KælderCaféen's general assembly

Sunday, October 28th, KælderCaféen held their general assembly – an event which brought changes to the structure of our Friday bar.

KælderCaféen's highest authority, the management board has been reorganized to hold 6 members instead of 5 – meaning that their establishment now contains:

Amanda Elfort is appointed chairman after Nikolaj Folander Smit. Nina Sigvardsen is chosen as a new member of the board and appointed to the role of deputy chairman. Samuel Elliot continues as treasurer while newly elected Chelina Kristensen is appointed as secretary. Jacob Riis continues as a member of the board as “free member”, while Jonas Hansen also continues as representative from the residents' council. Last but not least, Maria Willemoes continues as alternate.

Besides appointing the new members of the board, much of the evening's focus was directed at the organization's statutes and how these could contribute to the structure of the organization. As a new goal, KælderCaféen wishes to smooth out the organizational structure, making it more

flat. Amongst other things, this means that the position of “manager” has been abolished, and responsibilities will instead be delegated to a number of volunteers. This makes it possible for everyone to help out, if they wish to do so. The main idea behind this is to ensure that the organization's collective experience remain intact when single members leave KælderCaféen and Nybrogård Kollegiet.

This means that everyone at the dormitory now can help out in KælderCaféen – without the need of being a bartender or a member of the board. Just tap one of the bartenders on the shoulder or write to the board to get your foot inside the door.

Besides that, KælderCaféen is short on bartenders, as is evident from the ad below. So support our dormitory bar that delivers a great work effort week after week and has finally created a positive and stable bar here at the dormitory.



Summary of Residents' Council Meeting

Monday, October 8th, 2012 at 19:00 in the GH-basement

Re 1) Thomas C21 is chosen as moderator and Danish is chosen as language for the meeting.

Re 2) 11 voting members are present.

Re 3) Minutes of the last residents' council meeting approved

Re 4) Agenda approved

Re 5) Economy

NYK's account holds DKK 119,000 and the network account holds DKK 481,000.

DKK 20,000 has been paid to the Festival Group as deficit insurance, DKK 2600 to the Bicycle Workshop, DKK 22,500 to the Fitness Room. A bill for DKK 2,700 transferred from the previous KælderCaféen has been paid – as well as around DKK 8,000 in salaries.

The Network Group is paying off a loan of DKK 200,000 this week. The loan was taken to cover network installations.

Re 6) Announcements

NybroTidende has not been published on paper this month because of a shortage of paper, so it is only available through the web page. The last kitchen renovations are being hurriedly finished, and no more kitchens will be renovated this year.

After the fall break, the bicycle racks in CDLS will be expanded. All bicycles in the racks must be unlocked by Monday, October 22nd, 2012 – otherwise the lock will be removed with bolt cutters.

Re 7) Board meeting

A board meeting was held Tuesday, September 11th.

The decision has been made to refuse a trainee with the blue men.

KBH-kollegierne has been discussed in the board, and it will be discussed in KAB.

Next board meeting is Wednesday, December 5th, 2012.

Re 8A) Proposal for the clubs to become more financially independent
 A proposal to make the clubs more financially independent has been made. A membership fee of e.g. DKK 150 per year could be collected with the intention of using a greater portion of the dormitory's financial resources on construction expenses in the future.

The proposal is dropped since no members of PR-odd are present. Which construction costs are we talking about? That is exactly the purpose of NYK's account; to prevent membership fees in the clubs, making it possible to sustain club activity – even with few members. The NYK membership fee is DKK 30, and if necessary this amount could be raised slightly.

Re 8B) Application for funding for counseling on solar panels on the roofs of Nybrogård Kollegiet.

The Solar Energy Group is applying for DKK 30,000 for counseling on the solar energy project in order to produce preliminary calculations on estimates on three possible projects:

1. Full solar panel system
2. Solar panel system with possibility for later installation of solar heating
3. Solar panel plus solar heating systems

At this time, we have received a quote from Plan-Energi, who require DKK 10,000 for producing a report on the possibilities of installing a solar heating system at the dormitory. We will ask for a similar report on the possibilities of a solar panel system from a different company that specializes in solar panels. We do not yet know the cost for such a report, which brings the price over DKK 10,000, making it necessary to apply for DKK 30,000.

The DKK 30,000 should be raised from the DKK 40,000 that the residents' council reigns over each year from the operational budget, so the board is not required to decide whether they will put the money

aside. Such a decision would be too time-consuming for such a small amount, and the residents' council does reign over a large amount from the operational budgets from previous years, and all the money will not necessarily be used.

