Next Residents' Council Meeting

Tuesday the 5th of February 2013 at 7 PM in the GH-Basement.



FC Nybro is now an association completely independent from Nybrogård Kollegiet. This basically means that it'll be much easier to rent soccer fields and the like; it also means that it'll be possible to rent in-door playing fields for other activities than soccer in the future via the association.

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The chairman of the Cinema Club is leaving the dormitory, which means that the club is looking for a new chairman! Read more in order to find out what it takes.

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More news on the athletics field! Even though the project has been at it for a long time, it certainly doesn't mean that it's dead. Some of you probably aren't up-to-date with this old project, so we have brought an overview to you while examining its current status as well.

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At the previous Residents' Meeting an item for the agenda regarding big parties was rejected — it is currently being worked on again, however, and is as such far from being dead. If anyone has suggestions concerning what should— and shouldn't be allowed at these parties, your suggestions are most welcome.

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New representatives on the board

At a residents' council meeting in December, new members were elected into the board.

First, the three previous members, Camilla L01, Andres D52 and Thomas C22 (alt.) all left the board. Then Alexander G28 and Jakob R52 were elected. Being the only volunteer, Camilla was elected as alternate to the board.

Since then, the newly elected have held their first board meeting, though the previous representatives were still members. As a result of the meeting, Alexander has now been elected as chairman of the board while Jakob will take the position of deputy chairman.

While neither of the two representatives have any considerable experience in this regard, Camilla has served several years on the board already. This will obviously make Camilla's experience worth its weight in gold during the coming year. However, both new representatives are currently active at the dormitory in other ways.

Alexander also has the duty as key person at the dormitory, while Jakob is on the board of the new sports association, editor of NybroTidende and co-responsible for organizing Green Dormitory.

Alexander is elected for a 2 year period while Jakob and Camilla are elected just for the coming year. An effort is currently being made to involve a number of the board members in overseeing the residents' council meetings at the dormitory – or parts of them anyway. The plan is to allow all residents to ask about issues that they have doubts regarding. Contrary to the board members, the council members collectively have many years of experience and have a much deeper level of expertise than can be expected from the board members.

At the moment, the aim is to start this arrangement in March, though things are not set in stone.

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What goes on in the board room?

A lot more is happening in the board room at the moment than just electing new members.

Several initiatives are being worked on – all to ensure a better dormitory for us all, both now and in the future. Several of these initiatives have recently involved how to ensure a better experience of living at a dormitory. This has dealt with both culture, residents per room and study control.

As it looks now, the average resident lives at the dorm for a little less than two years. This does not pose a problem in itself, but a high rate of tenant turnover is known to affect the culture in each hallway, and thereby the individual's experience of living there.

There are also much higher expenses involved than most probably realize with residents moving out and a new moving in. During the past two years, the dormitory has spent nearly DKK 250,000 just on the financial paperwork involved with tenant turnover.

So there are plenty of reasons to attempt extending this average time period, though a concrete solution has not yet been found. A possible answer could be the introduction of tenant criteria requirements, but is that a good idea? This is not so certain. But if so, which requirements? Another issue is the number of residents in the rooms.

So far, there have been no rules dictating how many residents can occupy a room. This has led to situations where far too many people have lived in a single room.

This problem has now been attempted solved by changing the lease agreement.

A third issue is regarding the study control. Apparently the current method contains some faults. The study control is handled internally at the dormitory, while KAB actually ends up doing the checking. Using this method, several people have gotten themselves into trouble. A long list of residents are therefore completely unaware that their study control was not approved as expected.

As a result of this, it is advised that the current method be evaluated, so future problems can be avoided. If you should have any questions or comments regarding these issues or something completely different, write to a board member at bestyrelsen@nybro.dk

Re 1) Jonas D59 is chosen as moderator and Danishis chosen as the language for the meeting.

Re 2) 12 voting members are present.

Re 5) Economy

NYK's account holds DKK 105,000 and the network account holds DKK 147,000.

