there someone who dries his own marijuana and drives around and sells it from his wagon? Am I the only one whose thoughts are going in that direction when I hear those words?

At the A / B car park you would be able to see a green carriage stand. Smoked and Greens is written on its side. From what you hear, a lot of different things have been parked at the car parks throughout the times; A trailer for a glider, a small, worn horse trailer for several years in which someone stored his mountain bike and motorcycle, and now a small white car without number plates that could be from the 50s, and this green carriage.

The carriage has been there for a while and I'm not the only one who has had their curiosity spiked. So who owns this interesting wagon? Niels Bols is the owner of this caravan. He drives around various places and sells, not cannabis, but delicious and healthy food. Smoked and Greens literally refers to the food it sells; Smoked meat and fish, sandwiches, salads, bread, dips, soups and dressings. It is rooted in the Nordic-inspired kitchen with its own distinctive touch. A sort of new interpretation of the traditional Nordic and street food.

Niels Bols and one of his friends who are carpenters built this car. He tells that while his friend worked full time and he himself was writing his thesis, they built the wagon. They built it in their parents'



driveway and it took 4 months from when they started in January, while it was very cold. You don't do that unless you are really passionate about such a project, know how to realize it and, of course, want to save some money.

But how in hell do you come up with the idea of wanting to construct a caravan? Obviously, Niels Bols got it from his study, which, however, has nothing to do with food, but the business aspect of it. He has always been interested in food and has a desire to open his own restaurant one day. An as good a way to start as any is to make one that can drive. It does make it stand out against the rest.

Smoked and Greens is a small test of a dream of opening a restaurant called Ødegaard and therefore this little green food truck is a reflection of what kind of

food one would be able to find there. A place with a relaxed atmosphere and enjoyment of food; As they themselves say, it a kind of cosy hunting lodge.

Summer is food wagon season, and is what he gets his inspiration from. Not that it stops him from driving around during the winter, as he plans to drive to markets like Teglværket or Papirøen and try out exciting soups.

"I have almost only had positive customers. It has been a great experience." Niels Bols says to my questions about what experiences he has had with people who have bought his food.

They come up with the recipes themselves and you can see more delicious pictures on their Facebook page: **smokedandgreens**, and find out where to find the wagon. Otherwise, Smoked and Greens can usually be found at Kgs. Nytorv, Nyhavn or fælledparken. Sometimes it can also be spotted elsewhere, but if you want to be absolutely sure you find it is recommended to check the location updates on their Facebook page.

NybroTidende Food Column:

Smoked and Green



These are recipes inspired by the Smoked and Greens food wagon and are light dishes that are inexpensive.

They can suit every taste; Barbecue to commemorate the summer's wild barbecue party, and some easy wraps for a snack or light lunch and a great dish if you have pasta and / or tomato soup leftovers.



Barbecue sandwich

Ingredients:

- Chicken breast, sliced
- Barbecue sauce (bought or homemade)
- 1 dL Water
- Bread, sliced
- Iceberg salad

Procedure:

Combine barbecue sauce, water and chilli In a small saucepan or pan with a tall edge at medium heat. Add the chicken and reduce the heat until it is simmering and stir for approx. 5 min. such that it is heated throughout.

Heat bread In a toaster (alternately a pan) until it is lightly toasted. Remove the chicken from the heat and place the bread on a working surface; Put salad, chicken, and, if possibly Cucumber and top with bread. Toothpicks can be used to secure the sandwich.

Vegetarian Naan wraps

Ingredients:

- Naan bread, not too thick (type does not matter. garlic, butter etc.)
- Tomatoes, sliced
- Red onions, sliced
- Avocado , sliced (Optional)
- Own selection of salad
- Chopped Chickpeas (canned or own)
- Curry (or Garam Masala)
- Oil for frying
- Salt and pepper
- garlic Dressing

Procedure:

Heat oil on a pan on medium heat. Add chickpeas, curry powder (or garam masala), salt and pepper. Shake on the pan at low heat for approx. 5-7 minutes. Then set aside and allow to cool for a few minutes. Heat the naan bread (on toaster or oven) and add the filling; Salad, tomato, (avocado), red onion, roasted chickpeas and dressing. Roll the naan bread carefully and use the aluminium foil or napkin as a support.

TIP! Instead of naan bread, you can use pita bread.



Fried pasta with beef and tomato soup leftovers:

Ingredients:

- 50 g minced beef
- Remains of tomato soup (or other tomato sauce)
- Pasta leftovers (which are cooked and in surplus from another dish, if it is spaghetti then cut them into smaller portions)
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove of garlic
- chili
- 50 g Butter
- Basil (fresh or dried)
- Thyme (fresh or dried)
- 1/2 teaspoon. Coarse salt


Procedure:

Fry the pasta in plenty of butter and 1/2 tsp. of rough salt until it gets crisp. Then add the minced beef, onion, chilli, basil and thyme, which are cooked together until the meat is cooked. Finally, the rest of the tomato juice (or other tomato sauce) is added. let it simmer for a little while.

It can easily be served on the pan on which it is made, and with the spoon used to stir (Beware, most pans' coating is easily damaged). Could be served with spoonful of Cheasy Fraiche.