It seems possible to produce savings during the first year.

A vote is held to decide whether Claus and Mikkel will be granted the DKK 30,000, so they can continue working on the project.

Re 8C) The Garden Group is applying for disposable funds of DKK 2,000 for unspecified expenses. The funds will be used for items such as shears, string and other necessary items. The reason for applying for unspecified expenses is that the Garden Group often needs to buy small items, and it would be impractical to apply for e.g. DKK 50 each month.

Re 8E) Network for knowledge sharing between dormitories.

A dormitory network for knowledge and experience sharing (e.g. how to engage volunteers), a united political face, as well as better deals on purchases is being established. A workgroup has been formed with representatives from OMK, RHK and Nybrogård, among others,

which is establishing the network and determining the scope. KAB has been appointed as secretariat with no voting rights, and will be responsible for meetings and economy. The founding general assembly on November 8th will soon be called, where, among others, Copenhagen's Technical Environmental Mayor, Ayfar Baykal will give a presentation. The general assembly is open for everyone – especially the dormitory residents are welcome – the distribution of voters will for example be determined here. If anyone is interested in participating, Chairman Jonas D59 can be contacted at the following e-mail address: jonas.eh@gmail.com. Jonas will be going himself, so it will be possible to travel together from Nybrogård to the meeting.

Re 8F) Green Dormitory

Green Dormitory is applying for an amount of up to DKK 2,000 (the whole amount will not necessarily be spent) for purchases of coffee, cocoa and pizza in connection with the Green Dormitory event on October 14th. The mentioned amount will be dependent on the number of participants, which can not be predicted precisely.

Re 8G) Financial report from Nybrofestival

Total expenses of DKK 54,354.15 and expenses of DKK 41,435.50 have been recorded, which means a difference of DKK -8,461.94 will be covered by the deficit insurance. The deficit is smaller than last year, but there did emerge problems with the food back then. The financial report must be sent out with the notice, and not just handed out within the residents' council. The report is sent out with the minutes, and any comments to this can be directed to the Festival Group through Jennifer A16 at the following e-mail address: sirke_line@hotmail.com.

Re 8H) Use of KælderCaféen during Cake Festival

The Cake Committee would like to use KælderCaféen's facilities for the Cake Festival, Saturday November

10th, 2012 from 12:00 – 19:00, since it can be problematic to use the hallways where the residents complain about the noise. Only bartenders will be allowed behind the bar, but no alcohol will be served. It should not affect KælderCaféen's regular opening.

The football team will organize an end-of-season party – possibly in KælderCaféen. It has previously been held in the kitchens, but this can disturb the residents of the hallway, and there will be over 30 guests since there is now both a men's and a women's team. The party could possibly be considered as an extra opening in KælderCaféen. This will be discussed at the next residents' council meeting. A Christmas lunch will be held for active members of KælderCaféen in January. It will be a night where only bartenders are invited, but other residents may be allowed to join later (in which case two bartenders will need to be on duty). An extraordinary opening will be applied for in January to organize this event. This will be discussed at the next residents' council meeting.

It's almost time for J-day and as such, we have been tasting the currently available beers— and evaluated them on a scale from 1 to 5.



Karlens Julebryg:

Rating:



Cost: 3,95 kr.
Alcohol: 5,6%

This is a very dark beer and the large amount of beer froth certainly gives you a solid impression of a Christmas beer. It also smells of the seasonings that makes you

think of Christmas to the point where the fragrance almost creates an entire Christmas atmosphere on its own. The beer tastes just like these seasonings, but the aftertaste is flat and plastic-like, which affects the score negatively. But other than that, it is an amazing Christmas beer that easily goes with your dinner.



BB Økologisk Julebryg



Rating:

Cost: 19,95 kr. in Netto
Alcohol: 5,6%

This beer has an impressive dark colour that almost makes it seem that it shimmers every now and then.

The cream-coloured froth isn't losing its appeal to the colour of the beer either, and since the bottle holds plenty of beer, it makes you look forward to drinking it when poured. The flavour doesn't quite match with the aesthetics, however, and even though it has a nice taste of caramel that slowly morphs into grain, it only yields little depth. The taste gives you the idea that it's a specialty beer, making it unsuitable for drinking in

You'll notice right away that it has a very bright colour compared to other Christmas beers. It doesn't yield any froth either, making it look completely like a regular lager

beer. The flavour does, however, match the appearance of the beer, seeing that it starts out with a rather soft taste that you'd recognize from lager beers, but it does have a bitter aftertaste that only lasts a minute. All in all it gives you the impression of a regular lager beer that merely was drawn into a new can.