DKK 29,000 has been granted to the football clubs, and another DKK 600 for the girls' football team for referee fees. DKK 6,000 has been moved from NYK's account to the network account, compensating for the paper that was bought on the network account. DKK 19,000 has been paid from NYK's account in salaries, the amount from NYK's account is salaries for two months, and DKK 33,000 in salaries to the network group has been paid –these salaries are only paid once yearly. The latter payment came from NYK's account but will be replaced from the network account.

Re 6) Announcements

Work on the athletics field continues, but a new offer of DKK 600,000 incl. VAT has been made. Camilla L01 is applying for funds to cover this.

Thomas C22 is withdrawing from the duties as a keyperson as of today, and a new must be found at the next meeting in February. Anyone interested should show up at the meeting. Mikkel J21 is temporarily reinstated since he has been a key person before, and has already been through the security clearance and is familiar with the procedure.

FC Nybro has been established as an organization independently of NYK. The managers have talked with the municipality, and this allows, among other things, for better possibilities for field reservations. There is a field at Vadgård skolen, 3.4km from Nybrogård Kollegiet, where a gym is also available.

Re 7) Board meeting

A board meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 5th, 2012. Among other things, it will be decided how many people are allowed to live in one room, since this is not covered in the contract. The quality of the study confirmation controls will be evaluated, since instances have been observed of residents staying at the dormitory for a long time without actively studying. The financial report will be gone over, and the central telephone system will be discussed.

Re 8A) Digital TV channels at Nybrogård Kollegiet

A system with both analog and digital channels will be more expensive for the dormitory than other systems, but will only be marginally noticeable to the individual resident. It will not solve the problem with channels freezing or blacking out. Proposal 1 is removed, since there are still many that want to keep the analog signal. This will also be discussed at the board meeting, since an offer has been received from YouSee, which will be on the agenda.

A vote is held to decide whether to keep the present system or offer both analog and digital channels:

The present system: 0
Both digital and analog: 10
Abstain: 2

The proposal is approved.

Re 8B) Application for DKK 6,072.75 for new workout benches

Unfortunately, there have been two cases of benches breaking during use in the Exercise Room, making the last bench too dangerous to use. The Exercise Room is applying for DKK 6,072.75 to purchase 3 new professional benches, which would be able to cope with the heavy use by the many residents in the Exercise Room.

The proposal is approved.

Re 8C) Harassment of electric vehicle.

Proposal for a new agreement regarding charging of the electric vehicle in bicycle shed 3 after one or more residents have disconnected the charger in spite of a previous agreement still existing. The agreement dictating no payment for charging the electric vehicle was made since it was too expensive, administratively. The electric vehicle could possibly be moved to Lars Kaj, so it is more isolated. All hallways should be informed that there is an agreement dictating no payment for charging the electric vehicle. The proposal is dropped since there is agreement in the residents' council that it is unnecessary to change the previous agreement since it would be too expensive. An article in NybroTidende could create positive awareness of the agreement.

Re 8D) If applicable, approval of changes to the regulations of conduct.

This item is dropped, since there, in light of the remarks and votes from the residents' meeting, will be further work involved with this.

The chairman, Jonas D59 will send e-mails out to the hallway the complaints were made about, and the Complaints Committee can distribute complaints in mail boxes (as they do now). New guidelines can be specified in accordance with the discussion from the residents' meeting, and this will be considered at the next meeting. Trine C03, Majbritt S05 and Thomas C22 will continue working on this. Exam periods other than DTUs may also be considered, if there are to be periods without parties. As far as possible, no punishments should be used. The individual residents are urged to take action if they are bothered by loud music or noises, before contacting the Complaints Committee.

Summary of Residents' Meeting

Monday December 3rd, 2012 at 19:00 in the GH-basement

50+ participants for the Residents' Meeting.

Re 1) Jonas D59 is chosen as moderator and Danish is chosen as the language for the meeting. The agenda is approved.

Re 2) Presentation of the residents' council's account of the last year

During the last year, Nybrogård Kollegiet has established a girls' football team, which has only grown in members since its creation. DKK 59,000 has been granted to the Canoe Club for new canoes and kayaks, as well as DKK 19,000 for a new jetty. NybroFestival was executed in the summer and extended to stretch over two days this year. It was decided to shut down the central telephone system, but work has not started yet. NybroTidende now has a team of 3 editors. DKK 22,500 was granted for new dumbbells for the Exercise Room and a new method of submitting items for the residents' council meeting agendas through the homepage has been established. Research has been done to install solar panels and solar heating on the roof of the dormitory, but this has been put on hold because of the government's new rules for the net-gauge scheme. This is still being worked on.