Harboe Jule Bryg:

Cost: 5,30 kr. in Rema1000
Alcohol: 5,7%

At first, it looks like a dark beer that'll suit meat dishes and the like perfectly. It does indeed have the sufficient amount of froth in that regard. This beer has,

however, a very mild taste and barely tastes of alcohol either. So even though it goes nicely with your Christmas dinner, it will quickly be drowned by the taste of the food itself. The gentle flavour also makes it a very suitable choice for getting drunk, due to the fact that you can drink large amounts of this beer without being overwhelmed by it.



Ceres Jule-Hvidtøl

Cost: 3,33 kr. in Fakta
Alcohol: 1,9%

This low-alcohol beer has a nice dark colour, and the froth lasts for a very long time. You'd almost think that this is a genuine beer, which only lasts until you taste it, sadly. As soon as the

beer hits your taste buds, you will notice that it is exceptionally sweet, not knowing whether you're drinking low-alcohol beer or liquid candy cane. It will then morph into a very sweet taste of caramel which'll last for quite a while too. All of this makes it difficult for us to rate this beer, due to the fact that we're seriously doubting that anyone but children could drink this. If it, for some reason, were served to children, you'd also have to make sure that they wouldn't become too high on the large amounts of sugar that — considering its taste — reside within this beer.

Halloween – Saints, Paganism, Monsters and the Macabre

Halloween is a very special time for me, both as a theologian and as a person. I just do not know how to feel about it. It contains so many different elements that it appears, in a way, pluralistic in its complexity. While versatile, it also seems so schizophrenic a venture that Halloween almost appears to lose its identity.

No ill talk of Halloween will be heard from here, though. Most holidays in Denmark, if not all of them, have roots in many diverse traditions, which together represent one whole.

Though I have never participated in Halloween, I did find sufficient amusement in dressing up for Fastelavn as all sorts of super heroes and thrash barrels with a baseball bat. Maybe it is because of Fastelavn that Halloween has taken so many years to become rooted here, while celebrating Halloween is a science in itself, particularly in the USA.

The holiday probably originates partly from the pagan Irish-Celtic festival Samhain, where occult forces are revealed in our world. Common for Fastelavn, which is the Danish version of the Catholic festival Carnivale, and Halloween is that both have roots in pagan customs and Roman-Catholic doctrines.

If we disregard the pagan customs that formed the holiday, Halloween emanates from a Catholic holiday, which in English is called All Saints' Day, where Halloween itself is celebrated the day before All Saints' Day.

All Saints' Day and -Night is briefly put a holiday where one celebrates and prays for the many Catholic saints. The reason behind praying for the saints is to shorten one's waiting time in Purgatory, before reaching Paradise.

This practice reaches not only the living, but the dead as well. The living can also affect dead relatives' time in Purgatory through the saints



– as is also found in the notorious practice of indulgence, though it has been long-abandoned.

Halloween as we know it today, no longer contains very many of these elements – besides maybe the name itself, which comes from “(All) Hallow's Evening”, called Allehelgen-saften in Danish.

However, the holiday is of a completely different nature today, where it centers on costumes and pumpkin decorations for the pleasure of it all.

But it does have a connection to the old All Saints' Day/Night and the pagan customs, since the holiday also contains a spiritual level, which is shown in the costumes, where it is possible to become completely unrecognizable to the dead and thereby become protected from them. This is also seen in the hollowed out pumpkins, since their purpose is to guard the house from invasive spirits.

Ironically, costumes resembling the very powers from which protection was needed were worn – it is logical though, that if you dress like the enemy, you are unlikely to be noticed!

Most people are unlikely to take these things consideration when picking an appropriate costume for a Halloween party, where creativity is often considered the driving factor. But no holiday stands still like a static unit, not moving a millimeter throughout time – on the contrary.

Actually, you could say that a holiday is very much alive, since it is being celebrated by people, being just as much alive. This also means that the holiday must adjust to those who celebrate it and not the other way around.

It is still a shame that the holiday's past has been forgotten by most, since it has moulded what we celebrate today – and by knowing its past and understanding the holiday better, one may enjoy it more. This is also true of the other Danish holidays.

Instant Cake Recipe of Awesomeness!


Go to a supermarket. They usually

To make things even better, you may pour additional things into it such as raisins or nuts. Lastly, you may use the frosting to decorate the cake, but if you have a little extra cash, you can also use granules, fruit gums and the like.

Green Dormitory well executed

Enjoy the food!

I am still sitting with the memory of a good cake fresh in my mind. A few Fridays ago, I decided to bake a really good cake. It could possibly – in this column – be assumed that cake baking is something that happens quite frequently in my case, but that is not exactly the case. Contrarily, I have decided not to forbid myself cakes and other sweets, since I on special occasions happily enjoy a piece of cake with a clean conscience. This decision brought an idea with it; to bake a really good cake. The cake did turn out to be really good, and you will not be robbed of the opportunity to bake it yourself!

Marzipan muffins with apples and cardamum

10 pieces.

125 g. butter

1,5 dl. milk

1 egg

125 g. sugar

225 g. flour

a pinch of salt

1,5 tsp. baking powder

100 g. marzipan (fridge chilled)

0,5 tsp. ground cardemum

1,5 tsp. shredded lemon rind

2 apples

melt the butter in a pot and let it cool. Whip milk, egg and sugar together in a bowl. Mix flour, some salt and baking powder in another bowl and whisk it together with the egg-mix until the dough is smooth. Add the melted butter. Shred the chilled marzipan into the dough a little at a time and then add cardemum and lemon rind. Cut the apples in fourths, remove the cores and cut the fruits in smaller pieces. Pour the dough into muffin tins and press the apple pieces into the dough. Sprinkle some cardemum over the cakes and bake for 15 min. at 200 degrees Celcius.

Before serving, the cakes are sprinkled with powdered sugar and should be enjoyed with the kitchen-mates – with Disney cartoons on the television.

You can find fantastic apples outside at the moment, so get those boots on and get out there!

James Bond – A shaken 50-year-old decrepit fossil or completely unstirred by the ages?

Actually, the title is misleading in two ways – in the latest film, James Bond has moved away from the iconic Martini and settled on the more down to earth beer. (And fossils are generally somewhat more than 50 years old.) We are not just looking at the latest addition to the James Bond films, but rather the lifetime of the series and its developing history for good or (maybe also) bad. Regardless of personal opinion of the films about the philandering MI6 agent, it must be recognized that the films still attract people to the movie theaters. The film series about James Bond has undeniably affected the film world during the 50 years it has existed, since enormous publicity was evoked already after the first film, *Dr. No*, starring Sean Connery as James Bond. The critics were divided, in part because they were uncertain whether the film was mocking secret agent films or if it was to be taken seriously. And it was possibly this uncertainty of genre that made not only this film, but the whole series so interesting. The film is not self-ironic

enough to be called satire, but it is also not serious enough to be called realistic. One does not necessarily exclude the other, since a film can be both serious and self-ironic at once. In the films following *Dr. No*, more focus was placed on the humor, but when Roger Moore took over as Bond, the series attained its perhaps most satirical state, and one could in that respect regard Roger Moore's Bond-films as pure satire – and then again. These films also contain dismal and bizarre elements, leaning towards science fiction and fantasy, which are most evident in *Moonraker* and *Live and Let Die*. In these films, the uncertainty of genre is divided between fantasy/science fiction. Contrary to Connery's films, the critics received Moore's films with mixed feelings. When Pierce Brosnan took over as Bond, the series returned to its roots with *Goldeneye*, which again balances between satire and realism – though with more focus on realism compared to Connery's films. The series emerged renewed once more, but everything was as originally intended. However, once Daniel Craig took over the lead, everything was turned upside down. Already

on the first day, when Craig took on the role of the seasoned agent, his blond hair breaks with the otherwise unyielding Bond-traditions; James Bond always has black hair. But Craig's films go one step further, since *Casino Royale*, *Quantum of Solace* and the new *Skyfall* are deeply characterized by a dark realism, much alike the one found in Nolan's *Batman* trilogy. The otherwise irreproachable Bond now resembles more a regular person, who no longer follows every superior's orders blindly, but lets himself be controlled by his own emotions and creates his own agenda – making him a somewhat cryptic character from the view of his employer, who does not necessarily trust him – which is a completely new angle. A lot of these new takes are being applied to the series at the moment, and even though some fans are disappointed to see the many changes, that may in fact be happening too quickly, it is still exciting to find out where it leads.