Re 3) Presentation of the institution's financial report for the last year

The full financial report can be seen in the e-mail sent out by Lars Kaj. A

total DKK -79,145 is observed. The deficit will not have any impact on the residents, since the dormitory has been operating with a profit for the past years. The dormitory is not allowed to be profitable, and must as far as it is possible break even.

Re 4) Election of new members of the board

The new members will start January 1st, but will be presented to the board's work during December.

Alexander G28 volunteers as the only one for the 2-year period. He is chosen as a new member of the board for a 2-year period. Thomas C22 and Jakob C03 volunteer for the 1-year period. A vote will decide which of the two will become the new member.

Thomas C22: 6
Jakob C03: 14
Abstain: 3

Jakob is chosen as a member for a 1-year period.

Camilla volunteers as the only one for the position of alternate. She is chosen as alternate to the board.

Re 5) Approval of proposal to change Nybrogård Kollegiet's regulations of conduct.

In accordance with the residents' council discussion of Sept. 5th regarding large parties at the dormitory, a proposal to change the regulations of conduct has been made. See the appendix sent out with the notice. The Complaints Committee has submitted this item, since there have been many complaints about parties at the

dormitory. This has been done in cooperation with the residents' council. The complaints are regarding loud noise, and there have especially been many complaints about ST's spring party and AB's tropical party, but also about other parties around the dormitory. The proposal is made to establish guidelines for parties throughout the dormitory, so consideration for everyone can be taken. It should not be seen as a prohibition against parties but as guidelines for the process, and how to help those who are bothered by them. It is mandatory to obtain an alcohol permit if alcohol is to be sold at a party. However, an alcohol permit can be almost impossible to obtain for these parties. There is a general consensus to raise guidelines for the large parties at the dormitory, but this proposal is affecting too many of the small parties and after parties. It also should not be necessary to advise the whole dormitory of a party, since the whole dormitory will not be bothered by it. The aim should be direction rather than prohibition, and informing residents how to throw a good party, while showing consideration for the other residents of the dormitory. Furthermore, residents with birthdays during the months where parties are prohibited are affected, as well as New Year's parties and Christmas parties. However, KælderCaféen is open during these months so parties can still be held there – although there is a restriction of only 1 party per month, making it difficult to throw a party during these months. There are also hallways where no one has exams during e.g. January, who are still forced not to throw any parties.

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

Athletics Field— how one wish became a big and long project

A tough beginning

A good idea can be tough to come up with, even though it only really demands that you are thinking along the right track. Lack of inspiration can be irritating for long periods. But when you have come up with the idea, half the work is already done. The worst is over!


Now all that matters is implementing the idea, which should not be so very difficult – not compared to coming up with it anyway. And yet, that is not always the way it goes, and Nybrogård's athletics field project can rightly be used as an example of this problem – that it is possible for an idea to be more difficult to realize than it was to come up with it.

This relatively old project first saw daylight in the beginning of 2009 when a then current resident, Mathias proposed the idea of an athletics field to the residents' council. Despite good intentions and the preliminary work, problems arose only a few months later, when it was established that the Carlsberg grant would not be convinced to fund the project.

Since then, not much was heard about the athletics field, until in March-April of 2012 where interest was rekindled. The interest still seemed to be great and DKK 100,000 was put up by NYK to fund the project. The project was again assumed by new forces in 2011, but it grinded to a halt again and the project was declared dead the following year because nobody wanted to work on it at the time.

Why an athletics field?

Those who have shown positive interest in the athletics field have argued strongly that it would strengthen the community at Nybrogård, although it has been difficult for the residents to find a location for the field, since some feel that it could be an annoyance during exam periods. And there are already many possibilities for playing sports around the dormitory. The athletics field would though be concentrated on several different team sports, which are very different from the sports that can be played



alone at the dormitory. And if you do not have any interest in football, your options for social activities through sports suddenly become very limited.

A new initiative

Although the project has been dead for a while, Camilla L01 was not deterred when she in May of 2012 considered taking the project on at the beginning of the summer vacation, which ended up being exactly what happened.

Since then, she has been working on establishing an athletics field at Nybrogård, and the economic side of the project currently shows that the athletics field will cost DKK 600,000. This is quite a significant sum of money, but at this moment there has been offered funding of DKK 280,000 – coming from NYK, the antenna and the board. This means that the remaining amount must be found through one or more grants. We, the editors will be following the development closely.

The athletics field – something for you?

A bigger issue with the athletics field – beside the economics – showed it-

self in March 2012 at a residents' council meeting where only 12 of 600 residents showed up to discuss the athletics field. They would have been far from able to represent an adequately nuanced picture of the interest for this extensive project. Of course there is not room for 600 people in the meeting room, but 12 was probably on the low side.

This means that it is also important that as many residents as possible make up their minds about the athletics field, since it will affect all residents. Even if they have no interest in the field itself, it will affect the dormitory's economy and the residents' daily lives. Those who are not interested may be wondering if it will ever amount to anything, since it has been under way for so long. That is a correct critique, but it can also be reversed: since the project has existed since 2009, there must in any case reside forces at the dormitory that are ready to take on the establishment of an athletics field and ready to do what they can to get it built.



Nybrogård Kollegiets Sports Association

The papers are finally in order and the dormitory seems to have become one association richer – the formal approval has yet to come, but the remaining paper work must be regarded as details in the larger scope of things!

January 22nd, 2013, the establishing general assembly was held in KælderCafeen, the primary goal of which it was to approve the statutes, inaugurate a board and determine a membership fee for the coming season.

The association's structure

At the top of the association, a board will take care of all things common to both of the football teams that are currently associated. This primarily consists of keeping both of the teams finances and applying for money at the dormitory. This board will consist of 5 members, appointed as chairman, deputy chairman, treasurer and two ordinary members.

Besides these duties, it will be the board's duty to organize all social events throughout the season. This includes the end-of-season party as well as any other events during the season.

Under this board, two committees have been formed – a mens' football committee and a women's football committee. Both committees currently consist of two people, the teams' managers and a mediator in connection with the football tournament. There is room for more to join in the future.

Appointed posts:

A total of 13 people participated in the establishing general assembly. Of these, most were appointed a post in the new sports association. The posts in the board were appointed as below:

Chairman: Nickolai E40
Deputy chairman: Jakob R52
Treasurer: Sebastian B45
Ordinary members: Camilla L01 and Malene

Alternates: Line B57 and Malea K62

The posts in the committees were appointed as below:

Men's committee: Gabriel C05 and Claes O52.

Women's committee: Jennie L14 and Claes O52.

Besides the already mentioned, Ole L14 was chosen as accountant for the association for the first year. All posts besides chairman are for a 1 year period. That is for 2 years.

Why establish the association?

Both football teams are participating in the dormitory tournament for dormitories in and around Copenhagen (kollegiefodbold.dk). The tournament's direction has urged that the dormitory teams be established as independent associations, since that ensures better conditions when reserving fields, both regarding practice and matches.

For us as a dormitory, this has not been a big problem. The problem has primarily been in dormitories in inner Copenhagen where many more teams are using far fewer fields per citizen. Despite this, it has been deemed beneficial to become associated instead. The benefits are seen when practicing outside of the summer season. The fields that the dormitory has used until now are only open during the easter break and

fall break. This has so far meant that the teams have had extremely little time to prepare during the spring while they must go a month without practice during the fall. This is obviously not an optimal situation. As an association, the possibilities for field reservations on artificial turf will be significantly higher. This is the primary reason for establishing the association. The establishment does require some changes however. Starting with the coming season, both practice and matches will probably be moved to another field located in Gladsaxe municipality. Vadgård school is noted as first priority, but the final decision has not yet been made and is outside the association's hands.

New possibilities for the dorm

There are still other benefits from being associated than just reservations on artificial turf. Inside reservations should also be a possibility, which does not just include football. If you wish to play badminton, do gymnastics or something else, it should be possible to make reservations for these activities as well. However, the process can be long and hard, and if the activity is not a competition sport in a recognized tournament, the possibilities will primarily be limited to smaller gyms.

NybroTidende food column: Enjoy the food!



About me

My name is Nanna D. Thomsen, I study nutrition and health and have resided in the dorm for about a year. Recently I took over the position as chairman of the garden group.

Furthermore I have a passion for food and raw goods from nature. From this passion comes the idea for this column.

Hope you will enjoy this column.

At this moment, I am thinking back on a Christmas hike in the Swedish terrain. For this hike, it was recommended to bring a little surprise for the whole team. I considered for a while what this surprise should contain and arrived at a recurring snack from my repertoire of recipes. I ended up deciding on homemade crisp bread.

Ingredients

- 1 dl. Oats
- 1 dl. Sesame seeds
- 1 dl. Linseed
- 1 dl. Sunflower seeds
- 1 dl. Pumpkin seeds
- 3,5 dl. Wheat flour
- 2,5 tsp. Salt
- 2 dl. Water
- 1 dl. Oil (try out different amounts of oil, to your taste)
- 1 tsp. Baking powder

Instructions

All ingredients are mixed until the dough is smooth and quite sticky.

Split the dough in two. Each portion is rolled between two pieces of baking paper until it is around 0,5cm thick everywhere. Put the rolled dough in a tray and remove the top layer of baking paper. Cut the dough into sizes that you want the bread to be.

Bake the bread at 200 degrees Celsius for 15-20 minutes or until they are golden and crunchy.

Let the breads cool on a grate and keep them in an air-tight container.

A recipe full of possibilities

There are many variations of this crisp bread. Try adding dried fruit and nuts to the dough e.g. chopped apricots, cranberries, raisins or almonds. Also try dried herbs like rosemary and caraway. The bread also goes really well with cheese – preferably one of the drier cheeses with plenty of taste.

The bread is ideal as a snack with fruit, veggies or with a cup of coffee or tea. And there is always the option of bringing it on a hike – that definitely worked out well when I was out.

Life of Pi

An Indian a Bengal tiger, a life boat and an ocean. Just a small part of this fantastic story, but nonetheless a part that relates the kind of wonderful, different story this film has to offer!

Life of Pi debuted in Danish cinemas on October 25th, 2012 but is still running for those who have not yet seen it. The film is based on the novel of the same name, written by Canadian Yann Martel all the way back in 2001. More than a decade has passed since then, a decade where the book was able to maintain a status of one of the most read during the period!

The history centers on the Indian boy Pi Patel and his family. The family owns an Indian zoo, which of course houses a Bengal Tiger.

Pi spends his childhood searching for the meaning of life, making him more than ordinarily open towards just about all religions. He experi-

ences periods as buddhist, jewish and muslim throughout his youth. The family is torn. While the mother supports him in his search for meaning in life, his father is more skeptic. He swears to science, allowing him to see no purpose with Pi's strange way of examining life's mysteries.

During Pi's first meeting with the zoo's new tiger, Richard Parker, he almost loses his hand – or so the warden says. Absorbed and blinded by his belief in something bigger between heaven and earth, Pi feels sure that he can see the soul in Richard Parker's eyes, leading him to believe that he understands the tiger on a deeper level.

But not everything is perfect, and as time goes by, Pi begins to lose faith in the magic of the world that he had loved his whole life. Bewildered, he looks everywhere to find this faith, which only in part shows itself in India. Fortune shines only briefly before the family suddenly pack up and leave for Canada – a journey that will prove

fateful and more challenging than either him nor anybody else had ever anticipated.

This is where the film's fantastic events really start coming together. Trapped, alone on a life boat with only a Bengal tiger, some canned food and a few flares at hand. Not only the story is fantastic, but the visuals as well.

The blinding visual experience makes the film something very special. The scenery is really fantastic. The film is true to reality and amazing the whole way through – and the tiger is also very well done. Only a few of the scenes are shot with the actual tiger, the rest is a graphical wonder, that even films like Avatar have a hard time competing with! Are you in the mood for a strong, adventurous and amazing film, then this is the one to watch!
